WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 31, 1936 shows a decrease of 2,983,364 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 1,376,931 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 244,505,893 bushels compared with the revised figure of 247,489,257 bushels for the previous week and 245,852,824 bushels for the week ending February 1, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 29,280,087 bushels, a net decrease of 574,727 bushels from the previous week when 29,854,814 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 784,756; Buffalo 17,225,000; Erie 1,785,000; Chicago 204,000; New York 2,735,739; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 120,000; Galveston 62,000; Boston 606,592; Philadelphia 710,000 and Baltimore 332,000 bushels. Decreases are shown from the previous week's stock at Duluth of 37,749; Erie 60,000; Chicago 43,000; New York 143,643; Galveston 15,000; Boston 273,335 and Philadelphia 40,000 bushels. Canadian wheat stocks at Norfolk increased 38,000 bushels while those at Buffalo, Albany and Baltimore remained the same as the previous week, viz., 17,225,000; 4,715,000 and 332,000 bushels respectively.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,022,210 bushels distributed as follows: Chicago 786,000; Duluth 1,714,374; Buffalo 13,386,311; Erie 2,202,000; Milwaukee 283,000; New York 1,451,525; Albany 4,139,000 and Philadelphia 60,000 bushels.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, but 1,048,912 bushels are shown at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 24, 1936 amounted to 683,237 bushels, a reduction of 136,044 bushels from the previous week when 819,281 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 509,729 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending January 24, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 16,787 (45,609); Saskatchewan 252,655 (185,232); Alberta 413,795 (278,888) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1, to January 24, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935. Manitoba 15,336,357 (26,877,426); Saskatchewan 98,989,275 (78,488,914); Alberta 69,090,752 (71,680,305) bushels. For the twenty-five weeks ending January 24, 1936 and January 25, 1935, 183,416,384 and 177,046,645 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending January 31, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,046,240 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 579,000 bushels of wheat. The total is 4,625,240 bushels as compared with 3,994,788 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 630,452 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1936, an increase of 2,189,614 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending February 1, 1936 amounted to 7,436,000 bushels as compared with 10,738,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,624,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia showed decreases of 1,452,000 bushels and 1,497,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while Argentine shipments showed a slight increase.

During the first twenty-six weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 245 million bushels as compared with 264 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 101 million bushels as compared with 88 million bushels for the same period in 1934-35 and Argentine shipments were only 43 million bushels as compared with 91 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-six weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35.

As shown by the above shipments of wheat have averaged 9.4 million bushels per week during the first 26 weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 million bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments have averaged 3.9 million bushels per week compared with 3.4 million bushels per week during the same period 1934-35. Argentine shipments have averaged 1.7 million bushels per week as compared with 3.5 in 1934-35.





CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 31, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 31, 1936 show a net decrease of 3,377,647 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 244,505,893, oats 11,701,009 barley 8,844,971, flaxseed 455,205 and rye 4,657,516 bushels, a total of 270,164,594 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 2,983,364, oats 333,106, barley 61,148 and flaxseed 4,294 bushels, while rye increased 4,265 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 245,852,824, oats 15,489,672, barley 12,378,409, flaxseed 414,195 and rye 3,927,686 bushels, a total of 278,062,786 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 673,450 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 678,058, barley 1,035 and flaxseed 2,222 bushels, while oats and rye increased 5,513 and 2,352 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 273,396 bushels. Wheat decreased 285,730 bushels while increases are shown in oats and barley of 9,308 and 3,026 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 891,276 bushels, composed of wheat 805,677, oats 81,337 and barley 4,262 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Grain in store shows a net increase of 163,363 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 203,803 and rye 5,085 bushels while decreases are shown in oats and barley 24,947 and 20,578 bushels respectively.

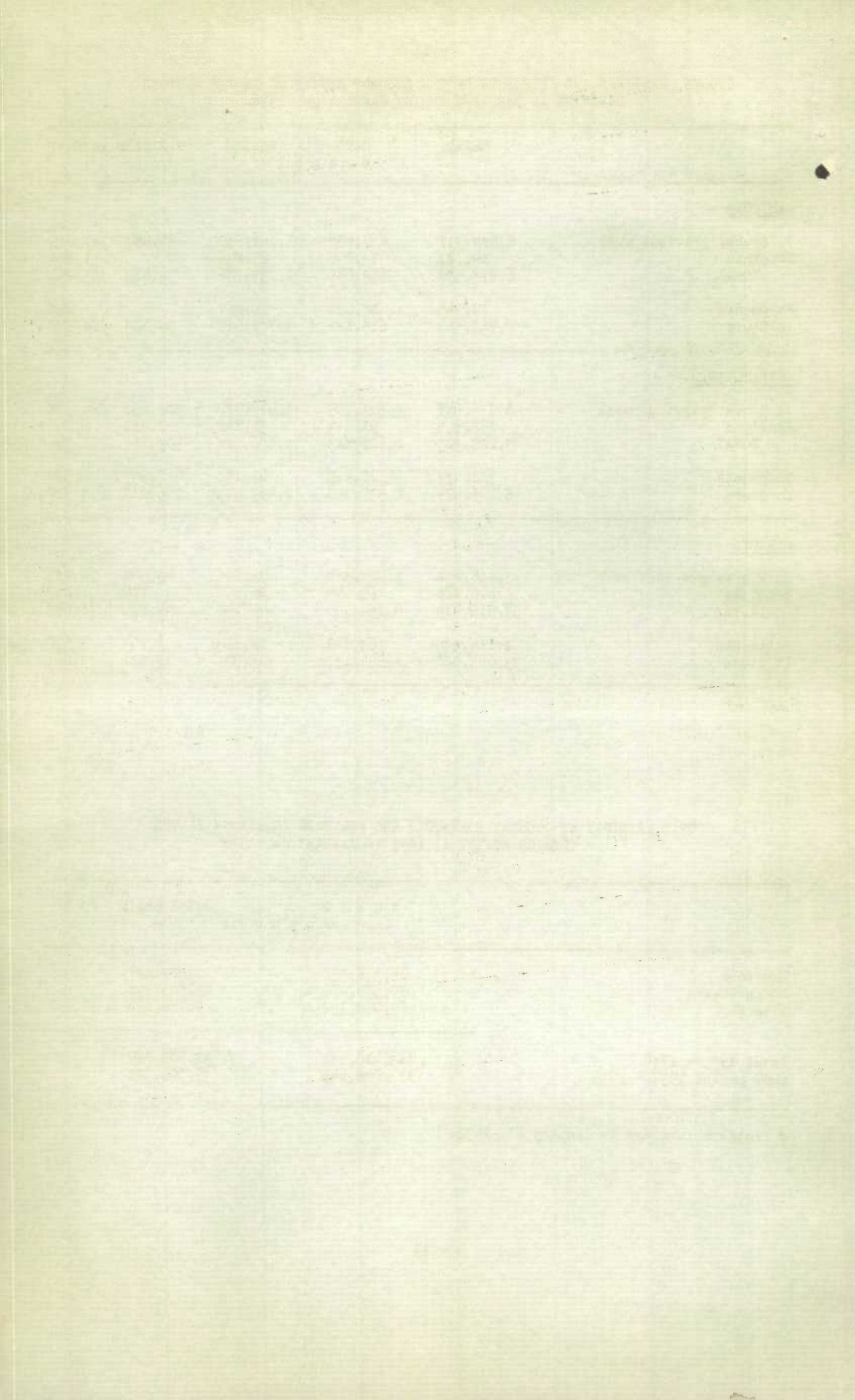
