WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 4 shows an increase of 11,477,464 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 15,493,052 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 245,767,417 bushels compared with the revised figure of 234,289,953 bushels for the previous week and 230,274,365 bushels for the week ending October 5, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 21,560,625 bushels, a net increase of 960,537 bushels from the previous week when 20,600,088 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 956,241; Buffalo 16,135,000; Erie 27,000; New York 298,384; Albany 4,077,000 and Galveston 67,000 bushels. Reductions are shown in the stocks of Canadian wheat at all the above ports from those of the previous week with the exception of Buffalo and Albany which show increases of 698,238 and 447,000 bushels respectively. The decreases took place at the following ports: Duluth 50,397; New York 126,304 and Galveston 8,000 bushels. Stocks at Erie remain unchanged. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 14,975,169 bushels located as follows: Duluth 400,470; Buffalo 8,721,481; Erie 1,977,000; New York 892,218; Albany 2,832,000 and Philadelphia 152,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago. Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 5,575,785 bushels compared with 5,256,032 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 27 amounted to 18,048,483 bushels, a slight decrease of 754,789 bushels from the previous week's total when 18,803,272 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 5,308,972 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 27, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 1,459,438 (309,167); Saskatchewan 11,609,883 (3,599,281); Alberta 4,979,162 (1,400,524) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Provinces from August 1, to September 27 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 7,981,888 (21,423,303); Saskatchewan 48,734,333 (40,478,944); Alberta 22,229,889 (23,844,071) bushels. For the eight weeks ending September 27, 1935 and September 28, 1934, 78,946,110 and 85,746,318 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending October 4, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,094,849 bushels as compared with 3,256,379 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 161,530 and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 1,104,265 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending October 7, 1935, amounted to 12,009,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 8,125,000 for the previous week and 12,208,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from Argentina showed an increase of 2,067,000 bushels while North American and Australian shipments showed a only slight increases as compared with the previous week.

During the first ten weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 84 million bushels as compared with 87.5 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 29 million bushels as compared with 39 million bushels for the same period in 1934 and Argentine shipments were 24 million bushels as compared with 38 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat for the first ten weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35 and 1933-34.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 8.4 million bushels per week during the first ten week of the crop year as compared with 9.7 and 10.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1934-35 and 1933-34. North American shipments have averaged 2.9 million bushels per week compared with 3.7 and 4.3 million bushels per week during the first ten weeks of 1934-35 and 1933-34. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.4 million bushels per week as compared with 3.6 million bushels per week during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 4, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 4, 1935 show a net increase of 13,543,248 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 245,767,417, oats 11,144,703, barley 8,603,081, flaxseed 382,935 and rye 3,889,298 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 11,477,464, oats 1,164,683, barley 841,377 and flaxseed 69,722 bushels. While rye decreased 9,998 bushels. At a comparable date last year, stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 230,274,305, oats 12,452,827, barley 14,247,561, flaxseed 499,737, and rye 4,119,600, a total of 261,594,030 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows an increase of 6,700,026 bushels made up as follows: wheat 6,081,914, oats 366,270, barley 150,434, flaxseed 49,930 and rye 51,478 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC & SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show an increase of 574,968 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 565,282, oats 3,911 and barley 5,775 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,210,712 bushels. Wheat and oats show increases of 1,233,822 and 4,456 bushels, respectively, while decreases are noted in barley 66 and rye 27,508 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks decreased 301,191 bushels.

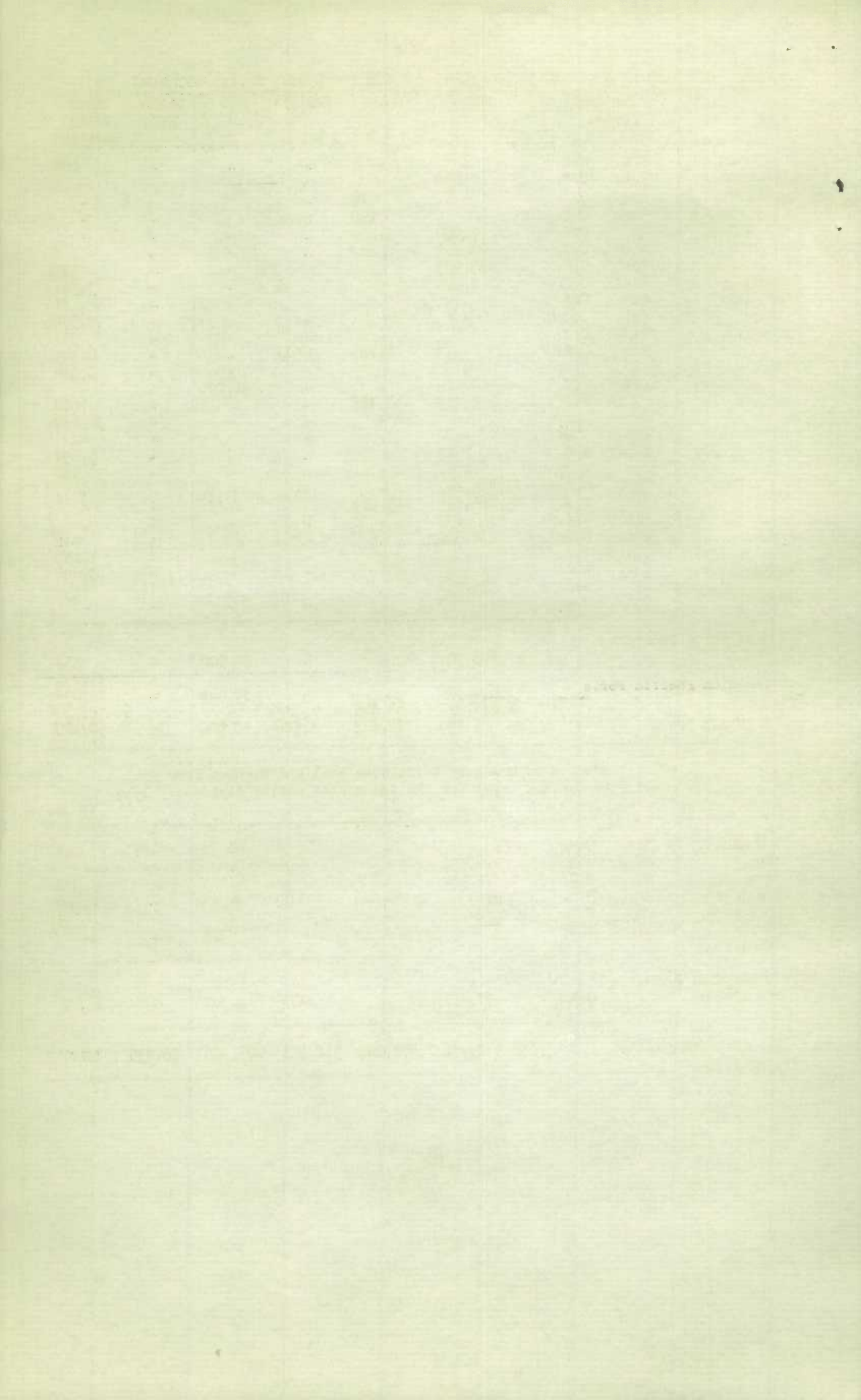
