WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 15, 1936, shows a decrease of 1,555,241 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 31,472,753 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 175,796,165 bushels compared with the revised figure of 177,351,406 bushels for the previous week and 207,268,918 bushels for the week ending May 17, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 11,790,898 bushels a net increase of 1,028,477 bushels over the previous week when 10,762,421 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 333,876; Buffalo 7,051,000; Erie 86,000; Chicago 74,000; New York 237,651; Albany 3,967,000; and Boston 41,371. The stocks at Buffalo increased 1,274,000 bushels over those of previous week, while decreases are noted at Duluth of 148,000 bushels; New York 66,523 and Philadelphia 31,000 bushels. Stocks at Erie, Chicago, Albany and Boston remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago Canada wheat in the United States positions amounted to 10,468,249 bushels distributed as follows:- Duluth 766,154; Buffalo 4,883,744; Erie 608,000; New York 785,354; Albany 3,242,000; and New Orleans 183,000 bushels.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, but 546,912 bushels were shown at the corresponding date a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 7,966,413 bushels compared with 4,911,560 bushels for the previous week and 1,002,702 bushels for the same week in 1935.

There were 8,529,165 bushels of wheat in rail transit at May 15, 1936 not included in the visible because no comparable figures for 1935 or previous years were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 8 amounted to 1,040,371 bushels, a decrease of 23,251 bushels from the previous week when 1,063,622 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 686,253 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending May 8 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 81,673 (106,604) Saskatchewan 585,466 (325,060); Alberta 373,232 (254,589) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to May 8, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 16,609,343 (29,034,508); Saskatchewan 107,197,510 (88,953,777); Alberta 75,425,792 (84,720,977) bushels. For the forty weeks ending May 8, 1936 and May 10, 1935, 199,232,645 and 202,709,262 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending May 15, 1936 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,455,105 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 347,000 bushels. The total is 4,802,105 bushels as compared with 7,608,260 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 2,806,155 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 1,505,847 bushels.

