WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 14 shows an increase of 3,332,413 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 80,158,206 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply including 7,554,665 bushels in rail transit was reported as 116,393,568 bushels compared with the revised figure of 113,061,155 bushels for the previous week and 196,551,774 bushels for the week ending August 16, 1935. The last two amounts do not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,458,905 bushels, a net decrease of 1,046,589 bushels from the previous week when 18,412,316 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 5,124,953; Buffalo 7,808,000; Chicago 81,000; New York 1,755,952; Albany 2,874,000 and Erie 1,815,000 bushels. The stocks at Duluth, New York and Buffalo increased 1,074,078, 19,511 and 42,000 bushels respectively while decreases were shown at Erie of 73,000 and Chicago 16,000 bushels. Stocks at Albany remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,890,139 bushels, distributed as follows:- Duluth 543,107; Buffalo 14,987,286; Erie 27,000; New York 659,746; Albany 1,399,000; New Orleans 21,000 and Galveston 253,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending August 14, amounted to 96,934,663 bushels compared with 94,648,839 bushels a week ago and 178,661,635 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 31,450,000; Interior elevators, Western division 5,649,918; Pacific coast elevators 7,758,519; Churchill 2,408,800; Head of the Lakes 18,239,175; and Eastern elevators Lake and seaboard ports 10,418,232 and 11,397,238 bushels respectively while 9,612,781 bushels were in transit on the lakes and by rail.

Decreases are shown in all wheat stocks in the western division with the exception of the western country elevators, which due to the early harvesting of wheat increased their wheat stocks by 718,462 bushels. The decreases were as follows. Fort William and Port Arthur 3,809,673; Vancouver 841,686; Churchill 75,646; Interior private mill elevators 11,363 while Eastern elevators increased the quantities in store by 710,133 bushels over the previous week.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 2,058,116 bushels compared with 4,017,184 bushels for the previous week and 7,029,283 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 7,554,665 bushels of wheat in rail transit at August 14, 1936, included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 7, amounted to 1,713,506 bushels, an increase of 812,487 bushels, when 901,019 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,444,683 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending August 7 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 193,920 (69,727); Saskatchewan 993,963 (558,871); Alberta 525,623 (816,085) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending August 14, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,070,375 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,285,000 bushels. The total is 5,355,378 bushels as compared with 5,686,594 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 331,219 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 3,188,278 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending August 15, 1936 amounted to 9,736,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,792,000 bushels for the previous week and 6,760,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America showed a decrease of 1,135,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while Argentine and Australian shipments showed increases of 479,000 and 937,000 bushels respectively.

During the first two weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 19.5 million bushels as compared with 15 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 10 million bushels this year as compared with 6 million bushels in 1935-36.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 14, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 14, 1936 show an increase of 4,896,519 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 116,393,568, oats 8,668,032, barley 6,468,251, flaxseed 266,016 and rye 3,374,454 bushels. The increase was composed of wheat 3,332,413, oats 450,640, barley 1,034,361, flaxseed 16,734 and rye 62,371 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 196,551,774, oats 5,774,349, barley 3,120,793, flaxseed 280,429 and rye 3,061,822 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows an increase of 964,509 bushels, composed of wheat 718,462, oats 89,207, barley 124,764, flaxseed 1,100 and rye 30,976 bushels.
