WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 8, 1937, decreased 3,348,018 bushels compared with the previous week and 146,353,672 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store including 2,394,912 bushels in rail transit was reported as 109,945,206 bushels compared with the revised figure of 113,293,224 bushels for the previous week and 256,298,878 bushels for the week ending January 10, 1936. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,522,437 bushels, a decrease of 1,252,949 bushels from the previous week when 27,775,386 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 3,499,785; Erie and Erie Canal 2,123,201; Buffalo 7,915,000; Chicago 262,000; Cleveland 310,000; Detroit 210,000; Toledo 110,648; New York 8,923,803; Albany 3,048,000 and Philadelphia 120,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the Canadian wheat stocks from the previous week at the following ports: Duluth 81,500; Buffalo 704,000 and New York 587,449 bushels, while an increase is noted at Philadelphia of 120,000 bushels. For the same week in 1936 Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 32,410,139 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 895,158; Buffalo 18,981,000; Erie 1,926,000; Chicago 280,000; New York 3,260,493; Albany 4,715,000; Galveston 96,000; Boston 799,488; Philadelphia 817,000; Baltimore 572,000 and Norfolk 68,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending January 8, 1937 amounted to 83,422,769 bushels compared with 85,517,838 bushels for the previous week and 223,888,739 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 31,000,000; Interior Terminals 5,240,236; Vancouver-New Westminster 8,941,749; Prince Rupert 910,983; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 9,159,662; Eastern Elevators Lake ports 18,505,211 and Seaboard ports 6,655,447 bushels.

A net decrease is noted in the wheat stocks in Canadian elevators of 565,048 bushels. Decreases were as follows: Country Elevators 282,527; Interior Public & Semi-public 1,098; Eastern Elevators Lake ports 636,966 and Seaboard ports 31,400 bushels. Increases were shown at Interior Private & Mill Elevators of 20,842; Vancouver-New Westminster 291,344 and at the Head of the Lakes 74,757 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,394,912 bushels on January 8, but no comparative figures for 1936 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 31 amounted to 1,187,316 bushels, a decrease of 132,384 bushels from the previous week when 1,319,700 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,142,188 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending December 31 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 132,152 (108,327); Saskatchewan 482,442 (398,520); Alberta 572,722 (635,341) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-two weeks from August 1 to December 31, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 18,326,036 (15,207,489); Saskatchewan 76,920,634 (98,146,036); Alberta 42,075,940 (68,109,825) bushels. For the twenty-two weeks ending December 31, 1936 and January 3, 1936, 137,322,610 and 181,463,350 bushels were received from the farms.





OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending January 8, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,921,414 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 464,000 bushels. The total is 2,385,414 bushels as compared with 3,787,203 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,401,789 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1936 a decrease of 1,329,886 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending January 9, 1937, amounted to 11,279,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 11,248,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,632,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Argentina showed decreases of 119,000 bushels and 177,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while shipments from Australia showed an increase of 151,000 bushels.

During the first twenty-three weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 251 million bushels as compared with 218 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 124 million bushels this year as compared with only 88 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to only 34 million bushels as compared with 41 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-three weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36, and 1934-35.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 10.9 million bushels per week during the first twenty-three weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9.5 and 10.1 million bushels per week during the corresponding periods in 1935-36 and 1934-35. North American shipments have averaged 5.4 million bushels per week compared with 3.8 million bushels per week during the first twenty-three weeks of 1935-36 and 3.5 million bushels per week during 1934-35. Argentine shipments averaged 1.5 million bushels per week compared with 1.8 million bushels during the same period last year and 3.4 million bushels per week during the same weeks in 1934-35.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 8, 1937.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 8, 1937 show a decrease of 3,808,226 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 109,945,206, oats 14,913,743, barley 14,696,597, flaxseed 816,937 and rye 2,127,501 bushels. The decrease was composed of wheat 3,348,018, oats 241,109, barley 158,762, flaxseed 20,444 and rye 39,893 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 256,298,878, oats 12,181,097, barley 9,094,148, flaxseed 491,382 and rye 4,696,073 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks this week show a net decrease of 292,173 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 282,527 and oats 49,442 bushels while barley increased 33,792, flaxseed 21 and rye 5,983 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 6,850 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 6,349 and barley 1,599 bushels while wheat decreased 1,098 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at those elevators show a net increase of 308,479 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 291,344, oats 18,428 and rye 1,478 bushels while barley decreased 2,771 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net increase of 214,280 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 74,757, oats 114,123 and barley 60,700 bushels while flaxseed and rye decreased 20,687 and 14,613 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MILL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 41,796 bushels. Decreases were noted in oats of 8,237, barley 48,759, flaxseed 5,476 and rye 166 bushels while wheat increased 20,842 bushels.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - LAKE PORTS:- Grain in store decreased 741,029 bushels composed of wheat 636,966, oats 86,565, barley 8,295 and rye 9,203 bushels.

DULUTH.- Receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth by rail for the week ending December 31, 1936 were nil. For the period August 1, 1936 to date rail receipts amounted to barley 546,920 bushels.

Receipts by water for the week ending December 31, 1936 were nil. Receipts by water from August 1, 1936 to date amounted to wheat 10,332,492, oats 54,565, barley 3,746,395 and rye 99,924 bushels.

Rail shipments for the week ending December 31, 1936 amounted to wheat 66,661 bushels (duty paid), and barley 101,831 bushels (of which 91,831 bushels were duty paid.) Rail shipments from August 1, 1936 to date amounted to wheat 10,375,994, oats 54,565, barley 1,721,172 and rye 25,253 bushels.

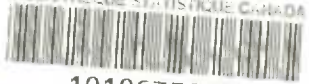
