WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 6, 1936 shows a decrease of 3,442,905 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 20,154,807 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 219,250,632 bushels compared with the revised figure of 222,693,537 bushels for the previous week and 239,405,439 bushels for the week ending March 8, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 21,640,695 bushels, a net decrease of 1,482,735 bushels from the previous week when 23,123,430 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 652,937; Buffalo 12,496,000; Erie 145,000; Chicago 204,000; New York 2,514,373; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 132,000; Galveston 25,000; Boston 329,385; Philadelphia 396,000 and Baltimore 31,000 bushels. Decreases are shown from the previous week's stocks at Duluth of 43,615; Buffalo 1,104,000; Erie 78,000; Boston 342,444 and Philadelphia 23,000 bushels, while increases are noted at New York of 100,324 and Galveston 8,000 bushels. Canadian wheat at Chicago amounting to 204,000; Albany 4,715,000 and Norfolk 132,000 bushels remained the same as the previous week. For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,560,688 bushels distributed as follows: Chicago 647,000; Duluth 1,619,468; Buffalo 11,526,660; Erie 1,707,000; New York 678,560; Albany 4,139,000 and New Orleans 243,000 bushels.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, but 1,048,912 bushels were shown at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 28 amounted to 622,543 bushels, an increase of 270,900 bushels over the previous week when 351,643 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 2,384,689 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending February 28, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 30,843 (189,728); Saskatchewan 335,231 (918,972); Alberta 256,469 (1,275,989) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to February 28, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 15,483,464 (27,501,630); Saskatchewan 100,083,738 (82,365,007); Alberta 70,448,779 (77,238,182) bushels. For the thirty weeks ending February 28, 1936 and March 1, 1935, 186,015,981 and 187,104,819 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending March 6, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,881,845 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 857,000 bushels. The total is 2,738,845 bushels as compared with 5,289,765 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 2,550,920 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 769,439 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending March 7, 1936 amounted to 10,578,000 bushels as compared with 12,386,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,872,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Australian shipments showed decreases of 1,622,000 and 1,170,000 bushels, respectively as compared with the previous week while shipments from Argentina showed an increase of 543,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-one weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 303 million bushels as compared with 315 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly higher than last year. North American shipments were 125 million bushels as compared with 100 million bushels for the same period in 1934-35 and Argentina shipments were only 50 million bushels as compared with 112 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first thirty-one weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35.

As shown by the above, shipments of wheat have averaged 9.8 million bushels per week during the first 31 weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 million bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments have averaged 4.0 million bushels per week compared with 3.2 million bushels per week during the same period in 1934-35. Argentine shipments have averaged 1.6 million bushels per week as compared with 3.6 bushels last year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 6, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 6, 1936 show a net decrease of 3,415,214 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 219,250,632, oats 11,028,445, barley 8,374,993, flaxseed 416,563 and rye 4,684,791 bushels, a total of 243,755,424 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 3,442,905, barley 17,302 and flaxseed 4,529 bushels while increases are shown in oats and rye of 42,367 and 7,155 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 239,405,439, oats 15,260,874, barley 11,316,476, flaxseed 408,367 and rye 3,866,971 bushels a total of 270,258,127 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,594,668 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,780,810 and barley 26,964 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 196,651, flaxseed 127 and rye 16,328 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 100,115 bushels. Increases are noted in oats and barley of 83,963 and 25,345 bushels respectively while wheat decreased 9,193 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 574,926 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 576,798 and barley 2,484 bushels while oats decreased 4,356 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Grain in store shows a net increase of 163,193 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 185,682, barley 7,326, flaxseed 785 and rye 5,722 bushels while oats decreased 36,322 bushels.


