WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 28, 1936 shows a decrease of 5,447,203 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 17,944,440 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 222,857,829 bushels compared with the revised figure of 228,305,032 bushels for the previous week and 240,802,269 bushels for the week ending March 1, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 23,123,430 bushels a decrease of 1,562,955 bushels from the previous week, when 24,686,385 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 696,552; Buffalo 13,600,000; Erie 223,000; Chicago 204,000; New York 2,414,049; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 132,000; Galveston 17,000; Boston 671,829; Philadelphia 419,000; and Baltimore 31,000 bushels. Decreases are shown for the previous week's stocks at Duluth of 5,880; Buffalo 1,175,000; Erie 516,000; Norfolk 17,000 and Galveston 23,000 bushels while increases are noted ct New York 480,861 and Boston 93,064 bushels. Canadian wheat in store at Chicago amounting to 204,000; Albany 4,715,000; Philadelphia 419,000 and Baltimore 31,000 bushels remained the same as those of the previous week. For the **exce** week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 21,484,466 bushels distributed as follows: Chicago 786,000; Duluth 1,629,468; Buffalo 11,959,291; Erie 1,835,000; Milwaukee 188,000; New York 704,707; Albany 4,139,000 and New Orleans 243,000 bushels.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, but 1,048,912 bushels were shown at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT


Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 21, amounted to 351,643 bushels, a slight increase of 16,379 bushels over the previous week when 335,264 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 2,584,429 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending February 21,1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 29,027 (161,566); Saskatchewan 155,512 (1,057,578); Alberta 167,104 (1,365,285) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to February 21, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935; Manitoba 15,452,621 (27,311,902); Saskatchewan 99,748,507 (81,446,035); Alberta 70,192,310 (75,962,193) bushels. For the twenty-nine weeks ending February 21, 1936 and February 22, 1935, 185,393,438 and 184,720,130 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending February 28, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,701,765 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 588,000 bushels. The total is 5,289,765 bushels as compared with 4,764,675 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 525,090 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 4,079,065 bushels. This is the largest weekly movement overseas during this and the last Crop Year.



World shipments for the week ending February 29, 1936 amounted to 12,386,000 bushels as compared with 12,303,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,192,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments showed slight decreases as compared with the previous week while shipments from Australia showed an increase of 455,000 bushels.

During the first thirty weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 293 million bushels as compared with 306 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 121 million bushels as compared with 98 million bushels for the same period in 1934-35 and Argentine shipments were only 48 million bushels as compared with 110 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.



As shown by the above, shipments of wheat have averaged 9.8 million bushels per week during the first 30 weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 million bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments have averaged 4.0 million bushels per week compared with 3.3 million bushels per week during the same period in 1934-35. Argentine shipments have averaged 1.6 million bushels per week as compared with 3.7 bushels, last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS-WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 28, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 28, 1936 show a decrease of 5,855,019 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 222,857,829, oats 10,923,671, barley 8,423,907, flaxseed 419,778 and rye 4,675,263 bushels, a total of 247,300,448 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 5,447,203, oats 317,721, barley 87,353, flaxseed 905 and rye 1,837 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 240,802,269, oats 15,368,201, barley 11,502,925, flaxseed 407,298 and rye 3,877,862 bushels, a total of 271,958,555 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,494,088 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,515,218, barley 27,709, flaxseed 1,085 and rye 433 bushels, while oats increased 50,357 bushels.



INTERIOR FUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 138,049 bushels. Wheat decreased 197,938 bushels while increases are shown in oats and barley of 48,397 and 11,542 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 968,977 bushels. Increases were as follows: wheat 777,660, oats 189,597 and barley 1,720 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS .- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Grain in store shows a net increase of 132,818 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 202,535, flaxseed 1,534 and rye 2,483 bushels while oats and barley decreased 65,882 and 7,852 bushels respectively.
