WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 3, 1936 shows a decrease of 5,819,785 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 61,350,506 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 135,525,171 bushels compared with the revised figure of 141,344,956 bushels for the previous week and 196,875,677 bushels for the week ending July 5, 1935.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 15,287,480 bushels, a net decrease of 324,392 bushels from the previous week when 15,611,872 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 481,240; Buffalo 7,446,000; Erie 1,803,000; New York 748,869; Albany 4,767,000 and Boston 41,371 bushels. The stocks at Buffalo decreased 166,000; Erie 195,000 and New York 45,070 bushels, while Duluth increased 81,678 bushels. Albany and Boston remain unchanged.

For the same week a year ago Canadian wheat in the United States positions amounted to 9,448,727 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 6,558,013; Erie 1,615,000; New York 1,048,529; Albany 141,000 and Duluth 86,185 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending July 3, amounted to 120,237,691 bushels, compared with 125,733,084 bushels a week ago and 188,262,231 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators show a net decrease of 2,952,700 bushels from those a week ago in the Western Division. Large decreases amounting to 1,784,814 and 1,249,822 bushels are noted at the Country Elevators and Head-of-the-Lakes, while a small reduction of 98,729 bushels is shown at the Interior Public and Semi-Public Elevators. Small increases took place at Interior Public and Mill Elevators and Vancouver.

In the Eastern Division the lake ports show a reduction of 1,419,824 bushels from those a week ago while a slight increase of 71,182 bushels is noted at the Seaboard Elevators. The "In Transit" wheat on the lakes amounted to only 875,296 bushels which is a large reduction from the previous week when the "In Transit" by rail increased from 7,150,369 to 8,846,410 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 875,296 bushels compared with 2,069,347 bushels for the previous week and 1,118,689 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 8,846,410 bushels of wheat in rail transit at July 3, 1936 not included in the visible because no comparable figures for 1935 or previous years were secured.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, for the week ending July 3, 1936 nor for the corresponding date a year ago.

LAKE SHIPMENTS

For the period from June 21 to June 30 the vessel movement amount to 4,875,853 bushels distributed as follows: To Canadian lower lake ports 778,707 bushels; To Montreal 250,581; To Buffalo 3,126,087 bushels; other United States ports 667,978 bushels and 52,500 bushels to Europe direct.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 26, amounted to 1,654,909 bushels, a small decrease of 7,985 bushels from the previous week when 1,662,894 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 2,470,370 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending June 26 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 110,852 (347,329); Saskatchewan 854,791 (1,235,077); Alberta 689,266 (887,964). Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to June 26, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 17,421,112 (30,705,993); Saskatchewan 113,986,869 (95,492,294); Alberta 80,006,402 (89,783,590) bushels. For the forty-seven weeks ending June 26, 1936, and June 21, 1935, 211,414,383 and 215,981,877 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending July 3, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,192,222 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 830,000 bushels. The total is 4,022,222 bushels as compared with 6,120,758 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 2,098,536 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 2,404,719 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending July 4, 1936 amounted to 7,449,000 bushels compared with 7,764,000 bushels, for the previous week and 6,912,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Argentina showed decreases of 665,000 and 372,000 bushels respectively while Australia showed a decrease of 60,000 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 3, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 3, 1936 show a net decrease of 6,145,862 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 135,525,171, oats 7,225,107, barley 5,769,968 flaxseed 327,562 and rye 3,512,917 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 5,819,785 oats 167,727, barley 173,829, and flaxseed 2,977 bushels while rye increased 18,456 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 196,875,677, oats 5,444,754, barley 4,872,029, flaxseed 296,282 and rye 3,295,547 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 2,100,622 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,784,814, oats 299,488, barley 16,062 and flaxseed 6,031 bushels while rye increased 5,773 bushels.

DULUTH.- Receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth by rail for the week ending July 3, 1936 were nil. For the period August 1, 1935 to date rail receipts amounted to wheat 140,366 bushels.