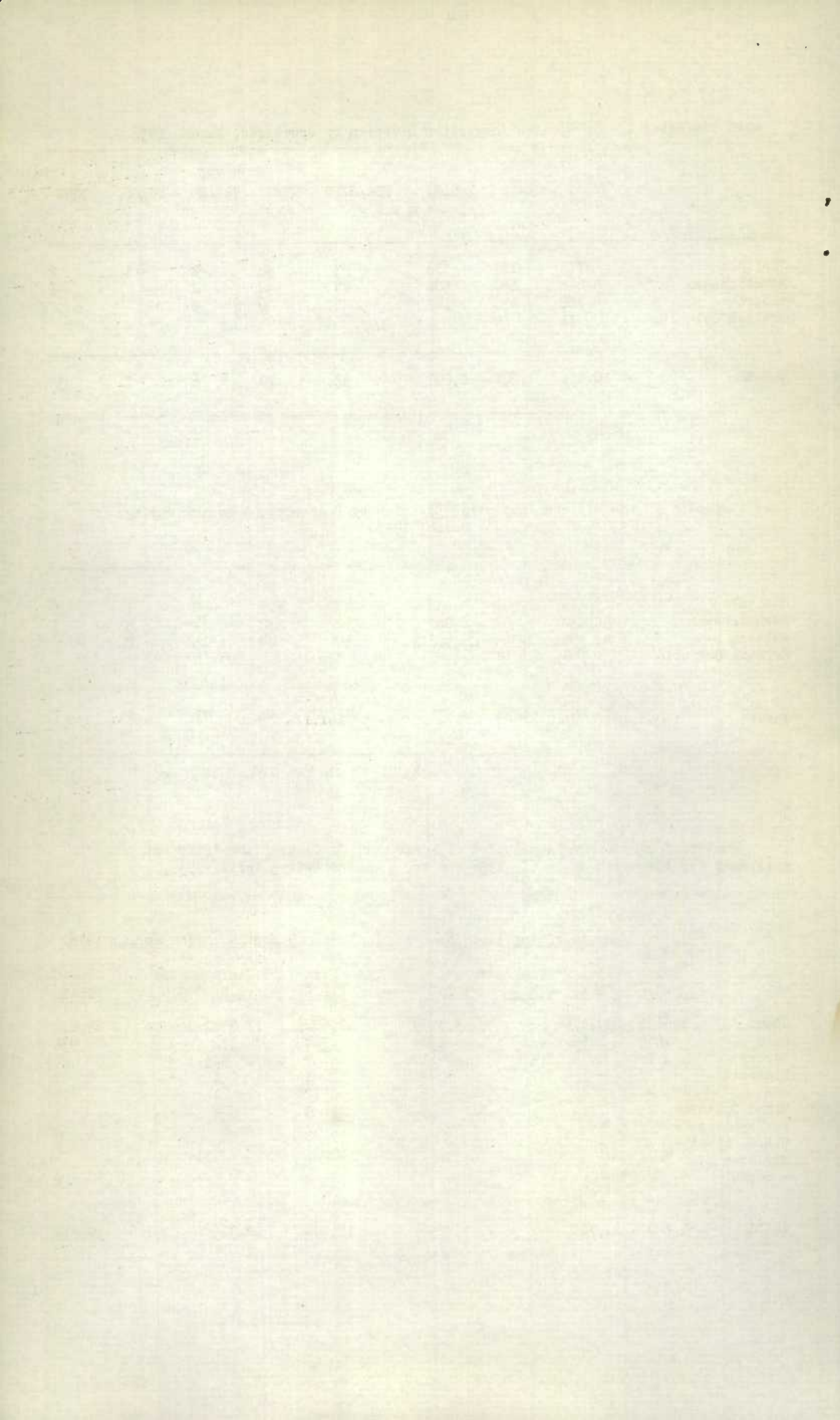

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS-WEEK ENDING MAY 15, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 15, 1936 show a decrease of 2,192,488 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 175,796,165, oats 10,086,393, barley 8,457,933, flaxseed 348,767 and rye 4,272,013 bushels. Decreases were composed of wheat 1,555,241, oats 110,817, barley 57,060, flaxseed 655 and rye 468,715 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 207,268,918, oats 8,267,760, barley 7,557,826, flaxseed 402,901 and rye 3,672,663 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 3,136,382 bushels, composed of wheat 2,714,020, oats 235,541, barley 81,825, flaxseed 43,238 and rye 11,758 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on May 8, 1936 with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1935.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show a decrease of 27,301 bushels, composed of wheat 19,720, oats 7,003 and barley 578 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 564,966 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 564,294 and oats 2,422 bushels while barley decreased 1,750 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS. Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). Grain in store shows a net decrease of 6,199,300 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 4,511,817, oats 576,916, barley 383,224 and rye 765,555 bushels, while flaxseed increased 38,322 bushels.

