WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 6, shows a decrease of 4,551,257 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 120,208,713 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. This is the fourth week in which reductions have been shown in the Canadian visible supply of wheat. The amount in store including 7,708,887 bushels in rail transit was reported as 148,957,583 bushels compared with the revised figure of 153,508,840 bushels for the previous week and 269,166,296 bushels for the week ending November 7, 1935. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 22,579,157 bushels, a net increase of 296,695 bushels over the previous week, when 22,282,462 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 5,543,022; Erie 2,214,000; Buffalo 9,332,000; Chicago 78,000; New York 2,363,135; Albany 3,048,000; Philadelphia 1,000 bushels. Increases are shown at Erie of 488,000 and New York 265,723 bushels while decreases were noted at Duluth of 39,028; Buffalo 416,000 and Chicago 2,000 bushels. Stocks at Albany and Philadelphia remained unchanged. For the same week in 1935, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 31,891,400 bushols distributed as follows: Duluth 1,305,363; Buffalo 21,529,000; Erie 2,428,000; New York 1,810,037; Albany 4,639,000 and Galveston 180,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending November 6 amounted to 126,378,426 bushels compared with 131,226,378 bushels for the previous week and 237,274,896 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.


Wheat stocks in Canadian Elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 35,750,000; Interior elevators, Western Division 6,777,952; Pacific Coast Elevators 10,697,709; Churchill 614,559; Head of the Lakes 26,516,527 and Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 17,094,286 and 14,464,829 bushels respectively.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in Canadian elevators of 5,010,089 bushels compared with the previous week. The decreases were as follows: Country Elevators 1,697,467; Interior Terminals 31,621, Prince Rupert 242,315, Head of Lakes 2,751,202 and Eastern Elevators seaboard ports 1,092,352 bushels while increases were shown in Vancouver-New Westminster and Eastern Elevators, Lake ports 222,491 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 6,753,667 bushels compared with 4,291,088 bushels for the previous week and 4,491,221 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 7,708,887 bushels of wheat in rail transit at November 6, 1936, included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 30, amounted to 3,413,006 bushels, a decrease of 1,151,285 bushels from the previous week, when 4,564,291 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 7,822,271 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending October 30 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 359,041 (529,324); Saskatchewan 1,576,141 (4,229,196); Alberta 1,477,824 (3,063,751) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirteen weeks from August 1 to October 30, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 17,117,881 (13,151,561); Saskatchewan 70,506,739 (82,824,250); Alberta 32,969,129 (50,923,399) bushels. For the thirteen weeks ending October 30, 1936, and November 2, 1935, 120,593,749 and 146,899,210 bushels were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES


During the week ending November 6, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 5,080,476 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 959,000 bushels. The total is 6,039,476 bushels as compared with 6,009,158 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 30,318 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, a decrease of 809,603 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending November 7, 1936, amounted to 12,307,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 11,863,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,264,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America showed a decrease of 342,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while Argentine and Australian shipments showed increases of 513,000 and 145,000 bushels respectively.


During the first fourteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 153 million bushels as compared with 136 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 79 million bushels this year as compared with only 49 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to only 15 million bushels as compared with 31 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first fourteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36, and 1934-35.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 11.0 million bushels per week during the first fourteen weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9.7 and 11.0 million bushels per week during the corresponding periods in 1935-36 and 1934-35. North American shipments have averaged 5.6 million bushels per week compared with 3.5 and 4.1 million bushels per week during the first fourteen weeks of 1935-36 and 1934-35. Argentine shipments averaged 1.1 million bushels per week compared with 2.2 million bushels during the same period last year and 3.7 million bushels per week during the same weeks in 1934-35.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 6, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Nov. 6, 1936 show a net decrease of 4,671,744 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 148,957,583, oats 17,555,707, barley 17,412,625, flaxseed 1,045,986 and rye 2,740,429 bushels, a total of 187,712,330 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 4,551,257, oats 95,583, and rye 91,253 bushels, while barley and flaxseed show increases of 58,493 and 7,856 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 269,166,296, oats 13,530,543, barley 9,962,206, flaxseed 739,477 and rye 4,513,849 a total of 297,912,371 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,693,547 bushels.

Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,697,467, barley 100,223 and rye 13,993 bushels, while oats, and flaxseed show increases of 116,103 and 2,033 bushels respectively.


INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 20,999 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 17,190 and oats 5,868 bushels, while barley shows an increase of 2,059 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 630,343 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 584,377, oats 55,088, and flaxseed 73 bushels, while barley and rye show decreases of 2,823 and 6,372 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR .- Wheat stocks show a decrease of 242,315 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR .- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 3,033,900 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 2,751,202, oats 194,561, barley 31,557, and rye 99,832 bushels, while flaxseed shows an increase of 43,252 bushels.


