WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 8, 1936, shows a decrease of 7,777,584 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 33,838,259 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 177,441,638 bushels compared with the revised figure of 185,219,222 bushels for the previous week and 211,279,897 bushels for the week ending May 10, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 10,762,421 bushels a net decrease of 1,125,975 bushels from the previous week when 11,888,396 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 481,876; Buffalo 5,777,000; Erie 86,000; Chicago 74,000; New York 304,174; Albany 3,967,000; Boston 41,371 and Philadelphia 31,000 bushels. Decreases are shown from the previous week's stocks at Buffalo of 748,000; New York 308,475; and Duluth 69,500 bushels. Stocks at Erie, Chicago, Albany, Boston and Philadelphia remained unchanged. For the same week a year ago Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 11,014,573 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,300,480; Buffalo 5,053,234; Erie 800,000; New York 435,859; Albany 3,242,000 and New Orleans 183,000 bushels.


There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, but 787,912 bushels were shown at the corresponding date a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 4,911,560 bushels compared with 531,087 bushels for the previous week and 884,138 bushels for the same week in 1935.

There were 12,169,876 bushels of wheat in rail transit at May 8, 1935 not included in the visible because no comparable figures for 1935 or previous years were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 1 amounted to 1,063,622 bushels, a decrease of 11,497 bushels from the previous week when 1,075,119 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,250,689 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending May 1 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 230,204 (177,209); Saskatchewan 595,046 (597,938); Alberta 238,372 (475,542) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to May 1, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 16,527,670 (28,927,904); Saskatchewan 106,612,044 (88,628,717); Alberta 75,052,560 (84,466,388) bushels. For the thirty-nine weeks ending May 1, 1936 and May 3, 1935, 198,192,274 and 202,023,009 bushels were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending May 8, 1936 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 6,846,260 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 762,000 bushels. The total is 7,608,260 bushels as compared with 4,494,663 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 3,113,597 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 4,223,377 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending May 9, 1936 amounted to 10,294,000 bushels, as compared with 10,212,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,456,000 bushels last year. North American and Australian shipments showed slight increases this week as compared with last week while Argentine shipments showed a decrease of 192,000 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 8, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 8, 1936 show a net decrease of 8,277,770 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 177,441,638, oats 10,160,614, barley 8,620,741, flaxseed 352,550 and rye 4,737,813 bushels, a total of 201,313,356 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 7,777,584, oats 423,789, flaxseed 9,814 and rye 70,184 bushels while barley increased 3,601 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 211,279,897, oats 8,593,128, barley 7,980,002, flaxseed 403,090, and rye 3,747,480 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a decrease of 4,417,322, bushels composed of wheat 3,974,056, oats 347,641, barley 56,953, flaxseed 35,475 and rye 3,197 bushels.



INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 146,459 bushels, composed of wheat 28,996, oats 46,777 and barley 70,686 bushels.

Vancouver - New Westminster Elevators.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 382,083 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 302,234, oats 83,313 and flaxseed 7 bushels, while barley decreased 3,471 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a decrease of 2,936,341 bushels, composed of wheat 1,424,243, oats 598,766, barley 506,768, flaxseed 2,529 and rye 404,035 bushels.


