WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 7, 1936 shows a decrease of 4,911,654 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 4,641,728 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 239,628,498 bushels compared with the revised figure of 244,540,152 bushels for the previous week and 244,270,226 bushels for the week ending February 8, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 27,275,891 bushels, a net decrease of 2,004,196 bushels from the previous week when 29,280,087 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 766,365; Buffalo 15,597,000; Erie 1,511,000; Chicago 204,000; New York 2,542,758; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 120,000; Galveston 52,000; Boston 725,768; Philadelphia 710,000 and Baltimore 332,000 bushels. Decreases are shown from the previous week's stock at Duluth of 18,391; Buffalo 1,628,000; Erie 274,000; New York 192,981 and Galveston 10,000 bushels. The stocks at Boston increased 119,176 bushels over the previous week, Albany, Norfolk, Philadelphia and Baltimore stocks remained the same as those of a week ago, viz., 4,715,000; 120,000; 710,000 and 332,000 bushels respectively.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,020,554 bushels distributed as follows:- Chicago 786,000; Duluth 1,714,374; Buffalo 13,709,713; Erie 2,143,000; Milwaukee 283,000; New York 1,245,467 and Albany 4,139,000 bushels.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, but 1,048,912 bushels are shown at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 31, 1936 amounted to 718,218 bushels, a slight increase of 34,981 bushels over the previous week when 683,237 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,038,186 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending January 31, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 41,600 (59,188); Saskatchewan 238,006 (385,700); Alberta 438,612 (593,298) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to January 31, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 15,377,957 (26,936,614); Saskatchewan 99,227,281 (78,874,614); Alberta 69,529,364 (72,273,603) bushels. For the twenty-six weeks ending January 31, 1936 and February 1, 1935, 184,134,602 and 178,084,831 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending February 7, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,478,635 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 714,000 bushels of wheat. The total is 5,192,635 bushels as compared with 4,625,240 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 567,395 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 2,518,274 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending February 8, 1936 amounted to 12,164,000 bushels as compared with 7,436,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,296,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. World shipments showed a total increase of 4,728,000 bushels as compared with the previous week. North America showed an increase of 1,573,000, Argentina 1,028,000 and Australia 487,000 bushels.

During the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 258 million bushels as compared with 275 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 106 million bushels as compared with 90 million bushels for the same period in 1934-35 and Argentine shipments were only 45 million bushels as compared with 96 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35.

As shown by the above, shipments of wheat have averaged 9.5 million bushels for week during the first 27 weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 million bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments have averaged 3.9 million bushels per week compared with 3.3 million bushels per week during the same period in 1934-35. Argentine shipments have averaged 1.7 million bushels per week as compared with 3.6 bushels last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 7, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 7, 1936 show a net decrease of 5,003,109 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 239,628,498, oats 11,622,939, barley 8,792,773, flaxseed 445,101 and rye 4,671,597 bushels, a total of 265,160,908 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 4,911,654, oats 49,436, barley 45,400 and flaxseed 6,513 bushels, while the rye increased 9,894 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 244,270,226, oats 15,126,724, barley 12,243,903, flaxseed 416,508 and rye 3,924,796 bushels, a total of 275,982,157 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 253,291 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 193,564, oats 23,198, barley 41,645 and flaxseed 1,654 bushels while rye increased 6,770 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 370,785 bushels. Wheat decreased 442,744 bushels while increases are noted in oats and barley of 52,940 and 19,019 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 1,072,106 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,149,254 and rye 1,071 bushels while increases are shown in oats and barley of 77,548 and 671 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Grain in store shows a net increase of 241,490 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 240,472, barley 18,519, flaxseed 896 and rye 8,141 bushels, while oats decreased 26,538 bushels.

