WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 13, shows a decrease of 5,649,239 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 125,117,556 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. This is the fifth week in which reductions have been shown in the Canadian visible supply of wheat. The amount in store including 8,399,502 bushels in rail transit was reported as 142,576,787 bushels compared with the revised figure of 148,226,026 bushels for the previous week and 267,694,343 bushels for the week ending November 1935. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 23,878,349 bushels, a net increase of 1,299,192 bushels over the previous week, when 22,579,157 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 5,562,520; Erie 2,462,000; Buffalo 9,961,000; Chicago 133,000; New York 2,711,829 and Albany 3,048,000 bushels. Increases are shown at all the above ports with the exception of Albany which remained unchanged. The increases were as follows: Duluth 19,498; Erie 248,000; Buffalo 629,000; Chicago 55,000; New York 348,694 bushels. The stocks at Philadelphia were reduced 1,000 bushels. For the same week in 1935, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 32,714,122 bushels, distributed as follows: Duluth 1,131,917; Buffalo 22,432,000; Erie 2,428,000; New York 1,914,205; Albany 4,639,000 and Galveston 169,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending November 13 amounted to 118,698,438 bushels compared with 125,646,869 bushels for the previous week and 234,980,221 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian Elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 32,500,000; Interior elevators, Western Division 6,577,617; Pacific Coast Elevators 10,531,236; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 24,272,787 and Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 18,466,528 and 13,805,433 bushels respectively.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in Canadian elevators of 6,948,431 bushels compared with the previous week. The decreases were as follows: Country Elevators 2,719,320; Prince Rupert 308,747, Head of Lakes 2,243,740 and Eastern Elevators seaboard ports 659,396 bushels while increases were shown in Vancouver-New Westminster 142,274, Interior Terminals 542, and Eastern Elevators, Lake ports 1,372,242 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 3,530,766 bushels compared with 6,753,667 bushels for the previous week and 4,801,873 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 8,399,502 bushels of wheat in rail transit at November 13, 1936, included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 6, amounted to 2,923,530 bushels, a decrease of 489,476 bushels from the previous week, when 3,413,006 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 4,886,606 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending November 6 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 251,777 (465,719); Saskatchewan 1,358,388 (2,746,186); Alberta 1,313,365 (1,674,701) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the fourteen weeks from August 1 to November 6, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 17,369,658 (13,617,280); Saskatchewan 71,865,127 (85,570,436); Alberta 34,282,494 (52,598,100) bushels. For the fourteen weeks ending November 6, 1936, and November 9, 1935, 123,517,279 and 151,785,816 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending November 13, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,737,994 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 740,000 bushels. The total is 5,477,994 bushels as compared with 6,039,476 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 561,572 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, a decrease of 1,846,784 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 13, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Nov. 13, 1936 show a net decrease of 6,611,263 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 142,576,787, oats 17,182,562, barley 16,882,550, flaxseed 10,639 and rye 2,506,845 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 5,649,239, oats 346,965, barley 444,752 and rye 197,904 bushels while flaxseed increased 27,597 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 267,694,343, oats 13,365,025, barley 9,762,736, flaxseed 710,089 and rye 4,527,294 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 2,911,780 bushels, composed of wheat 2,719,320, oats 84,974, barley 100,403, flaxseed 2,665 and rye 4,418 bushels.

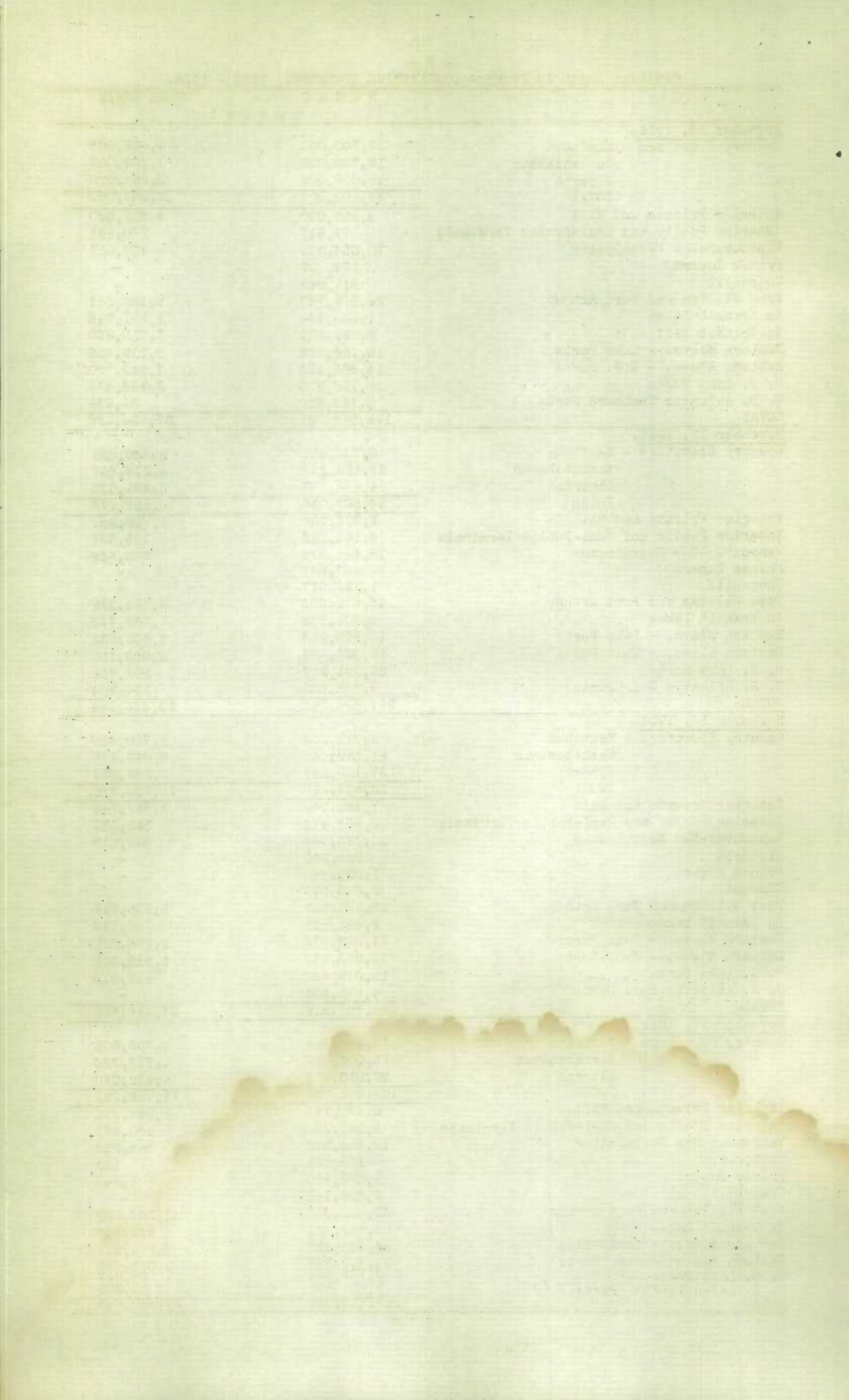
