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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 20 shows an increase of 13,958,389 bushels as compared with the previous week and a decrease of 2,806,636 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 220,862,570 bushels as compared with the revised figure of 206,904 181 bushels for the previous week and 223,669,206 bushels for the week ending September 21, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,802,912 bushels, a net increase of 1,992,135 bushels over the previous week when 17,810,777 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Buffalo 14,307,734; Erie 27,000; New York 664,059; Albany 3,630,000; New Orleans 1,000; Duluth 1,053,119 and Galveston 120,000 bushels. Increased stocks are shown at Albany and New York of 2,231,000 and 145,110 bushels respectively over those of the previous week. Decreases took place in the Canadian wheat in store at Duluth of 135,550; Buffalo 233,425; Galveston 12,000 and New Orleans 3,000 bushels. The stocks at Erie remained the same as for the previous week, namely, 27,000 bushels. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 11,892,232 bushels distributed as follows:- Buffalo 6,122,136; Erie 1,833,000; New York 1,251,659; Duluth 391,437; Albany 2,236,000 and Philadelphia 58,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 5,566,998 bushels compared with 3,360,908 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 13 amounted 17,740,865 bushels an increase of 3,569,226 bushels over the previous week's total when 14,171,639 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 22,565,311 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 13, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 1,756,312 (3,684,369); Saskatchewan 12,056,920 (10,977,625); Alberta 3,927,633 (5,903,317) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1, to September 13 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 5,418,145 (19,108,064); Saskatchewan 25,003,117 (30,996,932); Alberta 11,673,093 (19,560,942) bushels.

For the ~~six~~ weeks ending September 13, 1935 and September 14, 1934, 42,094,355 and 69,665,938 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending September 20, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,911,929 bushels as compared with 2,310,992 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 600,937 and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 490,762 bushels.

The overseas export shipments of 2,911,929 bushels are the largest single week's clearances since the week ending May 31, 1934, while the Montreal movement is the greatest since November 30, 1934.

World shipments for the week ending September 23, 1935 amounted to 9,781,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,398,000 for the previous week and 9,440,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia showed increases of 936,000 bushels and 827,000 bushels respectively while Argentine shipments showed a decrease of 878,000 bushels as compared with the previous week.

During the first eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 64 million bushels as compared with 84 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 20 million bushels as compared with 33 million bushels for the same period in 1934.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat for the first eight weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35 and 1933-34.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 8.0 million bushels per week during the first eight weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.5 and 10.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1934-35 and 1933-34. North American shipments have averaged 2.6 million bushels per week compared with 4.1 and 4.2 million bushels per week during the first eight weeks of 1934-35 and 1933-34. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.5 million bushels per week as compared with 4.0 million bushels per week during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 20, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 20, 1935 show an increase of 15,404,701 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 220,862,570, oats 8,201,822, barley 6,552,398, flaxseed 243,513 and rye 3,742,397 bushels, a total of 239,602,700 bushels. Increases were as follows:- wheat 13,958,389, oats 690,617, barley 646,144, flaxseed 23,435 and rye 86,116 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 223,669,206, oats 11,611,268, barley 13,071,618, flaxseed 521,577 and rye 4,080,452 bushels, a total of 252,954,121 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows an increase of 7,328,230 bushels, composed of wheat 6,691,455, oats 424,981, barley 150,924, flaxseed 20,812 and rye 40,058 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 656,494 bushels. Wheat stocks increased 656,759 bushels while oats and barley decreased 131 and 134 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 408,047 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 406,167, oats 27,158 and flaxseed 28 bushels while decreases are shown in barley and rye of 22,153 and 3,143 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR:- Wheat stocks show a decrease of 585,974 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR):- Grain stocks show a net increase of 2,529,748 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,960,582, oats 319,524, barley 199,629 and rye 77,914 bushels, while flaxseed decreased 28,001 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES:- Grain in transit shows a net increase of 2,259,946 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 2,206,090, barley 280,241 and flaxseed 25,457 bushels while oats and rye decreased 223,116 and 28,726 bushels respectively.
