#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 15, 1937, decreased 2,861,114 bushels compared with the previous week and 144,545,012 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store including 2,951,135 bushels in rail transit was reported as 107,253,684 bushels compared with the revised figure of 110,114,798 bushels for the previous week and 251,798,696 bushels for the week ending January 17, 1936. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

It will be noted that the visible supply of 107,435,684 bushels of wheat in the elevators and afloat is below the quantity of the carry-over at the end of the Crop Year 1936, which was 109,435,977 bushels.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 25,213,615 bushels, a decrease of 1,308,822 bushels from the previous week whon 26,522,437 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 3,323,754; Erie 2,123,201; Buffalo 7,605,000; Chicago 260,000; Cleveland 310,000; Detroit 170,000; Toledo 110,648; New York 8,261,012; Albany 3,048,000 and Philadelphia 2,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in Canadian wheat stocks from the previous week at the following ports: Duluth 176,031; Buffalo 310,000; Chicago 2,000; Detroit 40,000; New York 662,791 and Philadel-phia 118,000 bushels. No changes are reported for the stocks at Erie and Erie Canal; Cleveland; Toledo and Albany. For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 31,246,437 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 842,255; Buffalo 18,086,000; Erie 1,875,000; Chicago 247,000; New York 3,117,701; Albany 4,715,000; Galveston 84,000; Boston 1,012,481; Philadelphia 735,000 and Baltimore 532,000 bushels.

## CAN DIAN WIELT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending January 15, 1937, amounted to 82,040,069 bushels compared with 83,592,361 bushels for the previous week and 220,552,259 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.


Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 30,820,000; Interior Terminals 5,119,761; Vancouver-New Westminster 8,481,873; Prince Rupert 910,983; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 9,176,002; Eastern Elevators Lake ports 17,729,800 and Seaboard ports 6,235,946 bushels.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in Canadian elevators of 2,108,515 bushels. Decreases were as follows: Country Elevators 429,450; Interior Elevators 40,617; Vancouver-New Westminster 459,876; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard ports 775,411 and 419,501 bushels. The stocks at the Head of the Lakes increased 16,340 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,951,135 bushels on January 15, but no comparative figures for 1936 were secured.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 8, 1937, amounted to 1,199,855 bushels, a slight increase of 12,539 bushels over the previous week when 1,187,316 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were only 450,516 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending January 8, 1937, were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 89,400 (31,574); Saskatchewan 437,648 (236,890); Alberta 672,807 (182,072) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Pro inces for the twenty-three weeks from August 1, 1936 to January 8, 1937, as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 18,415,436 (15,239,063); Saskatchewan 77,358,282 (98,382,906); Alberta 42,748,747 (68,291,897) bushels. For the twenty-three weeks ending January 8, 1937, and January 10, 1936, 138,522,465 and 181,913,866 bushels were received from the farms.



#### OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES


During the week ending January 15, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,755,123 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 992,000 bushels. The total is 3,747,123 bushels as compared with 2,385,654 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,361,469 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1936 a decrease of 546,689 bushels.

#### CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 15, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Jan. 15, 1937 show a decrease of 3,383,418 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 107,253,684, oats 14,485,740, barley 14,464,709, flaxseed 784,937 and rye 2,121,659 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,861,114, oats 283,885, barley 203,707, flaxseed 24,318 and rye 10,394 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 251,798,696, oats 12,160,840, barley 8,886,046, flaxseed 477,464 and rye 4,687,660 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Grain stocks show a decrease of 584,797 bushels composed of wheat 429,450, oats 118,702, barley 21,488, flaxseed 11,253 and rye 3,904 bushels.



INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 45,606 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 5,475 and barley 44,495 bushels while oats increased 4,364 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 490,237 bushels composed of wheat 459,876, oats 23,117 and barley 7,244 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS .- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR.).- Grain in store shows a net increase of 117,811 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 16,340, oats 53,112, barley 43,591 and rye 11,319 bushels while flaxseed decreased 6,551 bushels.
