WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 29, 1936 shows a decrease of 4,739,622 bushels compared with the previous week and decrease of 39,592,660 bushels, compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 161,952,660 bushels compared with the revised figure of 166,692,282 bushels for the previous week and 201,545,396 bushels for the week ending May 31, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 13,286,506 bushels a net increase of 148,176 bushels over the previous week when 13,138,330 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 332,677; Buffalo 8,364,000; Erie 86,000; Chicago 74,000; New York 361,458; Albany 4,027,000; and Boston 41,371 bushels. The stocks at New York and Albany increased 38,176 and 60,000 bushels respectively over those of previous week. Stocks at Erie, Chicago, Buffalo, Duluth and Boston remain unchanged.

For the same week a year ago Canadian wheat in United States positions amounted to 9,370,703 bushels distributed as follows:- Duluth 716,343; Buffalo 4,145,058; Erie 455,000; New York 922,302; Albany 2,988,000; New Orleans 67,000 and Galveston 77,000 bushels.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, but 200,294 bushels were shown at the corresponding date a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 3,654,847 bushels compared with 4,707,801 bushels for the previous week and 1,483,997 bushels for the same week in 1935.

There were 6,745,132 bushels of wheat in rail transit at May 29, 1936 not included in the visible because no comparable figures for 1935 or previous years were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 22, amounted to 1,230,150 bushels, an increase of 521,974 bushels over the previous week when 708,974 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,078,531 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending May 22, were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 127,421 (196,758); Saskatchewan 646,617 (544,290); Alberta 456,112 (337,483) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to May 22, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 16,805,128 (29,378,012); Saskatchewan 108,189,426 (90,038,601); Alberta 76,170,417 (85,450,484) bushels. For the forty-two weeks ending May 22, 1936 and May 24, 1935 201,164,971 and 204,867,097 bushels were received from the farms.

The stocks of wheat in the elevators in Canada for the week ending May 29, 1936, amounted to 148,666,154 bushels compared with 153,553,952 bushels a week ago and 192,174,693 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Decreases are shown in all the stocks in Canadian elevators and in transit wheat on the lakes from those of the previous week with the exception of small increases in elevator storage of 296,181 bushels at the St. Lawrence and Lower lake ports. The largest decrease amounting to 2,226,232 bushels is shown in the stocks at the Head of the Lakes, while the quantity in western country elevators decreased 1,558,568 bushels. Wheat stocks at the Pacific ports declined 228,336 bushels from those a week ago. At the St. Lawrence and Maritime ports a net increase is shown of 261,794 bushels.

The lake shipments show a large advance over those of a year ago. The opening of navigation was a week later this year than 1935, but the movement was three times greater. The following amount shipped from the Head of the Lakes for the period from May 7, to 31, 1936 was 26,342,893 bushels compared with 8,413,700 bushels for the period from April 30 to May 31, 1935.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending May 29, 1936 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 5,313,730 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 401,000 bushels. The total is 5,714,730 bushels as compared with 6,619,042 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 904,312 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 2,506,781 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending May 30, 1936 amounted to 8,695,000 bushels compared with 10,514,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,472,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Argentina showed decreases of 1,158,000 and 676,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while Australian shipments showed a decrease of 95,000 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 29, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 29, 1936 show a net decrease of 6,396,038 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 161,952,660, oats 8,614,474, barley 7,095,761, flaxseed 353,015 and rye 4,014,055 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 4,739,622, oats 606,501, barley 783,126 and rye 274,948 bushels, while flaxseed increased 8,159 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 201,545,396; oats 7,025,706, barley 6,557,104, flaxseed 370,683 and rye 3,650,321 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a decrease of 1,871,017 bushels composed of wheat 1,558,568, oats 179,349, barley 117,284, flaxseed 4,886 and rye 10,930 bushels.

