WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 21, 1936 shows a decrease of 6,449,061 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 12,698,848 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 228,352,876 bushels compared with the revised figure of 234,801,937 bushels for the previous week and 241,051,724 bushels for the week ending February 22, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,686,385 bushels a decrease of 1,587,018 bushels from the previous week, when 26,273,403 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports:- Duluth 702,432; Buffalo 14,775,000; Erie 739,000; Chicago 204,000; New York 2,333,188; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 149,000; Galveston 40,000; Boston 578,765; Baltimore 31,000; and Philadelphia 419,000 bushels. Decreases are shown from the previous week's stocks at Duluth of 3,000; Buffalo 507,000; Erie 332,000; New York 247,940; Galveston 7,000; Boston 36,078; Baltimore 202,000 and Philadelphia 252,000 bushels. Wheat stocks at Chicago, Albany and Norfolk remained the same as the previous week viz: 204,000; 4,715,000 and 149,000 bushels respectively. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 21,901,837 bushels distributed as follows:- Chicago 786,000; Duluth 1,644,468; Buffalo 12,172,322; Erie 1,998,000; Milwaukee 283,000; New York 832,047; Albany 4,139,000; and New Orleans 47,000 bushels.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, but 1,048,912 bushels were shown at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 14, 1936 amounted to 335,264 bushels, a decrease of 236,665 bushels from the previous week when 571,929 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 2,305,774 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending February 14, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 11,677 (121,722); Saskatchewan 160,550 (819,922); Alberta 163,037 (1,364,130) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to February 14, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 15,423,594 (27,150,336); Saskatchewan 99,592,995 (80,388,457); Alberta 70,025,206 (74,596,908) bushels. For the twenty-eight weeks ending February 14, 1936 and February 15, 1935, 185,041,795 and 182,135,701 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending February 21, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,191,675 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 573,000 bushels. The total is 4,764,675 bushels as compared with 4,322,275 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 442,400 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 1,777,933 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending February 22, 1936 amounted to 12,303,000 bushels as compared with 9,815,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,520,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. World shipments showed a total increase of 2,488,000 bushels as compared with last week. North American shipments showed an increase of 967,000, Argentina 250,000 and Australia 1,440,000 bushels.

During the first twenty-nine weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 280 million bushels as compared with 296 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 116 million bushels as compared with 96 million bushels for the same period in 1934-35 and Argentine shipments were only 47 million bushels as compared with 105 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-nine weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35.

As shown by the above, shipments of wheat have averaged 9.7 million bushels per week during the first 29 weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 million bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments have averaged 4.0 million bushels per week compared with 3.3 million bushels per week during the same period in 1934-35. Argentine shipments have averaged 1.6 million bushels per week as compared with 3.6 bushels last year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS-WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 21, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 21, 1936 show a decrease of 6,717,815 bushels compared with the revised figures of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 228,352,876, oats 11,144,309, barley 8,520,714, flaxseed 425,244 and rye 4,676,755 bushels, a total of 253,119,898 bushels. Decreases were composed of wheat 6,449,061, oats 217,427, barley 41,250, flaxseed 3,835 and rye 6,242 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 241,051,724, oats 15,286,782, barley 11,737,888, flaxseed 413,645 and rye 3,889,153 bushels, a total of 272,379,192 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,380,342 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,272,628, oats 91,778, barley 17,892 and flaxseed 112 bushels while rye increased 2,068 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 535,209 bushels. Wheat decreased 578,113 bushels while oats and barley increased 36,788 and 6,116 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 1,997,757 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,977,717 and oats 22,583 bushels while barley increased 2,543 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Grain in store shows a net increase of 105,710 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 119,217, barley 5,284, flaxseed 2,296 and rye 1,005 bushels while oats decreased 22,092 bushels.
