WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 30 shows a decrease of only 3,265,344 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 116,752,505 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply including 10,010,729 bushels in rail transit was reported as 153,996,942 bushels compared with the revised figure of 157,262,286 bushels for the previous week and 270,749,447 bushels for the week ending November 1, 1935. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 22,282,432 bushels, a net increase of 1,291,912 bushels over the previous week, when 20,990,550 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 5,582,C50; Erie 1,726,000; Buffalo 9,748,000; Chicago 80,000; New York 2,097,412; Albany 3,048,000 and Philadelphia 1,000 bushels. Increases were shown at Buffalo of 994,000; New York 363,747; and Philadelphia 1,000 bushels, while decreases are noted at Duluth of 35,835 and Albany 31,000 bushels. Stocks at Erie and Chicago remained unchanged. For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 32,049,390 bushels, distributed as follows: Duluth 1,339,793; Buffalo 22,008,000; Erie 2,428,000; New York 1,459,597; Albany 4,639,000 and Galveston 175,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending October 30 amounted to 131,714,480 bushels compared with 136,271,736 bushels for the previous week and 238,700,057 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.


Wheat stocks in Canadian Elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 37,800,000; Interior elevators, Western Division 6,945,142, Pacific Coast elevators 10,355,647, Churchill 614,569, Head of the Lakes 29,267,729, and Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 16,871,795 and 15,557,181 bushels respectively.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in Canada of 3,265,344 bushels compared with the previous week. The decreases were as follows: Country Elevators 1,765,680; Interior Terminals 32,876; Head of Lakes 2,563,961 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard ports 3,902 bushels, while increases are shown in Vancouver-New Westminster elevators of 673,396; Churchill 4,119; and Eastern elevators Lake ports 1,348,266 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 4,291,688 bushels compared with 6,800,782 bushels for the previous week and 5,708,488 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 10,010,729 bushels of wheat in rail transit at October 30, 1936, included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 23 amounted to 4,564,291 bushels, a decrease of 1,906,590 bushels from the previous week when 6,470,881 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 11,657,848 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending October 23 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 155,445 (821,069); Saskatchewan 1,922,998 (6,320,459); Alberta 2,485,848 (4,516,320) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the twelve weeks from August 1 to October 23, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 16,758,840 (12,622,237); Saskatchewan 68,930,598 (78,595,054); Alberta 31,491,305 (47,859,648) bushels. For the twelve weeks ending October 23, 1936, and October 25, 1935, 117,180,743 and 139,076,939 bushels were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending October 30, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,881,158 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,128,000 bushels. The total is 6,009,158 bushels as compared with 4,413,973 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,595,185 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, a decrease of 483,314 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending October 31, 1936, amounted to 11,863,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,413,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,464,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia showed increases of 980,000 and 527,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while Argentine shipments showed a decrease of 889,000 bushels.

During the first thirteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 141 million bushels as compared with 125 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 73 million bushels this year as compared with only 45 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to only 13 million bushels as compared with 30 million bushels for the same period last year.



As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 10.8 million bushels per week during the first thirteen weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9.6 and 10.9 million bushels per woek during the corresponding periods in 1935-36 and 1934-35. North American shipments have averaged 5.6 million bushels per week compared with 3.4 and 4.1 million bushels per week during the first thirteen weeks of 1935-36 and 1934-35. Argentine shipments averaged 1.0 million bushels per week compared with 2.3 million bushels per week during the same period last year and 3.7 million bushels per week during the same weeks in 1934-35.

- 3 -CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 30, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Oct. 30, 1936 show a net decrease of 2,319,991 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 153,996,942, cats 17,438,364, barley 17,426,608, flaxseed 1,068,341 and rye 2,837,834 bushels. Whoat decreased 3,265,344 bushels while increases wero shown in cats of 254,805, barley 538,676, flaxseed 9,348 and rye 142,524 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 270,749,447, cats 13,924,728, barley 10,308,137, flaxseed 794,572 and rye 4,459,186 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,466,921 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,765,680, barley 175,751 and flaxseed 15,021 bushels while oats and rye increased 484,774 and 4,757 bushels respectively.


INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 4,397 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 4,686 and oats 130 bushels while barley increased 419 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 660,340 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 673,396 and barley 970 bushels while oats and rye decreased 8,311 and 5,715 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RIPERT ELEVATOR .- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR .- Wheat in store increased 4,119 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAN AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 2,483,385 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,563,961, oats 360,538 and rye 9,475 bushels while barley and flaxscod increased 419,087 and 31,502 bushels respectively.