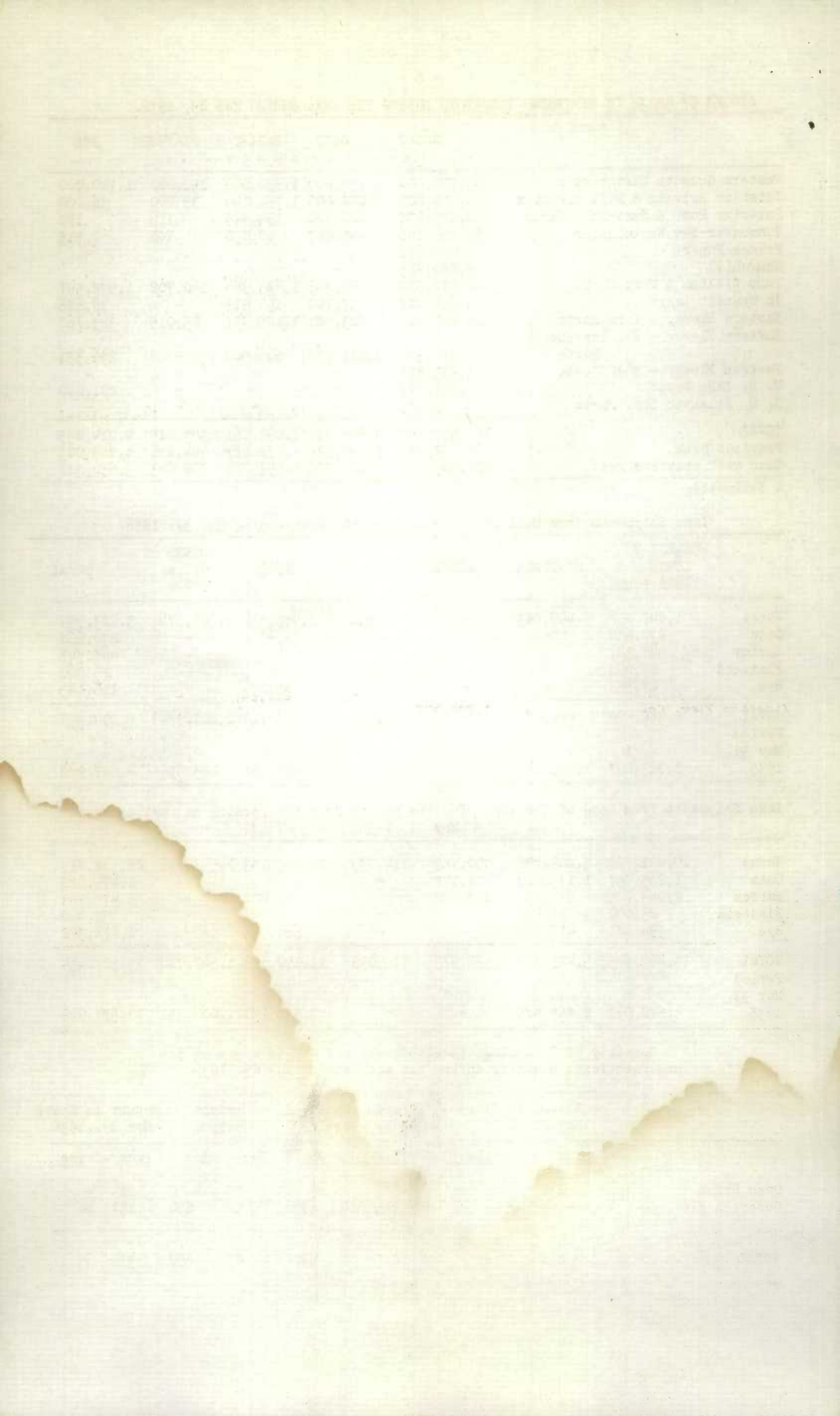

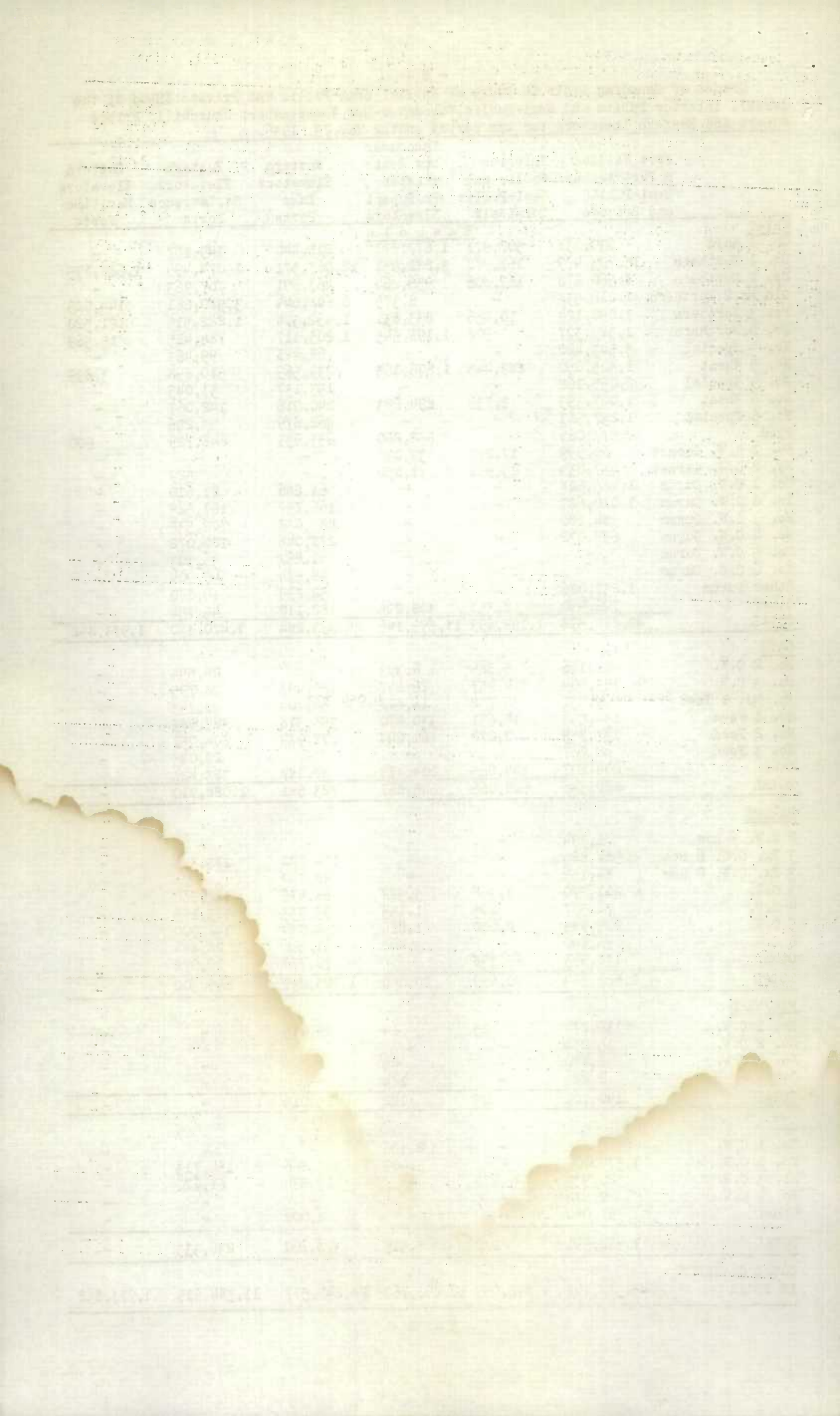
