WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 10, 1937, decreased 1,588,757 bushels compared with the previous week and 119,810,983 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store including 4,604,142 bushels in rail transit was reported as 80,777,022 bushels compared with the revised figure of 82,365,779 bushels for the previous week and 200,588,005 bushels for the week ending April 11, 1936. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 13,529,968 bushels, a decrease of 619,834 bushels from the previous week, when 14,149,802 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 1,899,320; Erie and Erie afloat 1,729,000; Buffalo 3,164,000; Chicago 219,000; Detroit 120,000; Toledo 110,648; New York 4,457,000 bushels and Albany 1,831,000 bushels. Decreases were shown in stocks at the following ports: Duluth 29,633; Erie and Erie Afloat 349,201; Buffalo 139,000; and New York 88,000 bushels while a decrease of 31,000 bushels is noted at Albany. The stocks at Chicago, Detroit and Toledo remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 13,694,060 bushels distributed as follows:- Duluth 564,376; Buffalo 7,534,000; Erie 86,000; Chicago 89,000; New York 899,313; Albany 4,299,000; Norfolk 62,000; Galveston 30,000; Boston 41,371; and Philadelphia 89,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending April 10, 1937, amounted to 67,247,054 bushels compared with 68,215,977 bushels for the previous week and 186,893,945 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 24,072,000; Interior terminals 3,901,541; Vancouver-New Westminster 7,165,318; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 13,411,793; Eastern elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 10,006,908 and 2,559,789 bushels respectively.

The decreases were as follows: Country elevators 1,756,000; Eastern elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 661,683 and 563,170 bushels respectively. Increases were shown at Interior Private and Mill Elevators of 20,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 174,774 and Head of the Lakes 1,804,548 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 4,604,142 bushels April 10, but no comparative figures for 1936 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 2, 1937 amounted to 1,327,371 bushels, a decrease of 59,595 bushels from the previous week when 1,386,966 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,205,849 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending April 2, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 101,669 (117,303); Saskatchewan 592,540 (698,573); Alberta 633,162 (389,973) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-five weeks from August 1, to April 2, 1937, as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 19,238,740 (16,091,605); Saskatchewan 83,212,921 (104,258,054); Alberta 48,314,594 (73,620,387) bushels. For the thirty-five weeks ending April 2, 1937 and April 3, 1936, 150,766,255 and 193,970,046 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending April 9, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,175,107 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 476,000 bushels. The total is 1,651,107 bushels as compared with 1,765,732 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 114,625 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 634,769 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending April 10, 1937, amounted to 12,342,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,038,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,848,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Argentina showed increases of 119,000 bushels and 1,064,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while Australian shipments showed a decrease of 463,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-six weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 435 million bushels as compared with 350 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 158 million bushels this year as compared with only 145 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to 131 million bushels as compared with only 56 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first thirty-six weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 12.1 million bushels per week during the first thirty-six weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9.7 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1935-36. North American shipments have averaged 4.4 million bushels per week compared with 4.0 million bushels per week during the first thirty-six weeks of 1935-36. Argentine shipments averaged 3.6 million bushels per week compared with 1.6 million bushels per week last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 9, 1937.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 9, 1937 show a net decrease of 2,509,681 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 80,777,022, oats 10,436,500, barley 10,739,559, flaxseed 688,801 and rye 1,931,152 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,588,757, oats 555,381 and barley 512,355 bushels, while increases were shown in flaxseed and rye of 20,797 and 126,015 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 200,588,005, oats 12,253,558, barley 9,113,894, flaxseed 434,955 and rye 4,804,192 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 2,324,000 bushels, composed of wheat 1,756,000, oats 458,000, barley 82,000, flaxseed 21,000 and rye 7,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Oat stocks for the week show a decrease of 11,442 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 159,109 bushels. Wheat stocks increased 174,774 bushels, while oats and barley decreased 15,145 and 520 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net increase of 1,978,895 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 1,804,548, barley 119,314, flaxseed 22,977 and rye 41,647 bushels, while oats decreased 9,591 bushels.