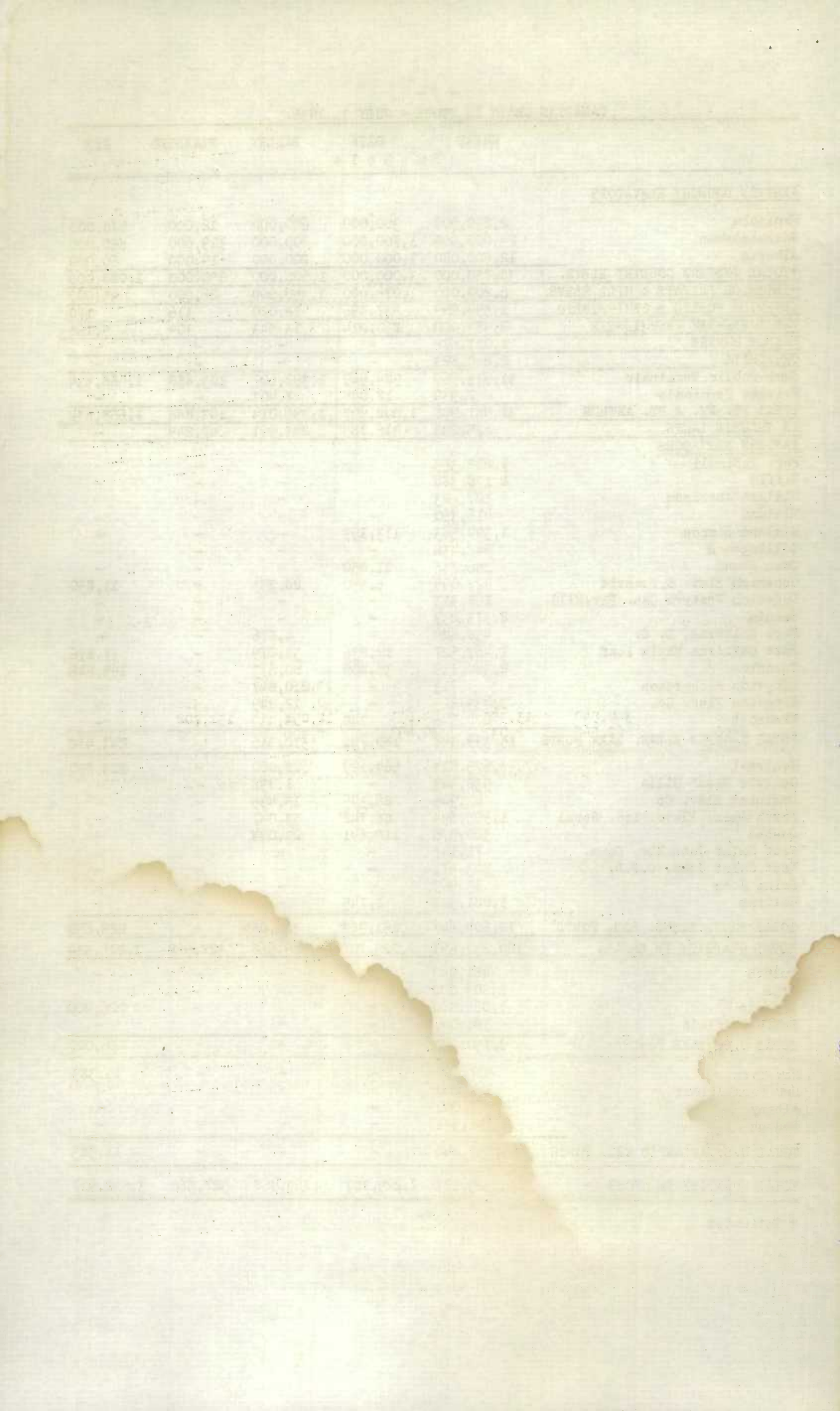

