WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 16 shows an increase of only 1,313,297 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 101,740,789 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply including 9,823,227 bushels in rail transit was reported as 160,695,408 bushels compared with the revised figure of 162,008,705 bushels for the previous week and 262,436,197 bushels for the week ending October 18, 1935. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,995,192 bushels, a net decrease of 23,066 bushels from the previous week when 20,972,126 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 5,721,926; Erie 1,726,000; Buffalo 8,676,000; Chicago 80,000; New York 1,689,200 and Albany 3,079,000 bushels. The increases were as follows: Erie 224,000; Buffalo 173,000 and New York 208,803 bushels. Stock at Duluth decreased 628,869 bushels while those at Chicago and Albany remained unchanged. For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 27,723,124 bushels located as follows: Duluth 1,046,483; Buffalo 20,069,873; Erie 1,748,000; New York 652,768; Albany 4,139,000 and Galveston 67,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending October 16 amounted to 139,723,282 bushels compared with 141,013,513 bushels a week ago and 234,713,073 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 43,000,000; Interior elevators, Western Division 7,055,098; Pacific Coast elevators 9,541,173; Churchill 610,450; Head of the Lakes 35,548,869 and Eastern elevators Lake and Seaboard ports 13,707,948 and 14,783,246 bushels respectively, while 15,476,498 bushels were in transit on lakes and by rail.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in Canada of 1,313,297 bushels when compared with the previous week. The increases were as follows: Interior Private and Mill elevators 41,856; Vancouver 711,059; Prince Rupert 21 and Eastern elevators, Seaboard ports 1,160,698 bushels, while decreases were noted at Country elevators of 1,521,684; Interior Public and Semi-Public elevators 9,071; Head of the Lakes 1,576,187 and Eastern elevators, Lake ports 790,357 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 5,653,271 bushels compared with 5,597,960 bushels for the previous week and 5,422,809 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 9,823,227 bushels of wheat in rail transit at October 16, 1936, included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 9, amounted to 5,448,641 bushels, a decrease of 1,367,602 bushels from the previous week when 6,818,243 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 16,647,313 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending October 9 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 273,585 (610,916); Saskatchewan 2,872,692 (8,038,259); Alberta 2,302,364 (7,998,138) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the ten weeks from August 1 to October 9, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935, were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 16,286,530 (10,477,254); Saskatchewan 63,701,372 (65,470,623); Alberta 26,157,669 (38,159,484) bushels. For the ten weeks ending October 9, 1936 and October 11, 1935, 106,145,571 and 114,107,361 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending October 16, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,468,190 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,353,000 bushels. The total is 3,821,190 bushels as compared with 4,946,013 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,124,823 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, a decrease of 190,922 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 16, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Oct. 16, 1936 show a net decrease of 672,191 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 160,695,408, oats 16,645,742, barley 16,543,916, flaxseed 1,096,691 and rye 2,830,740 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,313,297, oats 43,562 and rye 124,635 bushels while increases were shown in barley and flaxseed of 795,575 and 13,728 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 262,436,197, oats 13,392,300, barley 9,800,218, flaxseed 640,685 and rye 4,287,888 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 1,831,808 bushels composed of wheat 1,521,684, oats 95,108, barley 175,115, flaxseed 14,567 and rye 25,334 bushels.


