#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 14, 1936 shows a decrease of 3,997,380 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 9,115,650 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 235,414,105 bushels compared with the revised figure of 239,411,485 bushels for the previous week and 244,529,755 bushels for the week ending February 15, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,673,403 bushels, a net decrease of 1,002,466 bushels from the previous week, when 27,275,891 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 705,432; Buffalo 15,252,000; Erie 1,071,000; Chicago 204,000; New York 2,551,125; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 149,000; Galveston 47,000; Boston 614,843; Philadelphia 671,000; and Baltimore 233,000 bushels. Decreases are shown from the previous week's stocks at Duluth of 60,933; Buffalo 315,000; Erie 440,000; Galveston 5,000; Boston 110,925; Philadelphia 39,000; and Baltimore 99,000 bushels. The stocks at New York and Norfolk increased 35,370 and 29,000 bushels respectively. Stocks at Albany and Chicago remained the same as previous week viz: - 4,715,000 and 204,000 bushels respectively. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 23,424,566 bushels distributed as follows: Chicago 756,000; Duluth 1,714,374; Buffalo 12,915,321; Erie 2,123,000; Milwaukee 253,000; New York 1,172,173; Albany 4,139,000; and New Orleans 292,000 bushels.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, but 1,045,912 bushels were shown at the corresponding date a year ago.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT


Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 7, 1936 amounted to 571,929 bushels, a decrease of 146,289 bushels from the previous week when 718,218 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,745,096 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending Fetruary 7, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 33,960 (92,000): Saskatchewan 205,164 (693,921); Alberta 332,805 (959,175) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to February 7, 1936 was compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 15,411,917 (27,028,614); Saskatchewan 99,432,445 (79,568,535); Alberta 69,862,169 (73,232,778) bushels. For the twenty-seven weeks ending February 7, 1936 and February 8, 1935 184,706,531 and 179,829,927 bushels were received from the farms.

#### OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCE AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending February 14, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,485,275 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 837,000 bushels of wheat. The total is 4,322,275 bushels as compared with 5,192,635 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 870,360 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 2,816,770 bushels.



In addition 226,994 bushels of wheat were shipped from Midland, Collingwood and Sarnia to the United States seaboard.



Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 14, 1936 show a net decrease of 4,335,331 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat, 235,414,105, oats 11,470,344, barley 8,619,330, flaxseed 432,948 and rye 4,682,043 bushels, a total of 260,618,770 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 3,997,380, oats. 181,464, barley 156,729 and flaxseed 6,104 bushels while rye increased 6,346 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 244,529,755, oats 15,161,965, barley 12,182,357, flaxseed 408,232 and rye 3,908,002 bushels, a total of 276,190,311 bushels.

Western Country Elevators: Grain in store shows a net decrease of 334,649 bushels.

Decreases are noted in wheat of 344,277 bushels, barley 3,817 and flaxseed 2,026 bushels, while cats and rye increased 11,630 and 3,841 bushels respectively.



INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 686,480 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 714,687 and barley 14,291 bushels while oats increased 42,498 bushels.

<u>VANCOUVER-NET WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS</u> - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 522,099 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 553,738 and barley 417 bushels while oats increased 32,056 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLTAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Grain stocks show a net increase of 132,788 bushels; Increases are noted in wheat of 157,739, flaxseed 847 and rye 2,546 bushels while decreases are shown in oats and barley of 18,878 and 9,466 bushels respectively.