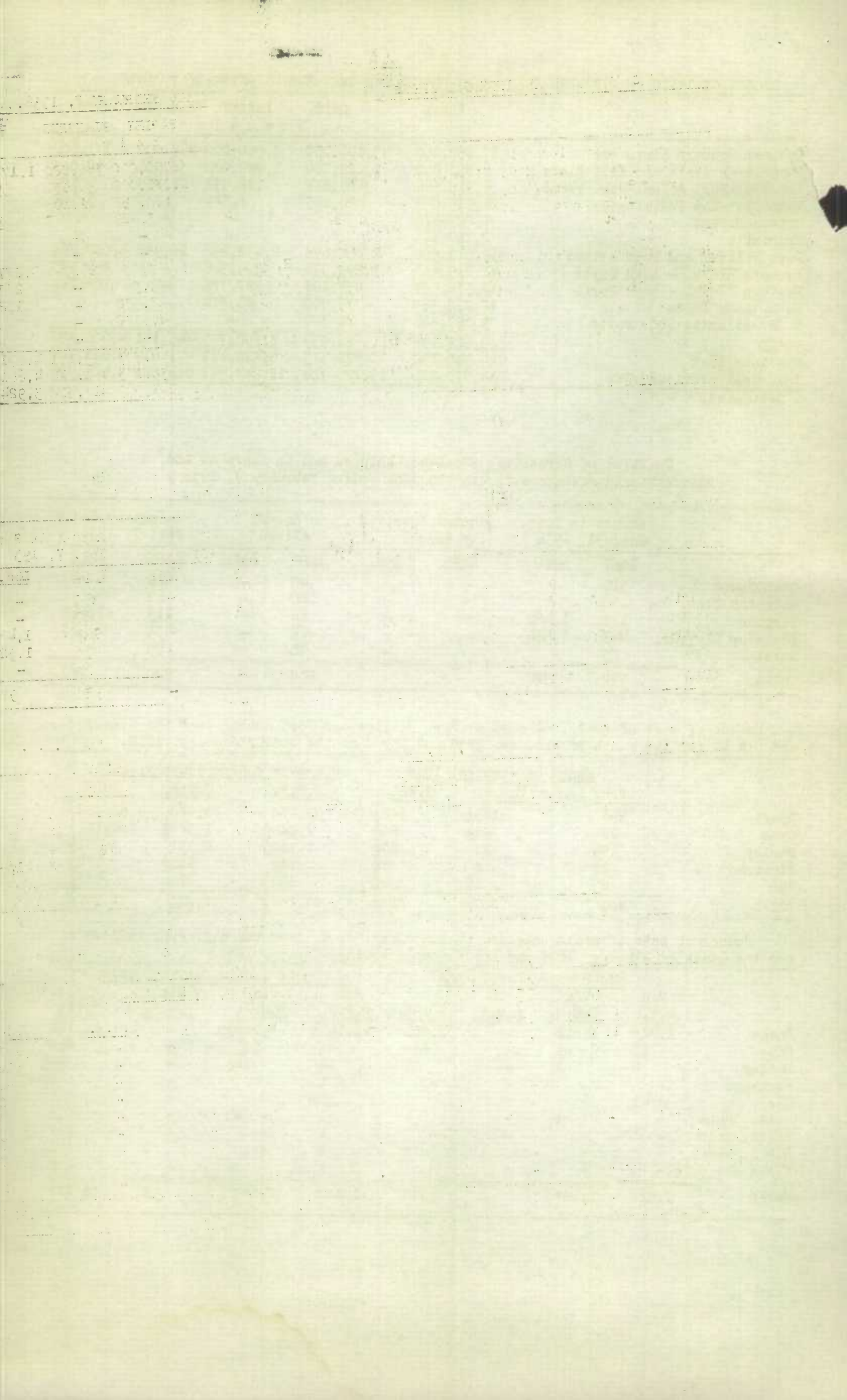

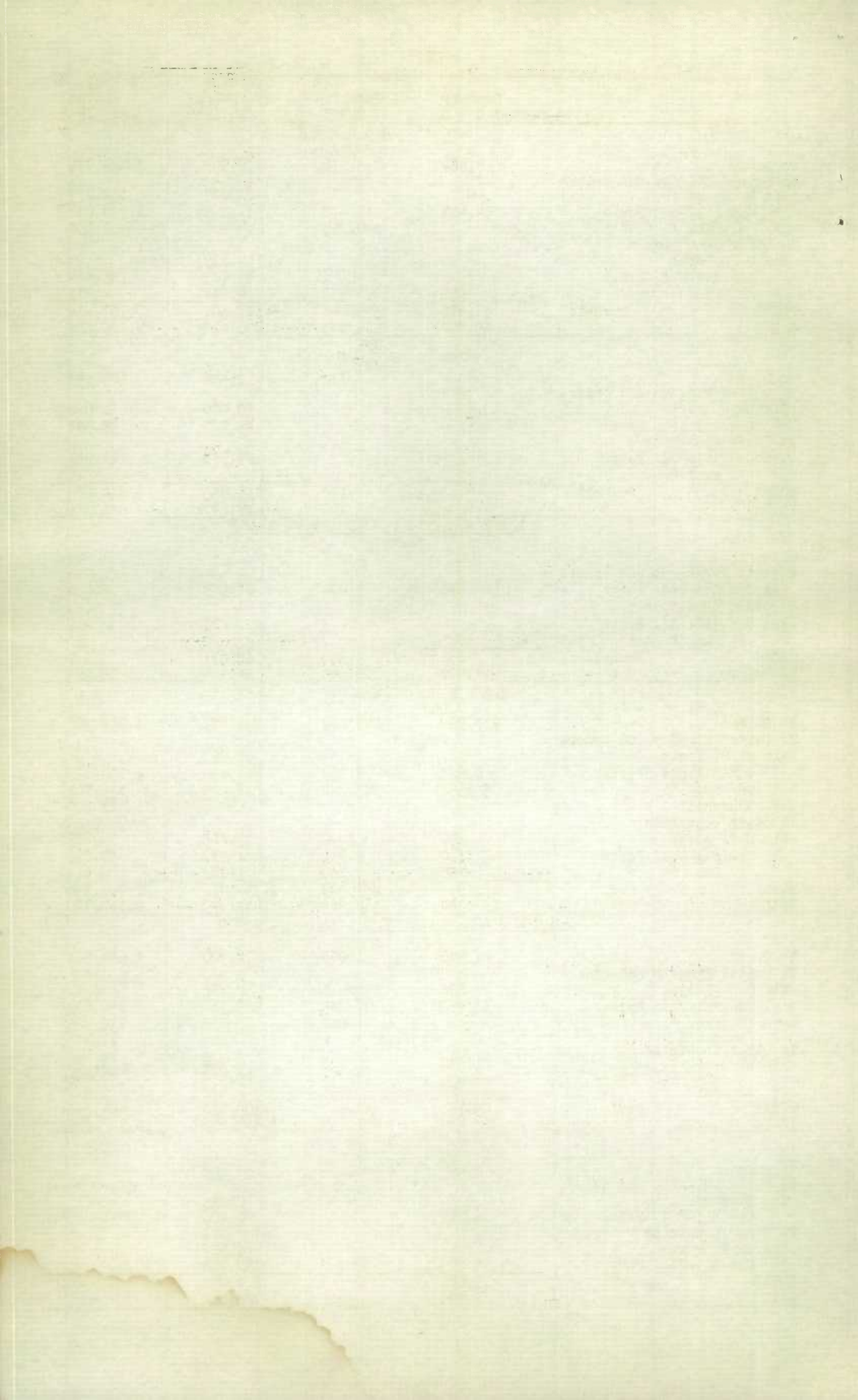
