WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 18, 1936, decreased 883,793 bushels compared with the previous week and 149,467,535 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The amount in store including 4,517,062 bushels in rail transit was reported as 115,581,211 bushels compared with the revised figure of 116,465,004 bushels for the previous week and 265,048,746 bushels for the week ending December 20, 1935. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 27,402,420 bushels, a net increase of 2,985,375 bushels over the previous week when 24,417,045 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 4,154,721; Erie 2,123,201; Buffalo 9,042,000; Chicago 262,000; New York 8,141,850; Albany 3,048,000; Detroit 210,000; Toledo 110,648 and Cleveland 310,000. Increases are shown at Erie of 1,107,610; Chicago 40,000; New York 2,333,681; Detroit 210,000; Toledo 110,648 and Cleveland 310,000. Duluth and Buffalo stocks decreased by 410,564 and 716,000 bushels respectively. The stocks at Albany remained unchanged. For the same week in 1935, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 36,504,639 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 963,891; Buffalo 21,259,788; Erie 2,341,000; Chicago 321,000; New York 3,747,545; Albany 5,087,000; Galveston 124,000; Boston 1,000,415; Philadelphia 808,000 and Baltimore 852,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending December 18, amounted to 88,407,791 bushels compared with 92,047,959 bushels for the previous week and 228,544,107 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 31,000,000; Interior elevators 5,261,334; Vancouver-New Westminster 9,756,945; Prince Rupert 910,983; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 9,212,124; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard ports 27,134,774 bushels.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in Canadian elevators of 821,412 bushels from the previous week. Decreases were as follows: Interior Elevators 112,532; Vancouver-New Westminster 622,796 and Eastern Elevators, seaboard ports 891,177 bushels. Increases are shown at Western Country Elevators of 404,559 bushels which is the first in sometime, Head of the Lakes 299,217 and Eastern elevators lake ports 101,287 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 4,517,062 bushels on December 18, but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 11, 1936, amounted to 1,304,451 bushels, a decrease of 607,785 bushels from the previous week when 1,912,236 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 6,343,473 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending December 11 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935; Manitoba 85,444 (359,459); Saskatchewan 386,969 (2,869,021); Alberta 832,038 (3,114,993) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the nineteen weeks from August 1 to December 11, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 18,043,345 (14,960,208); Saskatchewan 75,466,304 (95,639,684); Alberta 39,206,043 (65,183,326) bushels. For the nineteen weeks ending December 11, 1936 and December 13, 1935, 132,715,692 and 175,783,218 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending December 18, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,742,703 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 968,000 bushels. The total is 3,710,703 bushels as compared with 4,276,553 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 565,850 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935 a decrease of 1,115,283 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending December 19, 1936, amounted to 9,460,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 8,555,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,976,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia showed decreases of 573,000 and 340,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while shipments from Argentina showed an increase of 768,000 bushels.

During the first twenty weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 217 million bushels as compared with 197 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 113 million bushels this year as compared with only 79 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to only 22 million bushels as compared with 39 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36, and 1934-35.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 10.8 million bushels per week during the first twenty weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9.8 and 10.4 million bushels per week during the corresponding periods in 1935-36 and 1934-35. North American shipments have averaged 5.6 million bushels per week compared with 3.9 million bushels per week during the first twenty weeks of 1935-36 and 3.7 million bushels per week during 1934-35. Argentine shipments averaged 1.1 million bushels per week compared with 1.9 million bushels during the same period last year and 3.5 million bushels per week during the same weeks in 1934-35.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 18, 1936

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Dec. 18, 1936 show a net decrease of 1,534,643 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: Wheat 115,810,211, oats 15,374,660, barley 15,008,077, flaxseed 895,819 and rye 2,138,739 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 654,793, oats 26,013, and barley 981,676 bushels while increases were shown in flaxseed and rye of 5,235 and 122,604 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 265,048,746, oats 12,421,088, barley 9,160,369, flaxseed 509,050 and rye 4,663,136 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net increase of 209,042 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 404,589 and flaxseed 1,436 bushels while decreases were shown in oats of 157,581, barley 26,378 and rye 13,024 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 34,486 bushels composed of wheat 6,389 and barley 28,097 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 756,723 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 622,796, oats 137,950 and barley 3,042 bushels while rye increased 7,065 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show an increase of 566,755 bushels, composed of wheat 299,217, oats 60,790, barley 115,397, flaxseed 22,420 and rye 68,931 bushels.
