WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 24, 1936, decreased 590,691 bushels compared with the previous week and 147,169,310 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The amount in store including 4,263,763 bushels in rail transit was reported as 115,076,284 bushels compared with the revised figure of 115,666,975 bushels for the previous week and 262,245,594 bushels for the week ending December 27, 1935. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 28,187,544 bushels, a net increase of 785,124 bushels over the previous week when 27,402,420 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 3,647,946; Erie and Erie Canal 2,123,201; Buffalo 8,740,000; Chicago 262,000; Cleveland 310,000; Detroit 210,000; Toledo 110,648; New York 9,735,749 and Albany 3,048,000 bushels. An increase is shown in the stocks at New York of 1,593,899 bushels while decreases are noted at Duluth of 506,775 and Buffalo 302,000 bushels. There has been no change in the wheat in store from the previous week at Chicago, Cleveland, Detroit, Toledo, Albany, Erie and afloat in Erie Canal. For the same week in 1935, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 35,312,733 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 963,891; Buffalo 20,414,595; Erie 2,174,000; Chicago 315,000; New York 3,561,305; Albany 3,087,000; Galveston 114,000; Boston 1,062,942; Philadelphia 768,000 and Baltimore 352,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending December 25, amounted to 86,888,740 bushels compared with 88,264,555 bushels for the previous week and 226,932,861 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 31,100,000; Interior Elevators 4,961,364; Vancouver-New Westminster 9,155,372; Prince Rupert 910,983; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 9,165,537; Eastern Elevators Lake ports, 19,777,870 and Seaboard ports 6,939,282 bushels.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in Canadian elevators of 1,122,516 bushels. Decreases are shown as follows: Interior Elevators 83,016; Vancouver-New Westminster 601,573; Head of the Lakes 46,587; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 630,025. Increases were at the Western Country Elevators of 26,252; Interior Elevators 30; Eastern Elevators seaboard ports 212,403 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 4,263,763 bushels on December 24, but no comparative figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 18, 1936 amounted to 2,099,902 bushels, an increase of 795,451 bushels over the previous week when 1,304,451 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 2,738,574 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending December 18 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 71,925 (38,987); Saskatchewan 824,886 (1,226,670); Alberta 1,203,091 (1,472,917) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty weeks from August 1 to December 18, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 18,115,270 (14,999,195); Saskatchewan 76,291,190 (96,866,354); Alberta 40,409,134 (66,656,243) bushels. For the twenty weeks ending December 18, 1936 and December 20, 1935, 134,815,594 and 178,521,792 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending December 24, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,645,562 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 339,000 bushels. The total is 2,984,562 bushels as compared with 3,710,703 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 726,141 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935 a decrease of 215,756 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending December 26, 1936, amounted to 11,266,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,460,000 bushels for the previous week and 6,088,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America showed a decrease of 486,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while shipments from Argentina and Australia showed increases of 1,395,000 bushels and 793,000 bushels respectively.

During the first twenty-one weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 229 million bushels as compared with 203 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 117 million bushels this year as compared with only 82 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to only 26 million bushels as compared with 39 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-one weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36, and 1934-35.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 10.9 million bushels per week during the first twenty-one weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9.7 and 10.3 million bushels per week during the corresponding periods in 1935-36 and 1934-35. North American shipments have averaged 5.6 million bushels per week compared with 3.9 million bushels per week during the first twenty-one weeks of 1935-36 and 3.7 million bushels per week during 1934-35. Argentine shipments averaged 1.2 million bushels per week compared with 1.9 million bushels during the same period last year and 3.4 million bushels per week during the same weeks in 1934-35.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 25, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Dec. 25, 1936 show a net decrease of 1,158,987 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 115,076,284, oats 15,020,647, barley 14,880,387, flaxseed 863,743 and rye 2,169,728 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 590,691, oats 412,516, barley 156,927 and flaxseed 25,126 bushels while rye increased 26,273 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 262,245,594, oats 12,334,974, barley 9,110,554, flaxseed 502,446 and rye 4,670,863 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net increase of 86,148 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 26,252, oats 33,411, barley 22,369 and rye 13,148 bushels while flaxseed decreased 9,032 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 22,416 bushels. Barley decreased 31,341 bushels while wheat and oats increased 30 and 8,895 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 697,811 bushels composed of wheat 601,573, oats 92,661 and barley 3,577 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain the same as the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 67,135 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 46,587, oats 70,656 and flaxseed 10,037 bushels while barley and rye increased 47,381 and 12,764 bushels respectively.