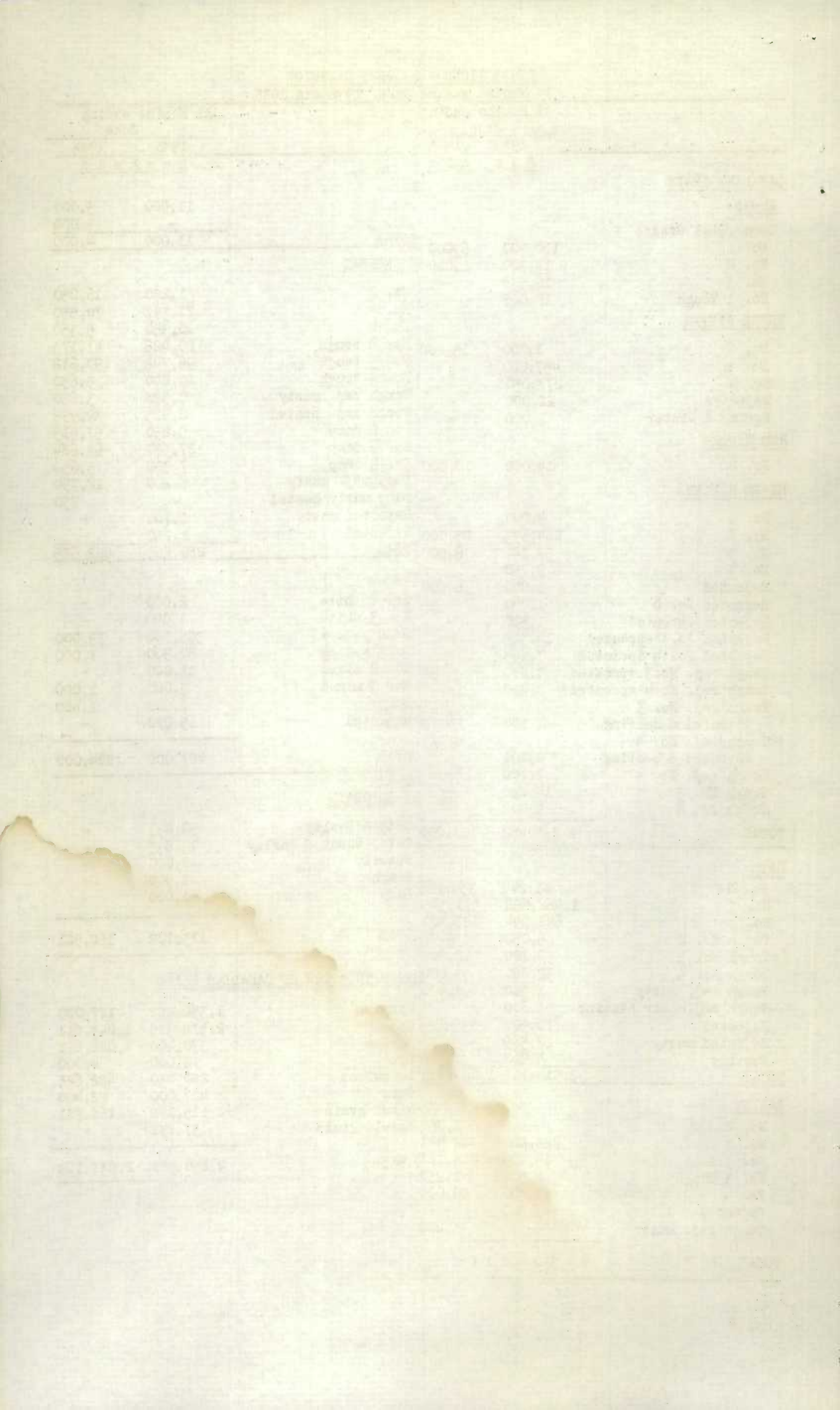
