WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 22, 1937 decreased 3,145,582 bushels compared with the previous week and 143,591,028 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store including 3,040,581 bushels in rail transit was reported as 103,898,229 bushels compared with the revised figure of 107,043,811 bushels for the previous week and 247,489,257 bushels for the week ending January 24, 1936. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,135,232 bushels, a decrease of 1,078,383 bushels from the previous week when 25,213,615 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 3,153,172; Erie 2,123,201; Buffalo 7,350,000; Chicago 257,000; Cleveland 310,000; Detroit 120,000; Toledo 110,648; New York 7,658,211; Albany 3,048,000 and Philadelphia 5,000 bu. Decreases are shown in Canadian wheat stocks from the previous week at the following ports; Duluth 170,582; Buffalo 255,000; Chicago 3,000; Detroit 50,000 and New York 602,801, while an increase of 3,000 is noted at Philadelphia. No changes are reported for the stocks at Erie and Erie Canal; Cleveland, Toledo and Albany. For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 29,854,814 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 822,505; Buffalo 17,225,000; Erie 1,845,000; Chicago 247,000; New York 2,879,382; Albany 4,715,000; Galveston 77,000; Boston 879,927; Philadelphia 750,000; Baltimore 332,000 and Norfolk 82,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending January 22, 1937, amounted to 79,762,997 bushels compared with 81,830,196 bushels for the previous week, and 217,634,443 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 30,250,000; Interior Terminals 4,904,761; Vancouver-New Westminster 7,863,887; Prince Rupert 910,983; Churchill 614,569; Fort William and Port Arthur 9,291,739; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard ports 16,887,434 and 5,999,043 bushels respectively.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in Canadian elevators of 2,156,645 bushels. Decreases were as follows: Country Elevators 526,084; Interior Private and Mill elevators 49,043; Vancouver-New Westminster 617,986; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard ports 842,366 and 236,903 bushels respectively. An increase is noted in the stocks at Fort William and Port Arthur of 115,727 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 3,040,581 bushels on January 22, but no comparative figures for 1936 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 15, 1937 amounted to 809,201 bushels, a decrease of 390,654 bushels from the previous week when 1,199,855 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 819,281 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending January 15, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 32,282 (80,507); Saskatchewan 283,161 (353,714) and Alberta 493,758 (385,060) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-four weeks from August 1 to January 15, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 18,447,718 (15,319,570); Saskatchewan 77,641,443 (98,736,620) and Alberta 43,242,505 (68,676,957) bushels. For the twenty-four weeks ending January 15, 1937 and January 17, 1936, 139,331,666 and 182,733,147 bushels were received from the farms.





OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending January 22, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,011,568 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 713,000 bushels. The total is 2,724,568 bushels as compared with 3,747,123 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,022,555 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1936, a decrease of 1,414,222 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending January 23, 1937, amounted to 17,529,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,594,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,816,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from Argentina and Australia showed increases of 1,984,000 bushels and 2,029,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week. North American shipments also showed an increase of 818,000 bushels.

During the first twenty-five weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 281 million bushels as compared with 238 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 131 million bushels this year as compared with only 97 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to 47 million bushels as compared with 42 million bushels for the same period last year.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-five weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 11.3 million bushels per week during the first twenty-five weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9.5 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1935-36. North American shipments have averaged 5.3 million bushels per week compared with 3.9 million bushels per week during the first twenty-five weeks of 1935-36. Argentine shipments averaged 1.9 million bushels per week compared with 1.7 million bushels during the same period last year.





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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 22, 1937.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 22, 1937 show a decrease of 3,826,339 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 103,898,229, oats 13,865,264, barley 14,404,272, flaxseed 767,936 and rye 2,082,984 bushels. Decreases were shown in wheat of 3,145,582, oats 556,002, barley 60,579, flaxseed 23,535 and rye 40,641 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 247,489,257, oats 12,034,115, barley 8,906,119, flaxseed 459,499 and rye 4,653,251 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 791,106 bushels. Decreases were shown in wheat of 526,084, oats 238,530, barley 27,346 and flaxseed 810 bushels while rye increased 1,664 bushels.

