WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 27, shows a decrease of 7,591,243 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 137,957,063 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. This is the seventh week in which reductions have been shown in the Canadian visible supply of wheat. The amount in store including 4,719,265 bushels in rail transit was reported as 127,866,043 bushels compared with the revised figure of 135,457,286 bushels for the previous week and 265,823,106 bushels for the week ending November 29, 1935. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 23,952,666 bushels, a net decrease of 174,958 bushels over the previous week, when 24,127,624 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 5,064,991; Erie 2,462,000; Buffalo 10,652,000; Chicago 247,000; New York 2,478,675; and Albany 3,048,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the stocks at Duluth and New York of 222,804 and 447,154 bushels respectively, while increases were noted at Buffalo of 370,000 and Chicago 125,000 bushels. The quantities in store at Erie and Albany remained unchanged. For the same week in 1935, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 32,845,721 bushels, distributed as follows: Duluth 1,056,979; Buffalo 21,309,000; Erie 2,402,000; New York 2,192,022; Albany 5,087,000; Galveston 213,000; Boston 64,720; Philadelphia 304,000 and Baltimore 217,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending November 27, amounted to 103,913,377 bushels compared with 111,797,901 bushels for the previous week and 232,977,385 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian Elevators are located at the following points: Country Elevators 35,100,000; Interior Elevators, Western Division, 5,975,719; Pacific Coast Elevators 11,488,166; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 17,965,138; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard ports 17,982,635 and 10,697,627 bushels respectively.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in the Canadian elevators of 7,884,524 bushels from the previous week. Decreases were as follows: Country Elevators 1,145,372; Interior Elevators 36,078; Head of the Lakes 3,946,001; Eastern Elevators, Lake Ports 706,417 and Seaboard Ports 1,730,679 bushels, while Pacific Coast elevators show an increase of 887,827 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 5,270,258 bushels compared with 3,800,447 bushels for the previous week and 4,591,582 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 4,719,265 bushels of wheat in rail transit at November 27, 1936 included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 20, 1936, amounted to 2,481,964 bushels, an increase of 468,424 bushels over the previous week when 2,013,540 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 5,614,641 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending November 20, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 186,249 (236,945); Saskatchewan 1,040,877 (2,401,015); Alberta 1,254,838 (2,976,581) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the sixteen weeks from August 1 to November 20, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935, were as follows figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 17,709,877 (14,269,546); Saskatchewan 73,698,556 (89,626,179); Alberta 36,604,350 (57,232,677) bushels. For the sixteen weeks ending November 20, 1936, and November 22, 1935, 128,012,783 and 161,128,402 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending November 27, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,779,897 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 879,000 bushels. The total is 5,658,897 bushels as compared with 6,465,506 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 806,609 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 1,574,886 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending November 28, 1936, amounted to 11,209,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,442,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,144,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia showed increases of 1,086,000 bushels and 171,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while Argentine shipments showed a decrease of 106,000 bushels.

During the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 187 million bushels as compared with 167 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 98 million bushels this year as compared with only 65 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to only 18 million bushels as compared with 35 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36, and 1934-35.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 11.0 million bushels per week during the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9.8 and 10.9 million bushels per week during the corresponding periods in 1935-36 and 1934-35. North American shipments have averaged 5.7 million bushels per week compared with 3.8 and 4.0 million bushels per week during the first seventeen weeks of 1935-36 and 1934-35. Argentine shipments averaged 1.1 million bushels per week compared with 2.0 million bushels during the same period last year and 3.7 million bushels per week during the same weeks in 1934-35.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 27, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 27, 1936 show a net decrease of 9,549,120 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 127,866,043, oats 15,993,289, barley 15,200,241, flaxseed 996,593 and rye 2,270,601 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 7,591,243, oats 863,014, barley 1,035,101 and flaxseed 101,023 bushels while rye increased 41,261 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 265,823,106, oats 12,485,016, barley 9,054,283, flaxseed 626,489 and rye 4,585,274 bushels. WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 1,554,746 bushels composed of wheat 1,145,372, oats 246,884, barley 154,476, flaxseed 2,549 and rye 5,465 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 9,907 bushels. Oats increased 24,665 bushels while wheat and barley decreased 689 and 14,069 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 767,775 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 883,174 and barley 1,327 bushels while oats decreased 116,726 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 4,653 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- A decrease is shown in grain stocks of 4,840,606 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,946,001, oats 31,113, barley 868,258 and flaxseed 24,631 bushels while rye decreased 29,397 bushels.

