

WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 27 shows an increase of 11,872,084 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 4,267,919 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 233,312,202 bushels compared with the revised figure of 221,940,118 bushels for the previous week and 223,544,283 bushels for the week ending September 28, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,600,088 bushels, a net increase of 1,797,176 bushels over the previous week when 19,802,912 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 1,006,638, Buffalo 15,436,762, Erie 27,000, New York 424,688, Albany 3,630,000 and Galveston 75,000 bushels. Buffalo shows an increase of 1,129,028 bushels, while decreases are noted at Duluth of 46,431, New York 239,371, New Orleans 1,000 and Galveston 45,000 bushels. Stocks at Erie remain unchanged. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 14,187,141 bushels located as follows: Duluth 377,627, Buffalo 8,665,074, Erie 1,977,000, New York 543,440, Albany 2,236,000 and Philadelphia 38,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 5,256,032 bushels compared with 3,024,772 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 20 amounted to 15,803,272 bushels, an increase of 1,062,407 bushels over the previous week's total when 17,740,865 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 10,771,408 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 20, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 1,104,305 (2,006,072); Saskatchewan 12,121,333 (5,832,731); Alberta 5,577,634 (2,882,605) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to September 20 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 6,522,450 (21,014,136); Saskatchewan 37,124,450 (36,879,663); Alberta 17,250,727 (22,443,547) bushels.

For the seven weeks ending September 20, 1935 and September 21, 1934, 60,897,627 and 80,437,346 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending September 27, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,256,379 bushels as compared with 2,911,929 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 344,450 and when compared with the same week in 1934 an increase of 220,046 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending September 30, 1935, amounted to 8,125,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,781,000 for the previous week and 10,364,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from Argentina and Australia showed decreases of 1,499,000 bushels and 549,000 bushels respectively while North American shipments showed a slight increase as compared with the previous week.

During the first nine weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 72 million bushels as compared with 95 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 24 million bushels as compared with 36 million bushels for the same period in 1934 and Argentine shipments were 21 million bushels as compared with 35 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat for the first nine weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35 and 1933-34.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 8.0 million bushels per week during the first nine weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.6 and 10.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1934-35 and 1933-34. North American shipments have averaged 2.7 million bushels per week compared with 4.0 and 4.2 million bushels per week during the first nine weeks of 1934-35 and 1933-34. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.4 million bushels per week as compared with 5.9 million bushels per week during the same period last year.




