WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 20, 1936 shows a decrease of 1,933,943 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 21,889,799 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 212,258,556 bushels compared with the revised figure of 214,192,499 bushels for the previous week and 234,148,355 bushels for the week ending March 22, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 18,995,621 bushels, a net decrease of 1,301,448 bushels from the previous week when 20,297,069 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 622,131; Buffalo 10,581,000; Erie 145,000; Chicago 184,000; New York 1,969,720; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 98,000; Galveston 24,000; Boston 260,761 and Philadelphia 396,000. Decreases are shown from the previous week's stocks at Duluth of 1,397; Buffalo 738,000; Chicago 20,000; New York 409,427; Norfolk 34,000; Boston 68,624 and Baltimore 31,000 bushels. The wheat stocks at Galveston increased 1,000 bushels over those of a week ago. Erie, Albany and Philadelphia stocks remained the same as those of the previous week. The same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,859,766 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,444,693; Buffalo 9,911,425; Erie 1,370,000; New York 626,648; Albany 4,309,000; and New Orleans 198,000 bushels.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, but 1,048,912 bushels were shown at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 13 amounted to 2,121,504 bushels, an increase of 835,315 bushels over the previous week when 1,286,189 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,723,435 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending March 13, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 151,163 (162,652); Saskatchewan 1,177,384 (600,827); Alberta 792,957 (959,956) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1, to March 13, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 15,701,127 (27,795,280); Saskatchewan 101,983,281 (83,564,743); Alberta 71,739,266 (79,134,752) bushels. For the thirty-two weeks ending March 13, 1936 and March 15, 1935, 189,423,674 and 190,494,775 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending March 20, 1936 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,397,179 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 401,000 bushels. The total is 2,798,179 bushels as compared with 3,362,673 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 564,494 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 956,129 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending March 21, 1936 amounted to 9,254,000 bushels as compared with 9,514,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,680,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. World shipments showed a decrease of 260,000 bushels as compared with last week made up of 10,000 from North America, 143,000 from Argentina and 520,000 bushels from Australia.

During the first thirty-three weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 327 million bushels as compared with 335 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly higher than last year. North American shipments were 137 million bushels as compared with 106 million bushels for the same period in 1934-35 and Argentine shipments were only 52 million bushels as compared with 119 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first thirty-three weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35.

As shown by the above, shipments of wheat have averaged 9.9 million bushels per week during the first 33 weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 million bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments have averaged 4.1 million bushels per week compared with 3.2 million bushels per week during the same period in 1934-35. Argentine shipments have averaged 1.6 million bushels per week as compared with 3.6 million bushels last year.







CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 20, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 20, 1936 show a net decrease of 1,622,599 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 212,258,556, oats 11,982,750, barley 8,722,106, flaxseed 430,129 and rye 4,718,422 bushels, a total of 238,111,963 bushels. A decrease is noted in wheat of 1,933,943 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 167,152, barley 111,152, flaxseed 11,493 and rye 21,547 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 234,148,355, oats 14,779,959, barley 10,896,941, flaxseed 409,604 and rye 3,831,056 bushels, a total of 264,065,915 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,727,246 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,931,999 and barley 49,756 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 246,266, flaxseed 1,377 and rye 6,866 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 211,433 bushels. Increases are noted in oats of 143,197 and barley 74,540 bushels while wheat decreased 6,304 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,349,020 bushels. Increases are shown in wheat of 1,302,845 and oats 48,150 bushels while barley and rye decreased 904 and 1,071 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net increase of 1,154,897 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,133,566, barley 54,027, flaxseed 2,579 and rye 21,630 bushels while oats decreased 56,905 bushels.

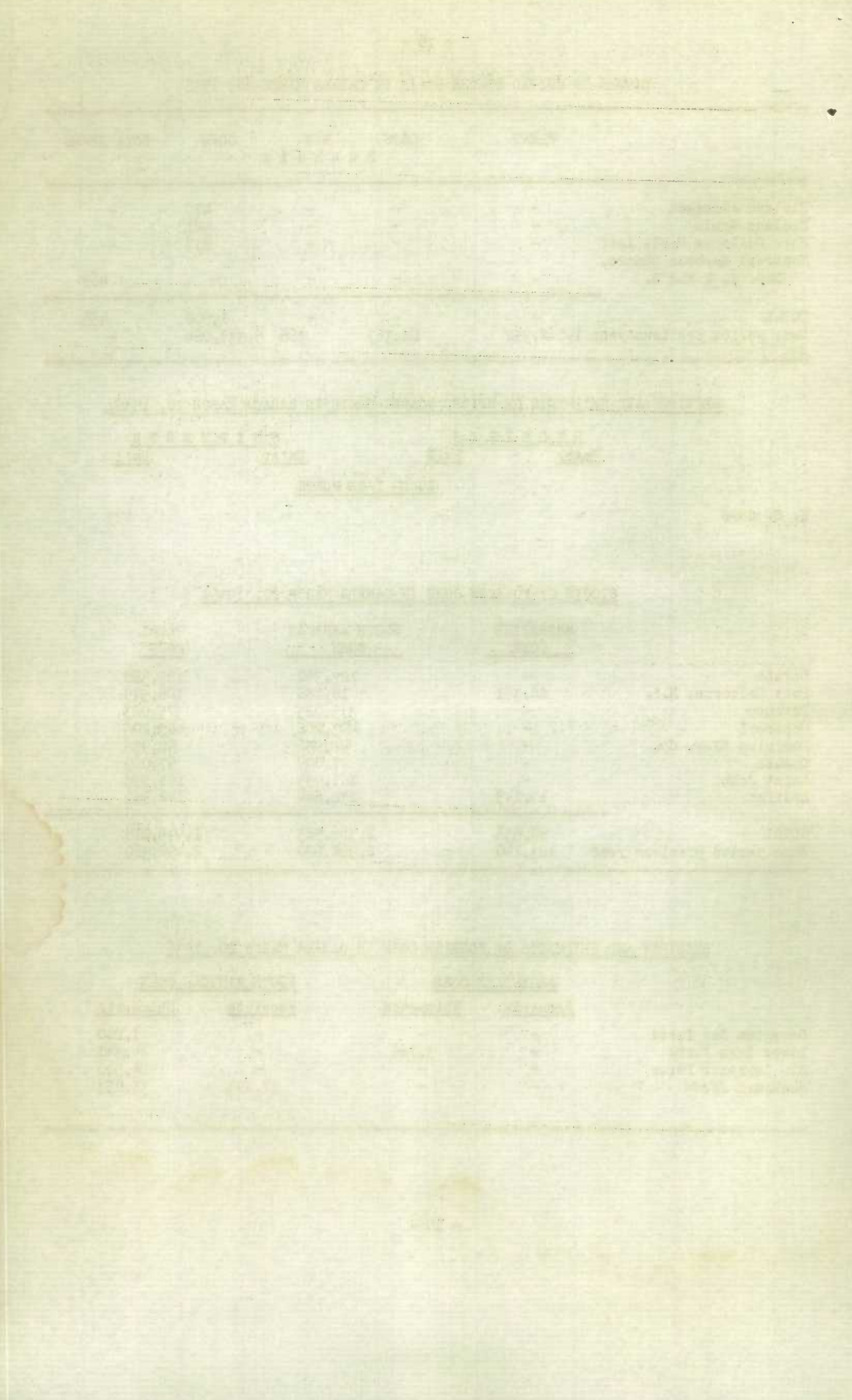
