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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 19, 1936 shows a decrease of 5,833,720 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 50,069,299 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 146,177,479 bushels compared with the revised figure of 152,011,199 bushels for the previous week and 196,246,778 bushels for the week ending June 21, 1935.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 13,473,239 bushels, a net decrease of 1,025,605 bushels from the previous week when 14,503,844 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports:- Duluth 402,115; Buffalo 6,648,000; Erie 1,488,000; New York 404,753; Albany 4,494,000 and Boston 41,371 bushels. The stocks at Duluth increased 24,550; New York 96,845 and Albany 23,000 bushels over those of the previous week. Buffalo stocks decreased 1,170,000 bushels from the previous week's total. No change is reported at Erie and Boston.

For the same week a year ago Canadian wheat in the United States positions amounted to 9,334,726 bushels distributed as follows:- Duluth 674,343; Buffalo 3,911,554; Erie 455,000; New York 1,230,829; Albany 2,639,000; New Orleans 59,000 and Galveston 365,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending June 19, amounted to 132,699,240 bushels, compared with 137,503,353 bushels a week ago and 186,912,052 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators decreased 2,438,259 bushels in the Western Division from those of a week ago, the most outstanding decreases took place at the Western Country Elevators, Head of the Lakes and Pacific Coast elevators. In the Eastern Division a net decrease is registered of 1,665,243 bushels. A small decrease is also noted in the "In Transit" wheat on the lakes of 703,608 bushels from these a week ago while rail "In Transit" increased 1,249,300 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 2,460,922 bushels compared with 3,164,530 bushels for the previous week and 799,592 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 5,823,491 bushels of wheat in rail transit at June 19, 1936 not included in the visible because no comparable figures for 1935 or previous years were secured.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, for the week ending June 19, 1936 nor for the corresponding date a year ago.

LAKE SHIPMENTS

Lake shipments from the Head of the Lakes for the week ending June 21, 1936 amounted to 1,512,903 bushels compared with 2,457,838 bushels for the previous week and 855,669 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. During the period from the opening of navigation (May 7 to June 21, 1936) 33,463,513 bushels were shipped of which 18,090,231 bushels went to Canadian lower lake including Montreal and Sorel: 14,796,006 bushels to Buffalo and other United States ports and 577,276 bushels to the United Kingdom and Continental countries direct from the Head of the Lakes. The distribution of shipments for the corresponding date a year ago were as follows: To Canadian lower ports 651,869 bushels and 195,000 bushels to Buffalo.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 12, amounted to 2,550,504 bushels, an increase of 143,214 bushels over the previous week when 2,407,290 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 2,701,486 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending June 12, were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 137,782 (280,643); Saskatchewan 1,721,909 (1,197,186); Alberta 690,813 (1,223,657) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to June 12, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 17,224,166 (30,175,326) Saskatchewan 112,235,328 (93,349,446); Alberta 78,637,086 (88,282,476) bushels. For the forty-five weeks ending June 12, 1936 and June 14, 1935, 208,096,580 and 211,807,248 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending June 19, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,731,699 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 580,000 bushels. The total is 4,311,699 bushels as compared with 6,034,852 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,723,153 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 2,114,074 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending June 20, 1936 amounted to 7,461,000 bushels compared with 9,760,000 bushels, for the previous week and 7,464,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Argentina showed decreases of 2,139,000 and 746,000 bushels respectively while Australia showed an increase of 613,000 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 19, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 19, 1936 show a decrease of 6,500,750 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 146,177,479, oats 7,965,815, barley 6,129,959, flaxseed 326,882 and rye 3,764,330 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 5,833,720, oats 61,477, barley 425,744, flaxseed 7,624 and rye 172,185 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 196,246,778, oats 6,042,506, barley 5,432,265, flaxseed 312,536 and rye 3,474,944 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,540,800 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,339,956, oats 133,745, barley 68,109 and rye 201 bushels while flaxseed increased 1,211 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 32,150 bushels. Wheat and barley show decreases of 9,918 and 35,926 bushels respectively while oats increased 13,694 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 467,133 bushels made up as follows: wheat 380,112, oats 84,768 and barley 2,253 bushels.
