WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 12, 1937, decreased 1,776,226 bushels compared with the previous week and 127,871,402 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store including 1,701,269 bushels in rail transit was reported as 86,321,097 bushels compared with the revised figure of 88,097,323 bushels for the previous week and 214,192,499 bushels for the week ending March 12, 1936. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,117,763 bushels, a decrease of 1,013,589 bushels from the previous week when 18,131,352 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 2,057,244; Erie 2,123,201; Buffalo 4,033,000; Chicago 232,000; Cleveland 200,000; Detroit 120,000; Toledo 110,648; New York 5,709,000 and Albany 2,532,670 bushels. Decreases were shown in the stocks at Duluth of 218,559; Buffalo 191,000; New York 366,000 and Albany 238,030 bushels. The stocks at Erie, Detroit, Toledo, Chicago and Cleveland remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,297,069 bushels, distributed as follows: Duluth 623,528; Buffalo 11,310,000; Erie 145,000; Chicago 204,000; New York 2,379,156; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 132,000; Galveston 23,000; Boston 329,385; Philadelphia 396,000 and Baltimore 31,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending March 12, 1937, amounted to 69,203,333 bushels compared with 69,965,971 bushels for the previous week and 193,895,430 bushels for the corresponding date last year.


Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 28,240,000; Interior Terminals 4,566,125; Vancouver-New Westminster 7,465,922; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,559; Head of the Lakes 9,886,720; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 12,209,224 and 3,608,510 bushels respectively.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in Canadian elevators of 352,423 bushels. The decreases were as follows: Interior Terminal Elevators 191,781; Vancouver-New Westminster 72,420; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard ports 546,028 and 275,250 bushels respectively. Increases are noted in the stocks at the Western Country Elevators of 498,497 and at the Head of the Lakes of 234,559 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,701,269 bushels on March 12, but no comparative figures for 1936 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 5, 1937 amounted to 938,445 bushels, a decrease of 10,389 bushels from the previous week when 948,834 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,286,189 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending March 5, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 76,746 (66,500); Saskatchewan 448,514 (722,159); Alberta 413,185 (497,530) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-one weeks from August 1 to March 5, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 18,785,598 (15,549,965); Saskatchewan 80,526,110 (100,805,896); Alberta 45,923,413 (70,946,309) bushels. For the thirty-one weeks ending March 5, 1937 and March 7, 1936, 145,235,121 and 187,302,170 bushels were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending March 12, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,337,646 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 462,000 bushels. The total is 1,799,646 bushels as compared with 1,897,718 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 98,070 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 1,574,027 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 12, 1937.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 12, 1937 show a net decrease of 1,961,710 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 86,321,096, oats 12,086,755, barley 12,527,054, flaxseed 677,734 and rye 1,952,754 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,776,226 and barley 209,131 bushels while increases were shown in oats of 11,609, flaxseed 5,061 and rye 6,977 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 214,192,499, oats 11,815,598, barley 8,610,954, flaxseed 418,636 and rye 4,696,875 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net increase of 537,329 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 498,497, oats 41,353, flaxseed 761 and rye 7,749 bushels while barley decreased 11,031 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 9,325 bushels. Oats increased 12,280 bushels while wheat decreased 2,955 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 66,855 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 72,420 and barley 1,250 bushels while oats and rye increased 5,511 and 1,304 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:- Wheat in store remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR):- Grain stocks show a net increase of 285,818 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 234,559, barley 97,734, flaxseed 4,006 and rye 6,339 bushels oats decreased 56,820 bushels.
