WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 13, 1936 shows a decrease of 3,566,955 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 23,101,990 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 214,316,677 bushels compared with the revised figure of 217,883,632 bushels for the previous week and 237,418,667 bushels for the week ending March 15, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,297,069 bushels, a net decrease of 1,343,626 bushels from the previous week when 21,640,695 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 623,528; Buffalo 11,319,000; Erie 145,000; Chicago 204,000; New York 2,379,156; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 132,000; Galveston 23,000; Boston 329,385; Philadelphia 396,000 and Baltimore 31,000 bushels. Decreases are shown from the previous week's stocks at Duluth of 29,409; Buffalo 1,177,000; New York 135,217 and Galveston 2,000 bushels. The stocks at the remainder of the ports, viz., Erie, Chicago, Albany, Norfolk, Boston, Philadelphia and Baltimore were unchanged from those of a week ago. For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,756,771 bushels distributed as follows: Chicago 333,000; Duluth 1,571,673; Buffalo 10,955,877; Erie 1,604,000; New York 454,221; Albany 4,636,000 and New Orleans 202,000 bushels.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, but 1,048,912 bushels were shown at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT


Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 6, amounted to 1,286,189 bushels, an increase of 663,646 bushels over the previous week, when 622,543 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,666,521 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending March 6, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 66,500 (130,998); Saskatchewan 722,159 (598,909); Alberta 497,530 (936,614) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to March 6, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 15.549,964 (27,632,628); Saskatchewan 100,805,897 (82,963,916); Alberta 70,946,309 (78,174,796) bushels. For the thirty-one weeks ending March 6, 1936 and March 8,1935, 187,302,170 and 188,771,340 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending March 13, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,567,673 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 795,000 bushels. The total is 3,362,673 bushels as compared with 2,738,845 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 623,828 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 509,380 bushels.



In addition 2,000 bushels of wheat were shipped from Midland to Unites States points, while 8,600 bushels were moved from Kingston to the same destination. Some 9,000 bushels were also forwarded to Montreal from Midland by rail.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 13, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 13, 1936 show a net decrease of 3,234,431 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 214,316,677, oats 11,447,543, barley 8,513,301, flaxseed 417,550 and rye 4,677,887 bushels, a total of 239,372,963 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 3,566,955, flaxseed 3,956 and rye 7,522 bushels, while oats and barley increased 271,680 and 72,314 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 237,418,667, oats 15,112,672, barley 11,073,038, flaxseed 413,912 and rye 3,843,219 bushels, a total of 267,861,508 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,567,692 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,778,551, barley 3,587 and flaxseed 1,279 bushels while oats and rye increased 213,604 and 2,121 bushels.



INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show a net increase of 190,203 bushels. Increases are noted in oats of 153,039 and barley 38,068 bushels while wheat decreased 904 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 18,685 bushels. Oats increased 47,203 bushels while wheat and barley decreased 27,872 and 646 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS .- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR) - Grain in store shows an increase of 561,028 bushels, composed of wheat 516,171, pats 27,1455, barley 13,411, flaxseed 987 and rye 3,004 bushels.