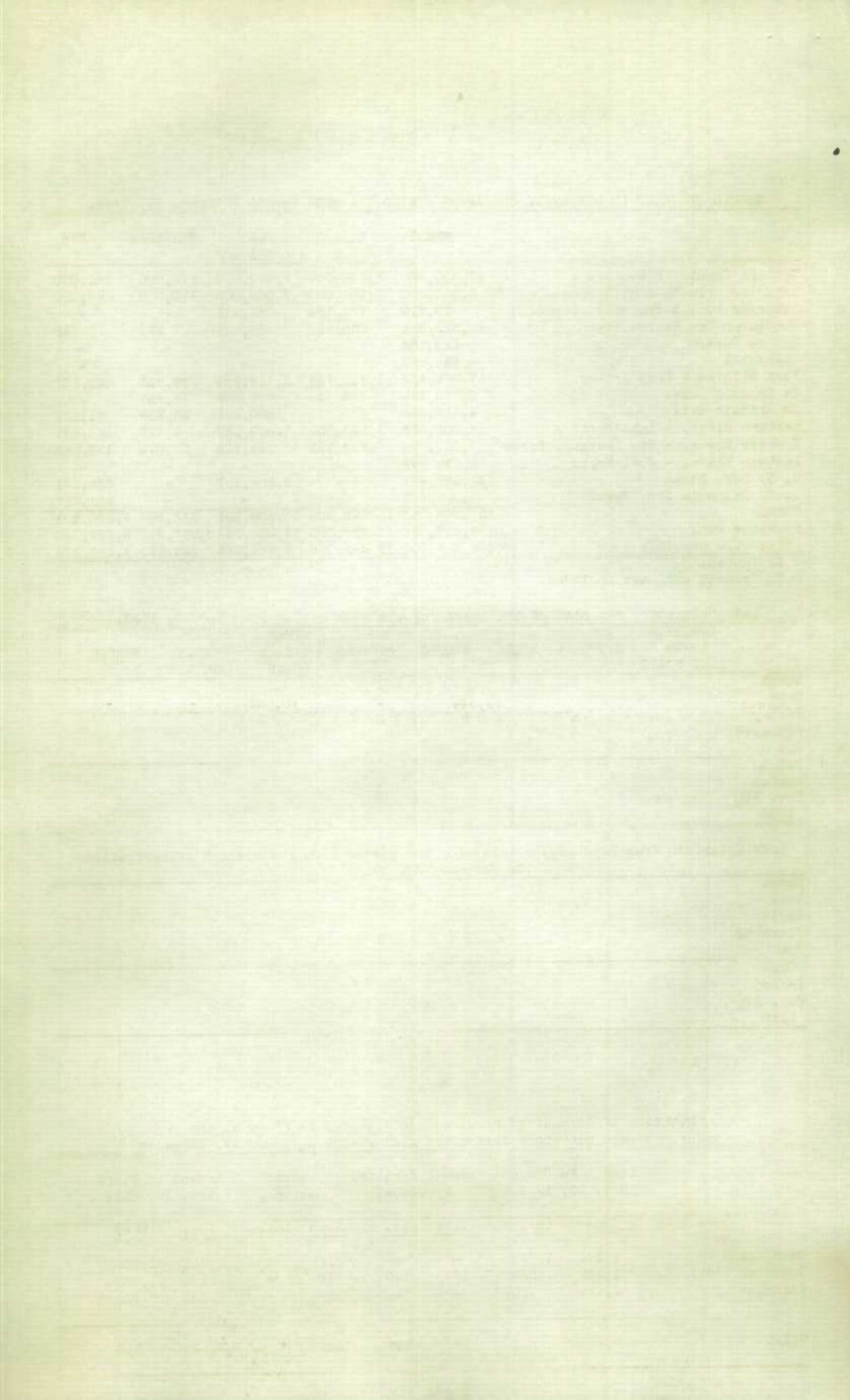

