WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 20, shows a decrease of 6,545,447 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 129,161,366 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. This is the sixth week in which reductions have been shown in the Canadian visible supply of wheat. The amount in store including 6,927,641 bushels in rail transit was reported as 135,925,525 bushels compared with the revised figure of 142,489,972 bushels for the previous week and 265,086,891 bushels for the week ending November 22, 1935. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,127,624 bushels, a net increase of 249,275 bushels over the previous week, when 23,878,349 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 5,287,795; Erie 2,462,000; Buffalo 10,282,000; Chicago 122,000; New York 2,925,829; and Albany 3,048,000 bushels. Increases are shown in the stocks at Buffalo and New York of 321,000 and 214,000 bushels respectively, while decreases were noted at Duluth of 274,725 and Chicago 11,000 bushels. The quantities in store at Erie and Albany remained unchanged. For the same week in 1935, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 30,412,726 bushels, distributed as follows: Duluth 1,070,734; Buffalo 19,846,000; Erie 2,428,000; New York 1,812,992; Albany 5,087,000 and Galveston 168,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending November 20 amounted to 111,797,901 bushels compared with 118,611,623 bushels for the previous week and 234,674,165 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian Elevators are located at the following points: Country Elevators 30,750,000; Interior Elevators, Western Division 6,076,408; Pacific Coast Elevators 10,600,339; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 21,911,139; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard ports 18,689,052 and 12,428,306 bushels respectively.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in the Canadian elevators of 5,611,542 bushels from the previous week. The decreases were as follows: Country Elevators 1,930,315; Interior Elevators 234,079; Vancouver 74,455; Head of the Lakes 2,361,648; Eastern Elevators, Seaboard ports 1,377,127 bushels. Increases were noted at Prince Rupert of 143,558 and Eastern Elevators, Lake Ports 222,524 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 3,800,447 bushels compared with 3,530,766 bushels for the previous week and 3,938,329 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 6,927,641 bushels of wheat in rail transit at November 20, 1936 included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 13, amounted to 2,013,540 bushels, a decrease of 909,990 bushels from the previous week, when 2,923,530 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 3,727,945 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending November 13 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 153,970 (415,321) Saskatchewan 792,552 (1,654,728); Alberta 1,067,018 (1,657,896) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifteen weeks from August 1 to November 13, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935, were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 17,523,628 (14,032,601); Saskatchewan 72,657,679 (87,225,164); Alberta 35,349,512 (54,255,996) bushels. For the fifteen weeks ending November 13, 1936, and November 16, 1935, 125,530,819 and 155,513,761 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending November 20, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 5,484,506 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 981,000 bushels. The total is 6,465,506 bushels as compared with 5,477,994 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 987,512 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 1,377,023 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending November 21, 1936, amounted to 9,442,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,533,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,488,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America showed a decrease of 1,209,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while Argentine and Australian shipments also showed decreases of 254,000 and 676,000 bushels respectively.

During the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 176 million bushels as compared with 156 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 91 million bushels this year as compared with only 59 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to only 17 million bushels as compared with 34 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36, and 1934-35.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 11.0 million bushels per week during the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9.8 and 10.9 million bushels per week during the corresponding periods in 1935-36 and 1934-35. North American shipments have averaged 5.7 million bushels per week compared with 3.7 and 4.0 million bushels per week during the first sixteen weeks of 1935-36 and 1934-35. Argentine shipments averaged 1.1 million bushels per week compared with 2.1 million bushels during the same period last year and 3.8 million bushels per week during the same weeks in 1934-35.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 20, 1936

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Nov. 20, 1936 show a net decrease of 7,290,207 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 135,925,525, oats 16,996,385, barley 16,366,122, flaxseed 1,110,216 and rye 2,238,867 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 6,564,447, oats 135,141, barley 376,068 and rye 249,771 bushels while flaxseed increased 35,220 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 265,086,891, oats 12,776,547, barley 9,494,583, flaxseed 672,860, and rye 4,586,136 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 2,449,759 bushels composed of wheat 1,930,315, oats 358,433, barley 125,908, flaxseed 11,132 and rye 23,971 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 32,491 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,209, barley 36,545, flaxseed 28, and rye 162 bushels while oats increased 4,453 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 121,977 bushels, composed of wheat 74,455, oats 45,808, barley 1,673 and flaxseed 41 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 143,558 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a decrease of 3,416,006 bushels, composed of wheat 2,361,648, oats 373,325, barley 500,168, flaxseed 25,448 and rye 155,417 bushels.
