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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 3, 1936 shows a decrease of 2,922,384 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 24,276,095 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 205,476,064 bushels compared with the revised figure of 208,398,448 bushels for the previous week and 229,752,159 bushels for the week ending April 5, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 15,500,134 bushels, a net decrease of 1,530,884 bushels from the previous week when 17,031,018 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 568,376; Buffalo 8,348,000; Erie 95,000; Chicago 89,000; New York 1,214,388; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 62,000; Galveston 48,000; Boston 57,370 and Philadelphia 303,000 bushels. Decreases are shown from the previous week's stocks at Duluth of 20,204; Buffalo 1,029,000; New York 256,982; Erie 50,000; Chicago 115,000; Boston 6,698 and Philadelphia 77,000 bushels. An increase is shown in the stocks at Galveston of 24,000 bushels. Albany and Erie remained unchanged. For the same week a year ago Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 15,179,696 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,367,027; Buffalo 7,725,418; Erie 1,070,000; New York 812,251; Albany 4,009,000; and New Orleans 196,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 27, amounted to 1,746,117 bushels, an increase of 151,711 bushels over the previous week when 1,594,406 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,762,334 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending March 27, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 255,576 (184,934); Saskatchewan 557,149 (721,518); Alberta 933,392 (855,882) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1, 1935 to March 27, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 15,974,302 (28,185,576); Saskatchewan 103,559,481 (85,341,995); Alberta 73,230,414 (81,037,861) bushels. For the thirty-four weeks ending March 27, 1936 and March 29, 1935, 192,764,197 and 194,565,432 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending April 3, 1936 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,592,704 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 573,000 bushels. The total is 3,165,704 bushels as compared with 3,384,522 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 218,818 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 500,604 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending April 4, 1936 amounted to 9,983,000 bushels as compared with 9,379,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,872,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments showed decreases of 747,000 and 126,000 bushels respectively while shipments from Australia showed an increase of 1,088,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-five weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 345 million bushels as compared with 356 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly higher than last year. North American shipments were 145 million bushels as compared with 110 million bushels for the same period in 1934-35 and Argentine shipments were only 55 million bushels as compared with 129 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

- Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 3, 1936 show a net decrease of 2,688,816 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 205,476,064, oats 12,499,372, barley 9,036,372, flaxseed 422,055 and rye 4,776,906 bushels, a total of 232,210,769 bushels.
- Decreases are noted in wheat of 2,922,384 and flaxseed 2,632 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 142,980, barley 77,886 and rye 15,334 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 229,752,159, oats 13,576,514, barley 10,322,284, flaxseed 412,575 and rye 3,793,890 bushels, a total of 257,857,422 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 2,009,596 bushels, composed of wheat 1,772,151, oats 89,905, barley 129,966, flaxseed 5,574 and rye 12,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 21,817 bushels, composed of wheat 16,271, oats 1,539 and barley 4,007 bushels.

