WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 19, 1937, decreased 1,106,883 bushels compared with the previous week and 127,549,327 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store including 2,377,026 bushels in rail transit was reported as 85,212,435 bushels compared with the revised figure of 86,319,318 bushels for the previous week and 212,761,762 bushels for the week ending March 20, 1936. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 15,874,638 bushels, a decrease of 1,243,125 bushels from the previous week when 17,117,763 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 1,982,119; Erie 2,123,201; Buffalo 3,461,000; Chicago 232,000; Cleveland 200,000; Detroit 120,000; Toledo 110,648; New York 5,113,000 and Albany 2,532,670 bushels. Decreases were shown in the stocks at Duluth of 75,125; Buffalo 572,000; and New York 596,000 bushels. The stocks at Erie, Chicago, Cleveland, Detroit, Toledo and Albany remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 18,995,621 bushels, distributed as follows: Duluth 622,131; Buffalo 10,581,000; Erie 145,000; Chicago 184,000; New York 1,969,720; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 98,000; Galveston 24,000; Boston 260,761; Philadelphia 396,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending March 19, 1937, amounted to 69,337,797 bushels compared with 69,201,618 bushels for the previous week and 193,766,141 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 28,360,000; Interior Terminals 4,338,849; Vancouver-New Westminster 7,389,039; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 10,093,321; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 11,737,970 and 3,516,029 bushels respectively.

A net decrease is shown in the wheat stocks in Canadian elevators of 539,577 bushels. The decreases were as follows: Interior Terminal Elevators 232,359; Vancouver-New Westminster 76,883; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 471,254 and 92,481 bushels respectively. Increases are noted in the stocks at the Western Country Elevators of 123,975; Head of the Lakes 206,601 and Interior Public and Semi-Public Terminals 2,724 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,377,026 bushels on March 19, but no comparative figures for 1936 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 12, 1937, amounted to 1,394,396 bushels, an increase of 455,951 bushels over the previous week when 938,445 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 2,121,504 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending March 12, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 120,523 (151,163); Saskatchewan 771,875 (1,177,384) and Alberta 501,998 (792,957) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-two weeks from August 1 to March 12, 1937, as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 18,906,121 (15,701,127); Saskatchewan 81,297,985 (101,983,281) and Alberta 46,425,411 (71,739,266) bushels. For the thirty-two weeks ending March 12, 1937 and March 13, 1936, 146,629,517 and 189,423,674 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending March 19, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 964,514 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 527,000 bushels. The total is 1,491,514 bushels as compared with 1,799,646 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 308,132 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 1,321,667 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending March 20, 1937, amounted to 15,007,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,640,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,296,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from Argentina and Australia showed increases of 1,204,000 bushels and 914,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while North American shipments were showing an increase of 369,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-three weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 398 million bushels as compared with 323 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 152 million bushels this year as compared with only 133 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to 111 million bushels as compared with only 52 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first thirty-three weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 12.1 million bushels per week during the first thirty-three weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9.8 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1935-36. North American shipments have averaged 4.6 million bushels per week compared with 4.0 million bushels per week during the first thirty-three weeks of 1935-36. Argentine shipments averaged 3.4 million bushels per week compared with 1.6 million bushels per week last year.





CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 19, 1937.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 19, 1937 show a net decrease of 2,633,449 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 85,212,435, oats 11,791,573, barley 11,372,277, flaxseed 679,086 and rye 1,881,485 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,106,946, oats 299,762, barley 1,156,177 and rye 70,991 bushels, while flaxseed increased 427 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 212,761,762, oats 12,219,419, barley 8,764,921, flaxseed 427,246 and rye 4,729,295 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 190,732 bushels. Decreases were noted in oats of 229,794, barley 83,263, flaxseed 298 and rye 1,352 bushels while wheat increased 123,975 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show an increase of 8,066 bushels composed of wheat 2,724 and oats 5,342 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 78,875 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 76,883, barley 520 and rye 1,799 bushels while oats increased 327 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net increase of 220,424 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 206,601, barley 79,666 and rye 6,256 bushels while oats and flaxseed decreased 68,974 and 3,125 bushels respectively.
