WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 10, 1936 shows a decrease of 3,253,746 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 61,900,637 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 131,679,170 bushels compared with the revised figure of 134,932,916 bushels for the previous week and 193,579,807 bushels for the week ending July 12, 1935.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 16,715,511 bushels a net decrease of 1,428,031 bushels over the previous week when 15,287,480 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 427,741; Buffalo 8,823,000; Albany 4,677,000; Erie 1,888,000; New York 853,399; and Boston 41,371 bushels. The stocks at New York increased 109,530; Erie 85,000; and Buffalo 1,377,000 bushels while Duluth and Albany decreased 53,499 and 90,000 bushels respectively, from those of a week ago. Boston stocks remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,265,689 bushels, distributed as follows: Buffalo 3,381,040; New York 835,008; Albany 2,595,000; Erie 344,000; Duluth 668,641; Galveston 345,000 and New Orleans 47,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending July 10 amounted to 114,963,659 bushels compared with 119,645,436 bushels a week ago and 185,314,117 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks at the Canadian elevators are located at the following ports: Country elevators 35,600,000; Interior elevators, western division 7,515,909; Pacific coast elevators 10,646,392; Churchill 2,280,823; Head of the lakes 30,198,898; Eastern elevators, lake ports and seaboard ports 14,573,817 and 12,555,251, respectively while 1,592,569 bushels were in transit on the lakes.


Decreases are shown in all the stocks in the western division with exception of the Pacific coast elevators which increased 35,716 bushels over the previous week's total. The decreases were as follows: western country elevators 2,580,249; Head of the lakes 1,783,010; Interior elevators 256,586 bushels. Wheat in transit on the lakes increased 717,273 bushels over those of a week ago, while eastern elevators decreased 814,921 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 1,592,569 bushels compared with 875,296 bushels for the previous week and 1,468,036 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 8,854,613 bushels of wheat in rail transit at July 10, 1936 not included in the visible because no comparable figures for 1935 or previous years were secured.

There is no United States wheat in store in Canada, for the week ending July 10, 1936 nor for the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 3, amounted to 1,751,642 bushels, a small increase of 96,733 bushels from the previous week when 1,654,909 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 2,731,733 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending July 3 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba (-) 281,926 (258,453); Saskatchewan 2,001,669 (1,344,934); Alberta 31,899 (1,128,346); Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to July 3, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 17,139,186 (30,964,446); Saskatchewan 115,988,538 (96,837,228); Alberta 80,038,301 (90,911,936) bushels. For the forty-eight weeks ending July 3, 1936, and July 5, 1935, 213,166,025 and 218,713,610 bushels were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending July 10, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,236,333 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,726,000 bushels. The total is 4,962,333 bushels as compared with 4,022,222 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 940,111 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 3,592,094 bushels.





World shipments for the week ending July 11, 1936 amounted to 7,951,000 bushels compared with 7,449,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,448,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia showed increases of 706,000 and 350,000 bushels respectively while Argentina showed a decrease of 78,000 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 10, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 10, 1936 show a net decrease of 3,104,145 bushels compared with the revised figure of previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 131,679,170, oats 7,598,335, barley 5,683,793, flaxseed 299,668 and rye 3,551,861 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,253,746, barley 70,778 and flaxseed 25,309 bushels, while oats and rye increased 194,799 and 50,889 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 193,579,807, oats 4,776,521, barley 4,458,518, flaxseed 304,760 and rye 3,050,105 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 2,862,409 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,580,249, oats 218,628, barley 62,303 and flaxseed 16,865 bushels while rye increased 15,636 bushels.



INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 184,071 bushels, composed of wheat 179,090, oats 2,200 and barley 2,781 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 68,159 bushels, composed of wheat 35,716, oats 30,295 and barley 2,148 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,889,185 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,783,010, barley 185,748 and rye 89,869 bushels while oats and flaxseed increased 153,630 and 15,812 bushels respectively.