DULUTH.- Receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth by rail for the week ending December 19, 1936 were nil. For the period August 1, 1936 to date rail receipts amounted to barley 546,920 bushels.

Receipts by water for the week ending December 19, 1936 amounted to wheat 47,348 and barley 11,938 bushels. Receipts by water from August 1, 1936 to date amounted to wheat 10,332,492, oats 54,565, barley 3,746,395 and rye 99,924 bushels.

Rail shipments for the week ending December 19, 1936 amounted to wheat 457,912 bushels (duty paid), and barley 51,569 bushels (of which 41,569 bushels were duty paid). Rail shipments from August 1, 1936 to date amounted to wheat 9,802,558, oats 54,565, barley 1,582,508 and rye 25,253 bushels.

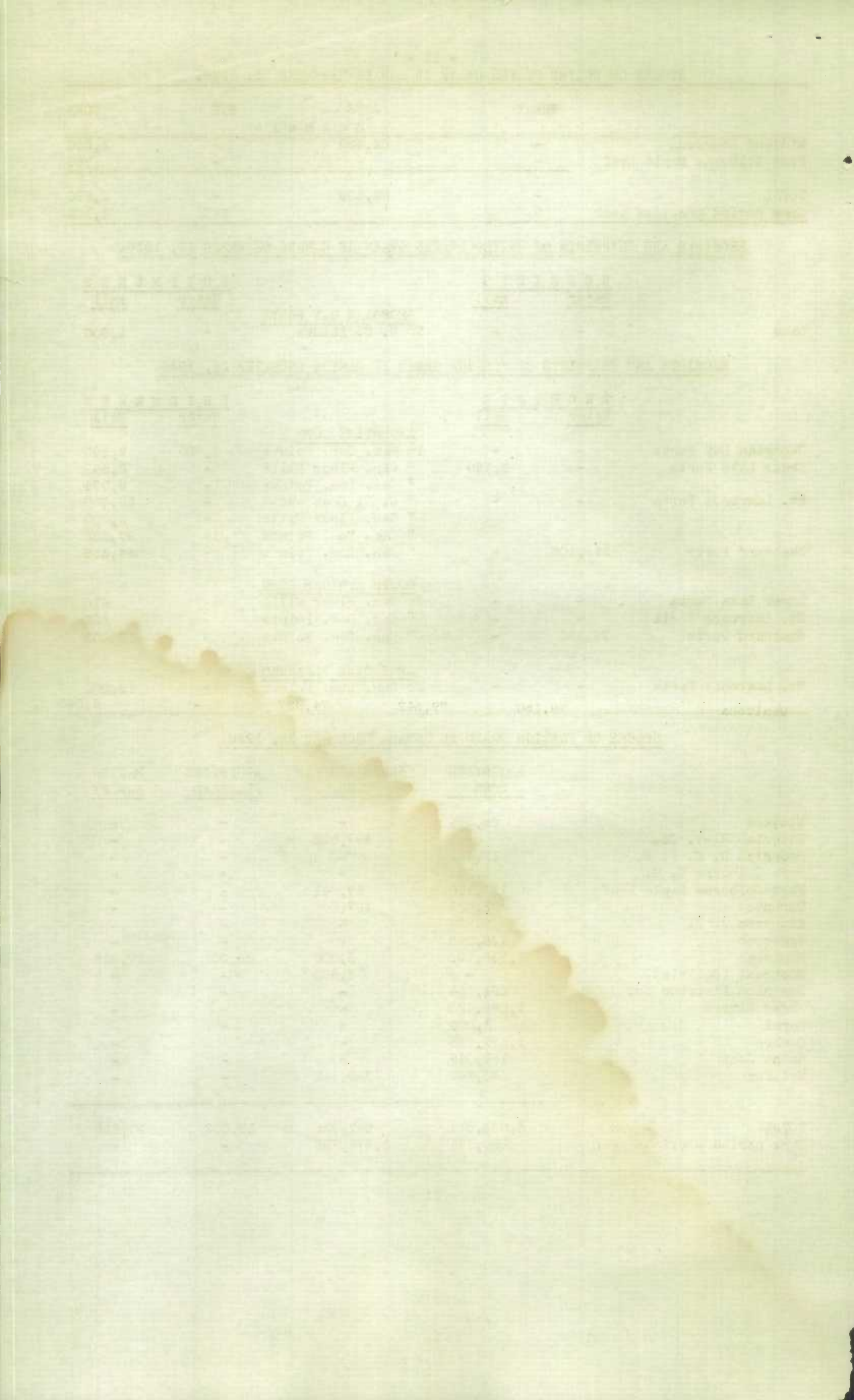