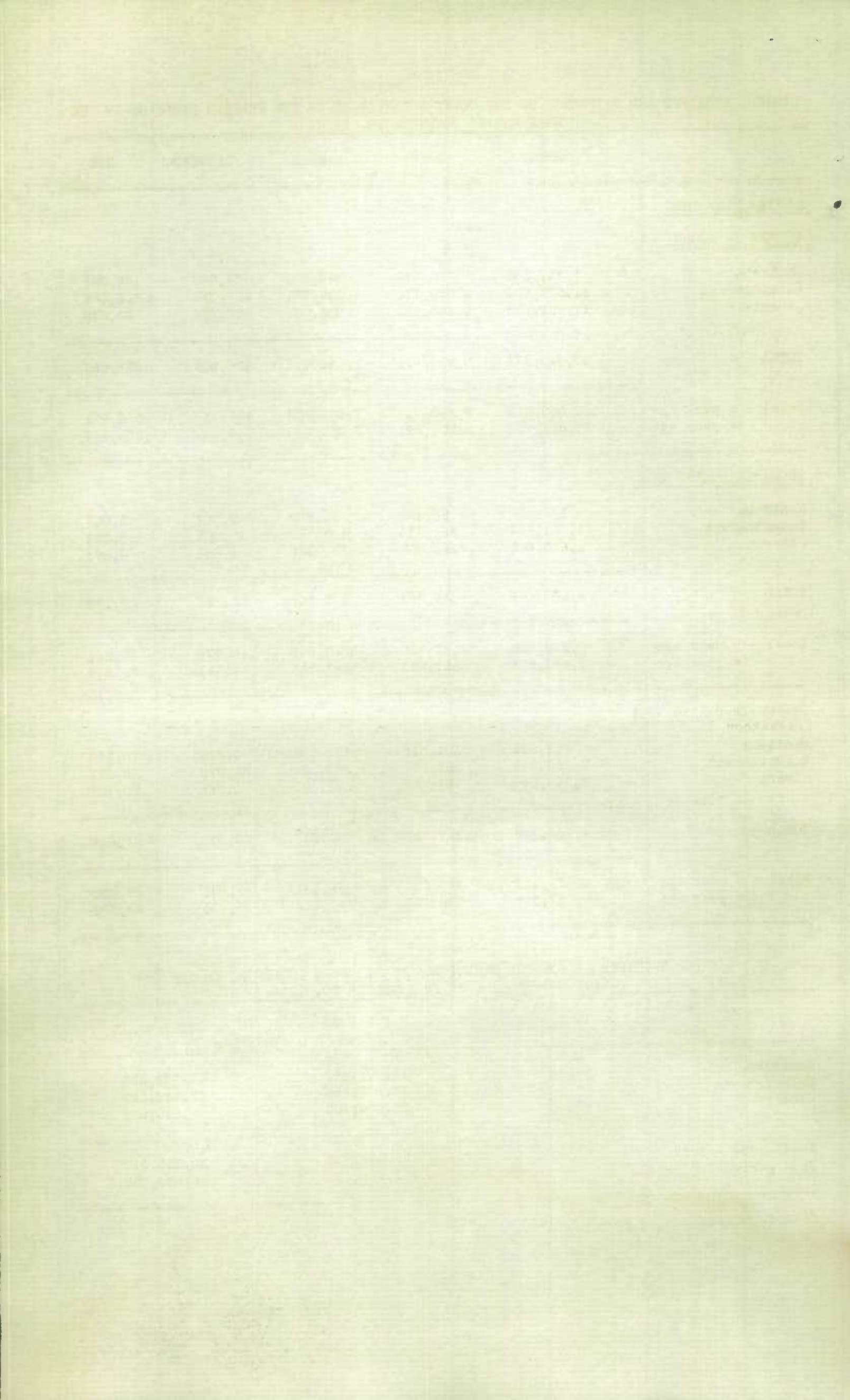