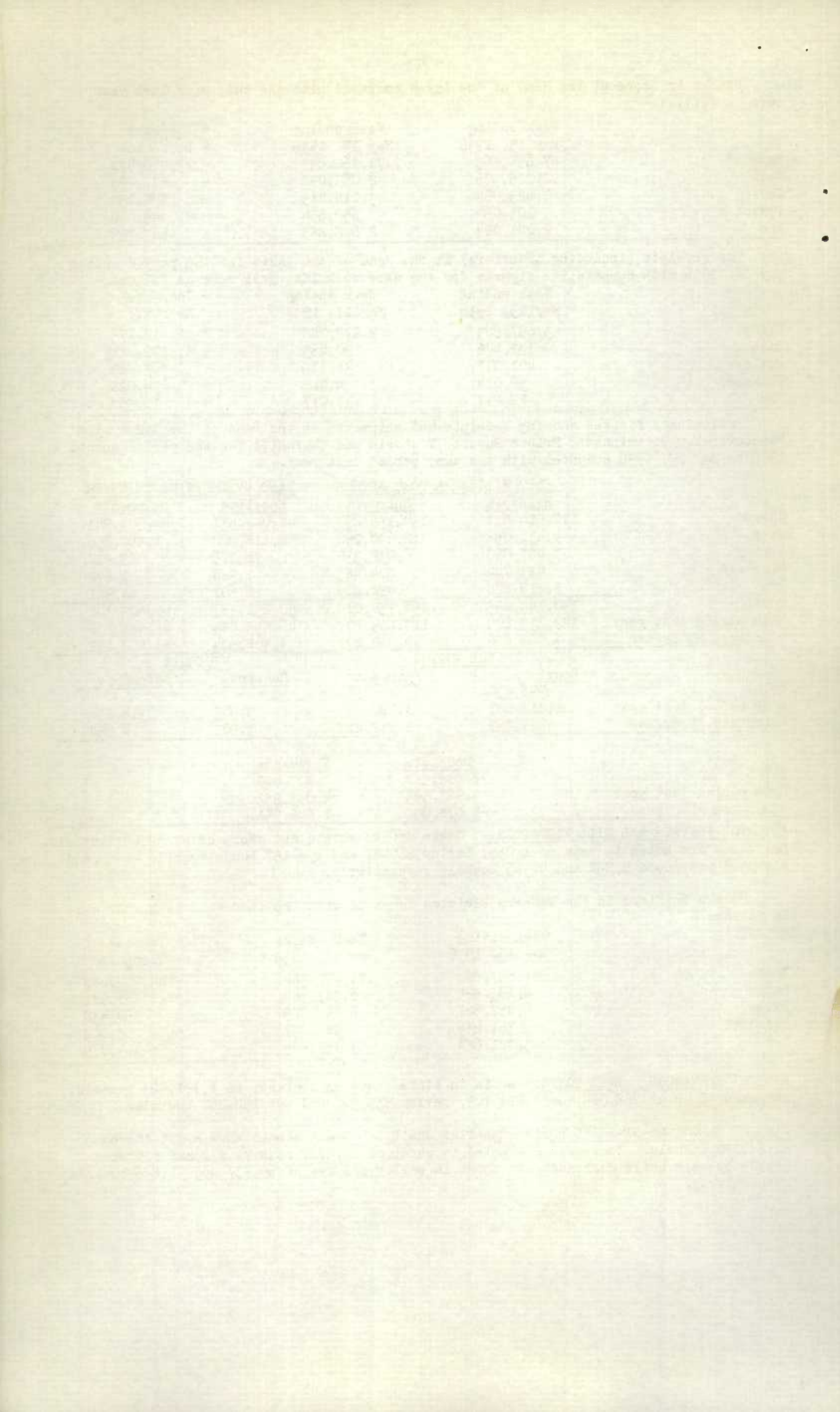

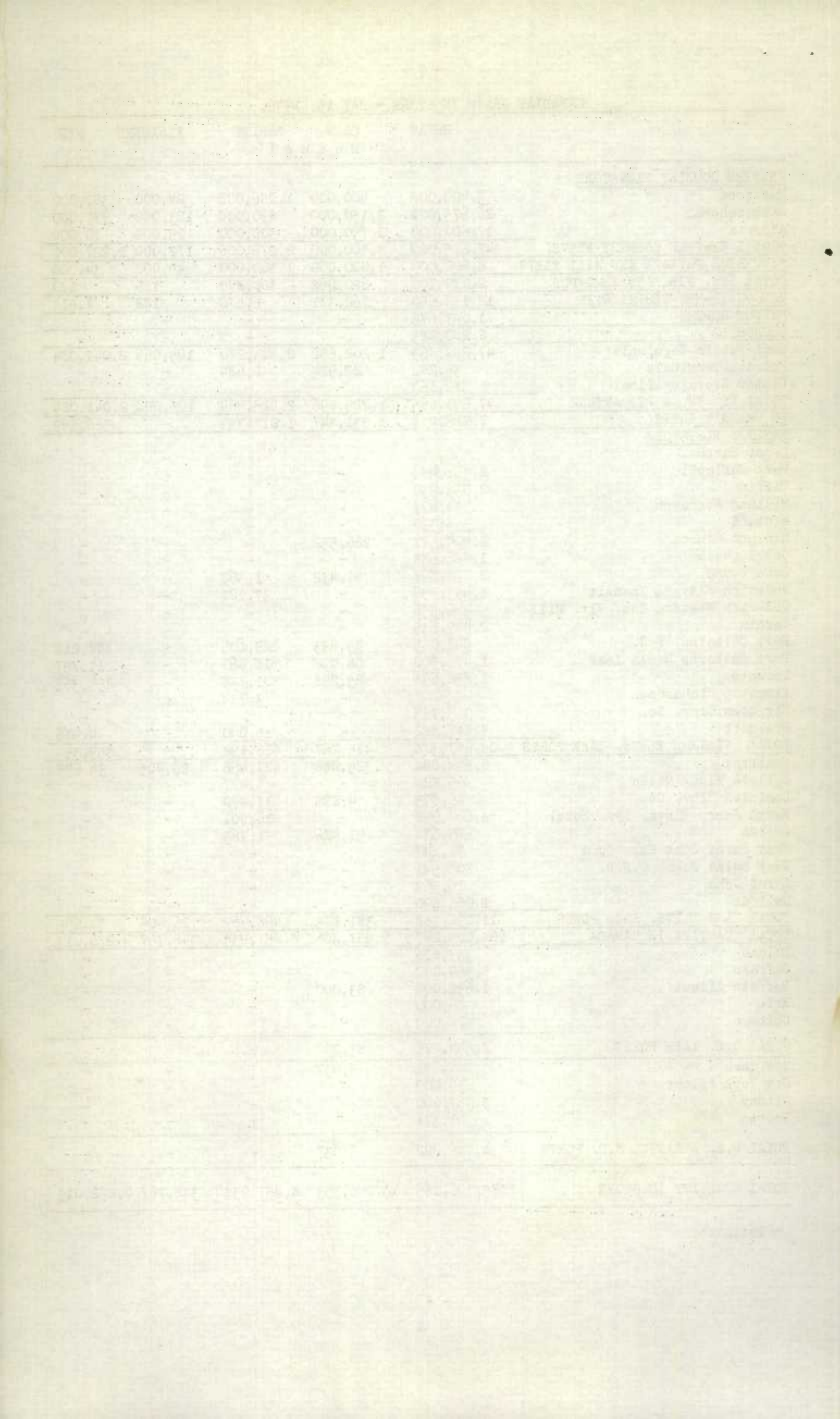
