WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 31, 1936 shows a decrease of 1,025,778 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 78,212,742 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 118,771,623 bushels compared with the revised figure of 119,797,401 bushels for the previous week and 196,984,365 bushels for the week ending July 31, 1935.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,277,230 bushels, a net increase of 1,378,686 bushels over the previous week when 17,898,544 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 3,903,175; Erie 1,888,000; Buffalo 8,174,000; New York 922,055; Albany 4,290,000 and Chicago 100,000 bushels. The stocks at Duluth increased 1,527,103 bushels over those of a week ago, while decreases were shown at New York of 123,417; Chicago 20,000 and Buffalo 5,000 bushels. Stocks at Erie and Albany remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 10,508,498 bushels, distributed as follows: Buffalo 7,891,456; Albany 1,467,000; New York 629,345; Duluth 470,697; Erie 27,000 and New Orleans 23,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending July 31, amounted to 99,494,393 bushels compared with 101,898,857 bushels a week ago and 186,475,867 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 31,150,000; Interior elevators, Western division 6,146,908; Pacific coast elevators 8,983,614; Churchill 2,478,744; Head of the Lakes 25,524,495; and Eastern elevators Lake and seaboard ports 10,929,360 and 11,439,021 bushels respectively while 2,842,251 bushels were in transit on the lakes.

Decreases are shown in all the wheat stocks in the western division with the exception of the Country and Churchill elevators. The former owing to the receipts of new crop wheat from the farms increased 323,032 bushels over those of a week ago while Churchill increased 44,542 bushels. The decreases were as follows: Head of the lakes 2,123,670; Interior elevators 548,095; Vancouver-New Westminster 488,996 bushels and Eastern elevators 1,510,715 bushels. Wheat in transit on the lakes increased 1,899,438 bushels over those a week ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 2,842,251 bushels compared with 992,813 bushels for the previous week and 5,959,571 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 2,456,566 bushels of wheat in rail transit at July 31, 1936 not included in the visible because no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 24, amounted to 483,167 bushels, a little over half the amount of the previous week when 849,032 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,942,017 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending July 24 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 26,096 (131,691); Saskatchewan 277,609 (1,029,406); Alberta 179,462 (780,920) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to July 24, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935, were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 17,295,225 (31,321,743); Saskatchewan 117,253,174 (102,006,612); Alberta 80,823,955 (93,804,414) bushels. For the fifty-one weeks ending July 24, 1936 and July 26, 1935, 215,372,354 and 227,132,769 bushels were received from the farms.

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

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OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending July 31, 1936 , the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,102,657 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,184,000 bushels. The total is 5,286,657 bushels as compared with 4,455,640 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 831,017 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 4,032,790 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 31, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 31, 1936 show a net decrease of 647,732 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 118,771,623; oats 7,963,955, barley 5,596,094; flaxseed 289,146 and rye 3,191,735 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,025,778 and rye 327,022 bushels, while increases were shown in oats of 459,302, barley 244,171 and flaxseed 1,595 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 196,984,365; oats 5,985,752; barley 3,855,979; flaxseed 282,495 and rye 2,946,190 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net increase of 418,818 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 323,032; oats 100,658 and rye 15,013 bushels while barley and flaxseed decreased 13,042 and 6,843 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 447,031 bushels, composed of wheat 445,326 and oats 1705 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 455,336 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 488,996, barley 2,505 and rye 178 bushels while oats increased 36,343 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat in store shows an increase of 44,542 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,793,030 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,123,670 and flaxseed 29,350 bushels while increases were shown in oats of 152,571, barley 160,651 and rye 46,768 bushels.
