WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 26, 1936 shows a decrease of 4,235,452 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 55,392,861 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 141,791,110 bushels compared with the revised figure of 146,026,562 bushels for the previous week and 197,183,971 bushels for the week ending June 28, 1935.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 15,611,872 bushels, a net increase of 2,133,633 bushels over the previous week when 13,478,239 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 399,562; Buffalo 7,612,000; Erie 1,998,000; New York 793,939; Albany 4,767,000 and Boston 41,371 bushels. The stocks at Buffalo increased 964,000; Erie 510,000; New York 389,186 and Albany 273,000 bushels over those of the previous week. Duluth stocks decreased 2,553 bushels from the previous week's total. Boston Canadian wheat in store remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago Canadian wheat in the United States positions amounted to 9,279,209 bushels distributed as follows:-- Duluth 668,641; Buffalo 3,981,685; Erie 455,000; New York 1,233,883; Albany 2,595,000; New Orleans 54,000 and Galveston 291,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending June 26, amounted to 126,179,238 bushels, compared with 132,548,323 bushels a week ago and 186,904,762 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators shows a net decrease of 3,507,224 bushels in the Western Division from those of a week ago. The largest reduction amounting to 2,018,363 bushels was shown at the Head of the Lakes. Smaller decreases were noted at country elevators, Pacific ports and Interior Public and Semi-Public Elevators, while a small increase is registered at the Interior Private and mill elevators. In the Eastern Division a decrease is noted of 2,470,286 bushels a small decrease is also stated in the "In Transit" on the lakes while an increase is given the rail In Transit wheat.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 2,069,347 bushels compared with 2,460,922 bushels for the previous week and 1,525,644 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 7,150,369 bushels of wheat in rail transit at June 26, 1936 not included in the visible because no comparable figures for 1935 or previous years were secured.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, for the week ending June 26, 1936 nor for the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 19, amounted to 1,662,894 bushels, a decrease of 887,610 bushels from the previous week when 2,550,504 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,704,259 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending June 19, were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 86,094 (183,338); Saskatchewan 896,750 (907,771); Alberta 680,050 (613,150) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to June 19, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 17,310,260 (30,358,664); Saskatchewan 113,132,078 (94,257,217); Alberta 79,317,136 (88,895,626) bushels. For the forty-six weeks ending June 19, 1936, and June 21, 1935, 209,759,474 and 213,511,507 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending June 26, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,755,758 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,365,000 bushels. The total is 6,120,758 bushels as compared with 4,311,699 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,809,059 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 4,065,845 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending June 27, 1936 amounted to 7,764,000 bushels compared with 7,461,000 bushels, for the previous week and 9,584,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Argentina showed increases of 359,000 and 1,111,000 bushels respectively while Australia showed a decrease of 1,281,000 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 26, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 26, 1936 show a net decrease of 4,939,146 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 141,791,110, oats 7,435,738, barley 5,980,111, flaxseed 334,463 and rye 3,534,667 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 4,235,452, oats 447,354, barley 61,935 and rye 204,504 bushels while flaxseed increased 10,099 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 197,183,971, oats 5,772,247, barley 5,268,928, flaxseed 288,975 and rye 3,432,212 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 1,235,791 bushels composed of wheat 905,897, oats 198,961, barley 123,903, flaxseed 490 and rye 6,540 bushels.

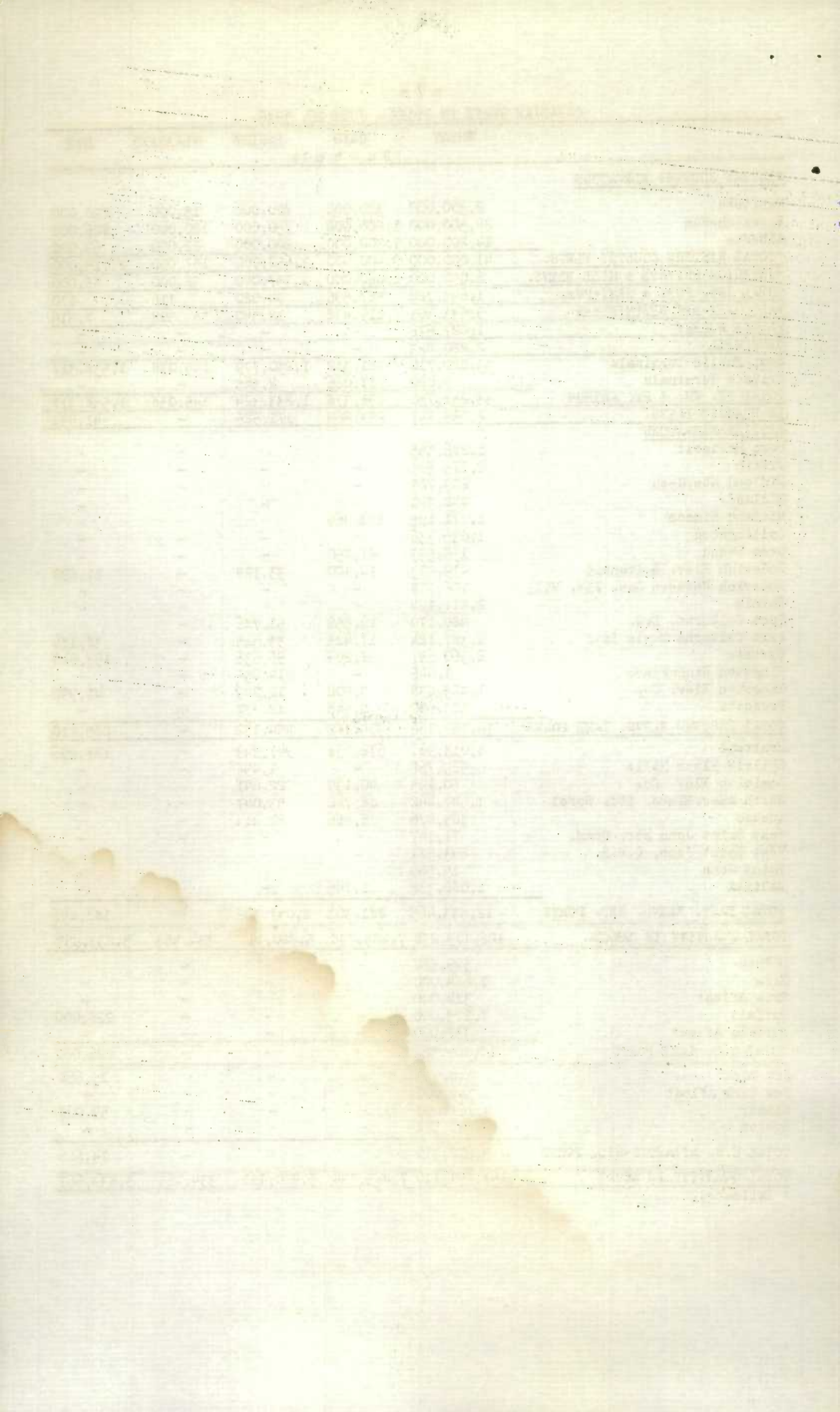