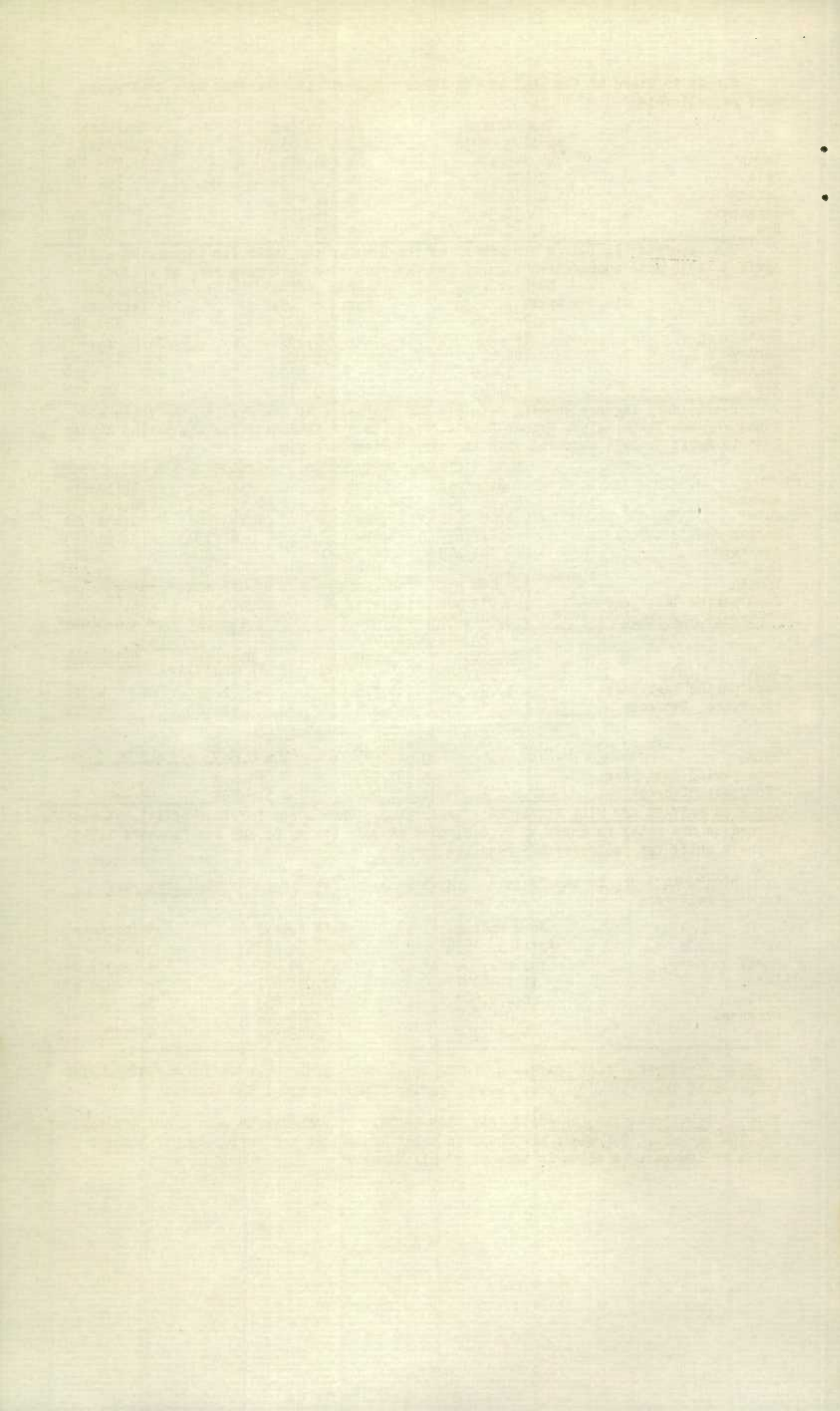

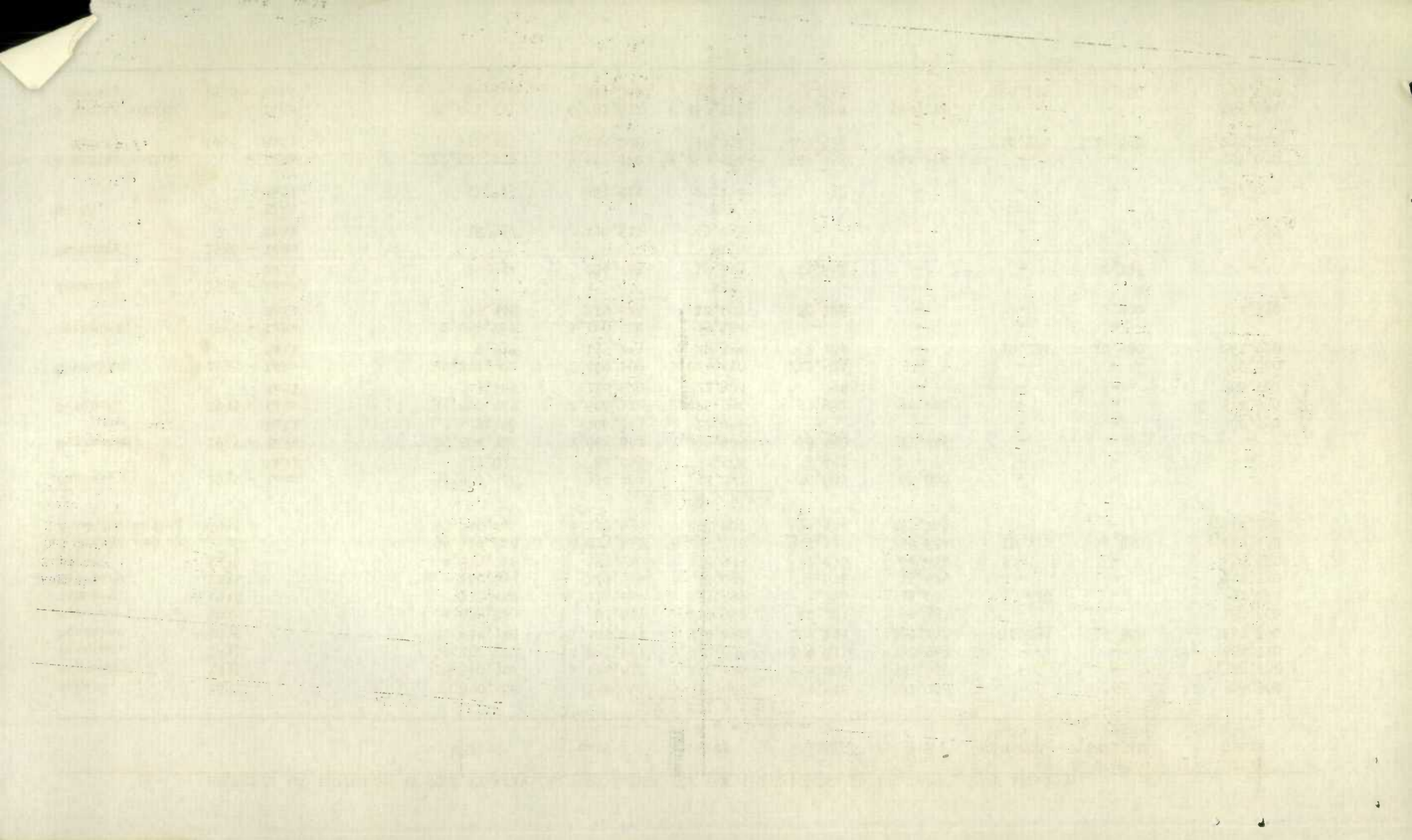