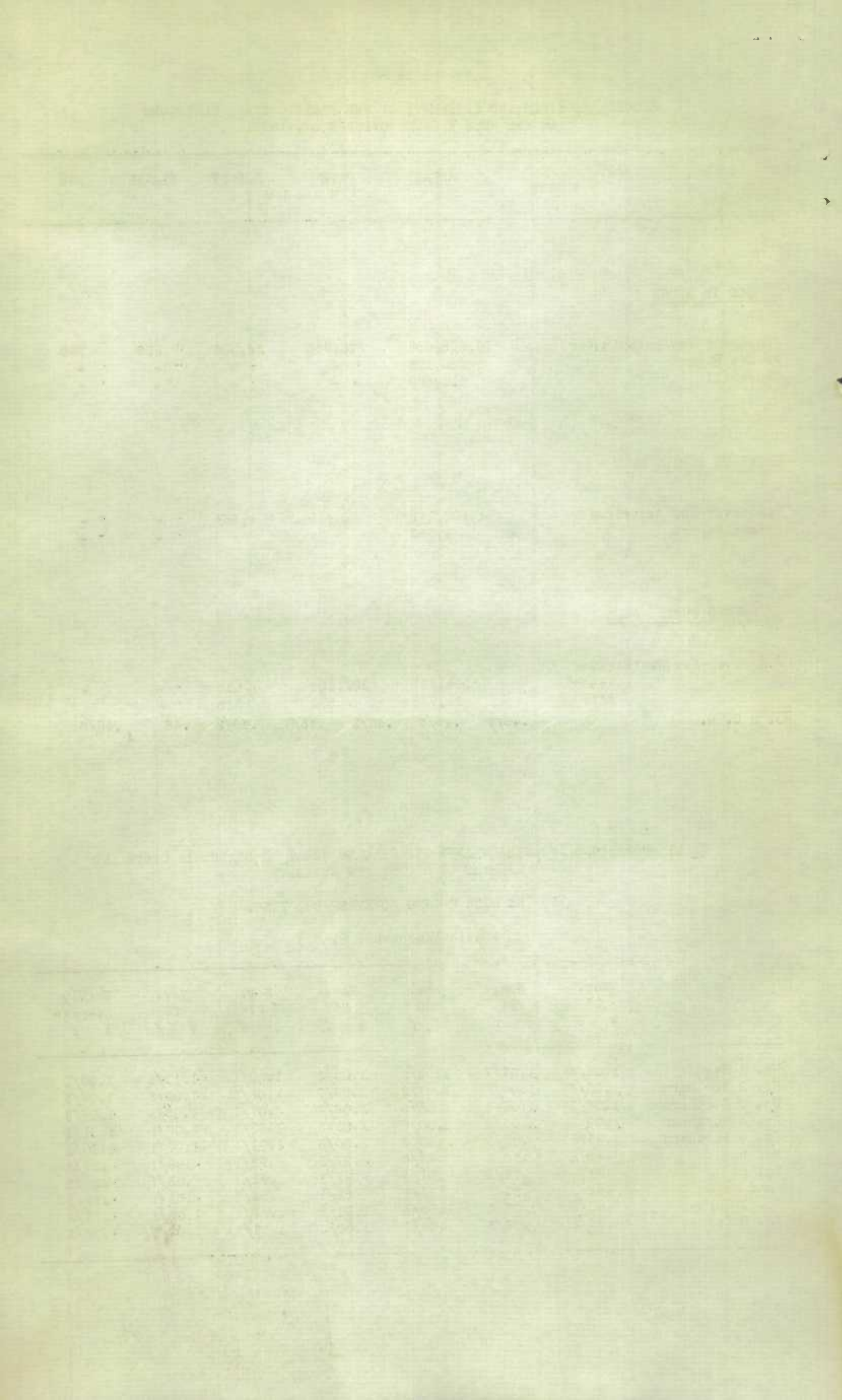
