WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 12, 1937, decreased 2,778,695 bushels compared with the previous week and 139,985,867 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store including 2,210,764 bushels in rail transit was reported as 94,816,070 bushels compared with the revised figure of 97,594,765 bushels for the previous week and 234,801,937 bushels for the week ending February 14, 1936. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 22,466,457 bushels, a decrease of 904,099 bushels from the previous week when 22,370,556 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 2,705,908; Erie 2,123,201; Buffalo 5,853,000; Chicago 232,000; Cleveland 200,000; Detroit 120,000; Toledo 110,648; New York 7,346,000; Albany 2,770,700; Philadelphia 5,000 bushels. Decreases were shown in the stocks at Duluth of 131,397; Buffalo 160,000; Chicago 7,000; Cleveland 110,000; Albany 277,300 and New York 218,402 bushels. The stocks at Erie, Detroit, Toledo and Philadelphia remain : unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,273,403 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 705,432; Buffalo 15,282,000; Erie 1,071,000; Chicago 204,000; New York 2,581,128; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 149,000; Galveston 47,000; Boston 614,843; Philadelphia 671,000; and Baltimore 233,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending February 12, 1937, amounted to 73,349,613 bushels compared with 75,224,209 bushels for the previous week and 208,528,534 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 28,380,000; Interior Terminals 5,193,394; Vancouver-New Westminster 7,103,281; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 9,456,555; Eastern Elevators Lake & Seaboard Ports 14,632,459 and 4,847,597 bushels respectively.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in Canadian elevators of 2,076,782 bushels. The decreases were as follows: Country Elevators 690,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 194,230; Eastern elevators, Lake & Seaboard ports 865,136 and 243,775 bushels respectively. Increases are noted at Interior Terminal Elevators of 85,343 bushels and Head of the Lakes 23,468 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,210,764 bushels on February 12, but no comparative figures for 1936 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 5, 1937, amounted to 448,124, bushels, a decrease of 58,495 bushels from the previous week when 506,619 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 571,929 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending February 5, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 36,235 (33,960); Saskatchewan 168,345 (205,164) and Alberta 243,544 (332,805) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-seven weeks from August 1 to February 5, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 18,550,231 (15,411,917); Saskatchewan 78,166,269 (99,432,445) and Alberta 44,134,917 (69,862,169) bushels. For the twenty-seven weeks ending February 5, 1937 and February 7, 1936, 140,851,417 and 185,041,795 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending February 12, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,470,724 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 670,000 bushels. The total is 2,140,724 bushels as compared with 2,705,192 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 564,468 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 2,294,553 bushels.

CANADA GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 12, 1937.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Feb. 12, 1937 show a decrease of 3,300,860 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 94,816,070; oats 12,580,056, barley 13,985,319, flaxseed 697,881 and rye 1,996,976 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,778,695, oats 376,533, barley 105,005, flaxseed 20,455 and rye 20,172 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 234,801,937, oats 11,361,736, barley 8,561,964, flaxseed 429,079, and rye 4,682,997 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks this week show a decrease of 448,442 bushels. Decreases were as follows: wheat 340,008, oats 92,559, barley 12,678, flaxseed 1,719 and rye 1,478 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 3,283 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 6,292, and barley 1,648 bushels while wheat decreased 4,657 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 181,218 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 194,230 and barley 209 bushels while oats increased 13,221 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net increase of 17,371 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 23,468, barley 58,434 and rye 4,956 bushels while oats and flaxseed decreased 53,478 and 16,009 bushels.

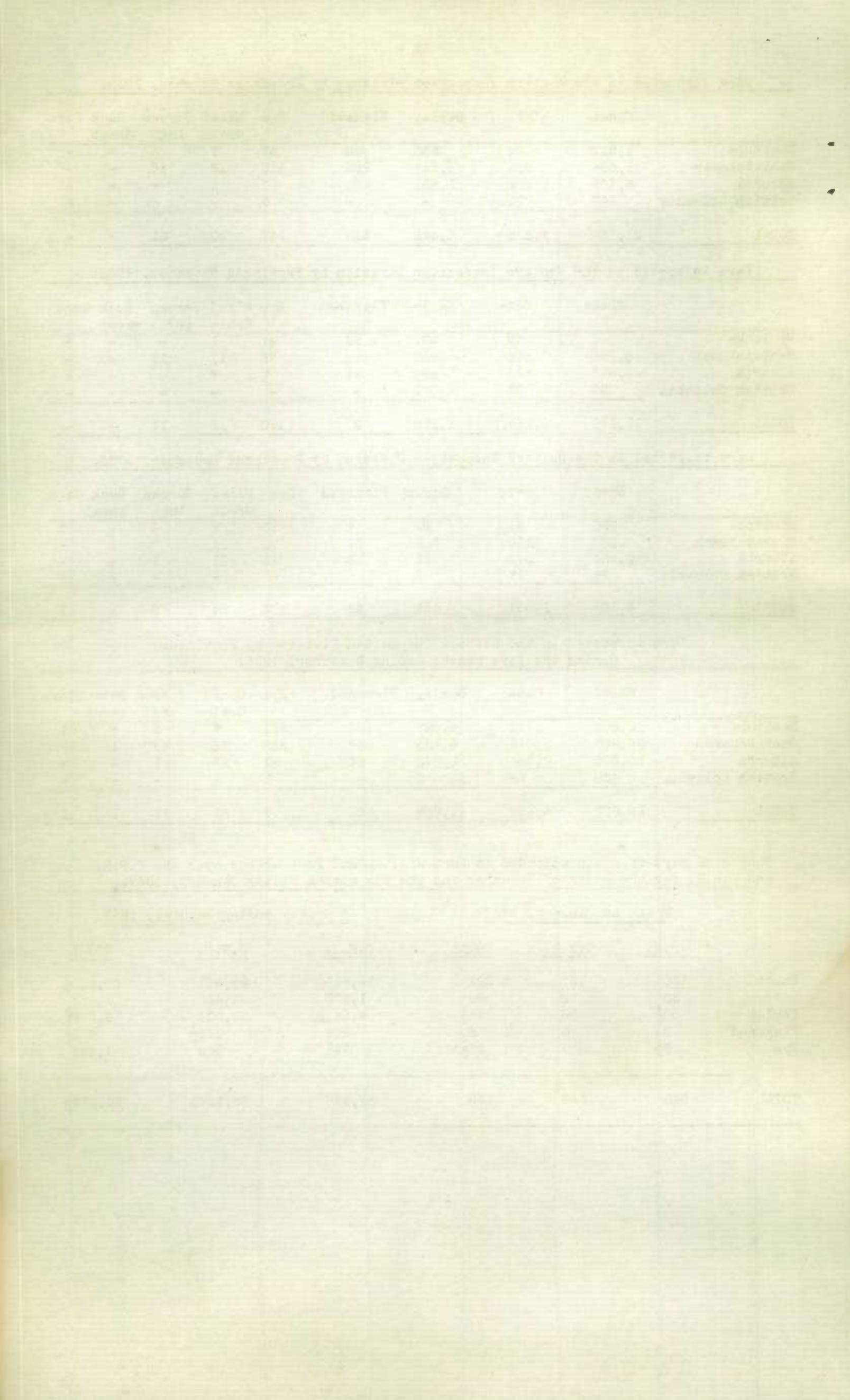