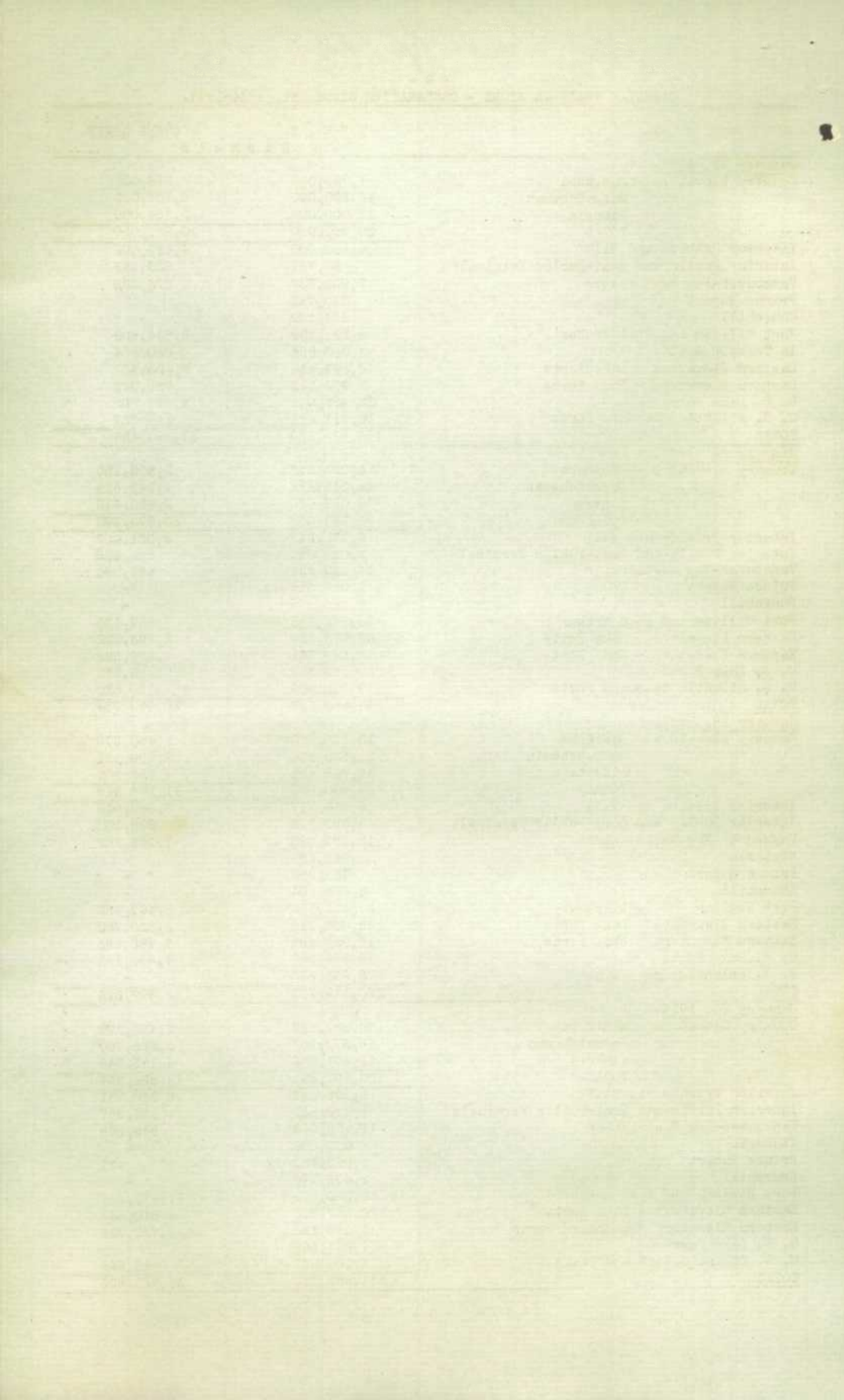
