WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 30 shows an increase of 372,006 bushels as compared with the previous week and a decrease of 69,239 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 193,860,485 bushels as compared with the revised figure of 193,488,379 bushels for the previous week and 193,929,924 bushels for the week ending August 31, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 18,571,308 bushels, a net increase of 854, 367 bushels over the previous week when 17,716,941 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Buffalo 16,112,990; Erie 27,000; New York 408,543; Albany 1,399,000; New Orleans 18,000; Duluth 401,775 and Galveston 204,000 bushels. Buffalo and New York stocks show increases of 1,000,724 and 43,692 bushels respectively over those of the previous week. Decreases are noted in Duluth stocks of 180,049; in New Orleans 3,000 and in Galveston 7,000 bushels compared with those of a week ago. Wheat at Albany and Erie remained the same as the previous week. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 10,065,306 bushels distributed as follows:- Buffalo 4,601,529; Erie 1,615,000; New York 1,520,491; Albany 2,236,000 and Duluth 92,286 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 7,165,990 bushels compared with 5,935,728 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the period ending August 23 amounted to 2,313,638 bushels ar increase of 692,617 bushels over the previous week's total when 1,621,021 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 9,020,987 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the period ending August 23, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 473,449 (2,954,531); Saskatchewan 672,561 (3,735,045); Alberta 1,167,628 (2,331,411) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1, to 23 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 19 74: Manitoba 704,809 (3,587,867); Saskatchewan 1,817,672 (5,567,877); Alberta 2,856,861 (5,879,977) bushels.


For the three weeks ending August 23, 1935 and August 24, 1934, 5,379,342 and 15,035,721 bushels were received from the farms.

PVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending August 30, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,020,022 bushels as compared with 2,237,851 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 217,829 and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 1,656,058 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending August 31, 1955 amounted to 7,395,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,243,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,464,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments when compared with the previous week decreased 225,000 and 2,108,000 bushels respectively.

During the first five weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 37 million bushels as compared with 54 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to only 12 million bushels this year as compared with 21 million bushels in 1934-35.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 30, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 30,1935 show a net increase of 805,180 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 193,860,485,0015 5,759,202, barley 3,784,438, flaxseed 197,642 and rye 3,302,399 bushels, a total of 206,904,166 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 372,106, barley 446,206 and rye 66,506 bushels while decreases were shown in oats and flaxseed of 6,835 and 72,803 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 193,929,924, oats 10,659,399, barley 10,026,554, flaxseed 469,386 and rye 4,097,319 bushels, a total of 219,182,582 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: Grain stocks show a net increase of 197,568 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 171,638, barley 256,765 and rye 61,757 bushels while wheat and flaxseed decreased 291,154 and 1,438 bushels respectively.



IN TRANSIT LAKES:- Grain in transit shows a net increase of 1,233,570 bushels. Increases were noted in whoat of 1,230,262 and barley 46,020 bushels while decreases were shown in oats and rye of 36,712 and 6,000 bushels respectively.




