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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 23, 1937, decreased 2,130,402 bushels compared with the previous week and 129,185,484 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 75,572,499 bushels compared with 77,702,901 bushels for the previous week and 204,757,983 bushels for the week ending April 24, 1936.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 11,213,633 bushels, a decrease of 827,754 bushels from the previous week when 12,041,387 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 1,734,633; Erie (Afloat) 1,071,000; Buffalo 2,318,000; Chicago 55,000; New York 3,985,000 and Albany 2,050,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the stocks at the following ports: Duluth 146,754; Erie (Afloat) 276,000; Buffalo 368,000 and New York 134,000 bushels. An increase is noted in the stocks at Albany of 97,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 12,446,412 bushels, distributed as follows: Duluth 551,376; Erie 86,000; Chicago 89,000; New York 675,665; Albany 3,967,000; Norfolk 27,000; Buffalo 6,912,000; Galveston 10,000; Boston 41,371 and Philadelphia 87,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending April 23, 1937, amounted to 64,358,866 bushels compared with 65,661,514 bushels for the previous week and 192,311,571 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 18,320,000; Interior Terminals 3,909,653; Vancouver-New Westminster 6,349,823; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 12,475,648; Eastern elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 8,094,299 and 295,445 bushels respectively.

The decreases were as follows: Country Elevators 3,665,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 468,407; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,132,831; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 1,309,143 and 55,031 bushels respectively. An increase is shown in the Interior Private and Mill Elevators of 14,000 bushels.

Wheat is rail transit amounted to 5,969,749 bushels compared with 13,569,423 bushels at a comparable date last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 5,418,686 bushels against 1,417,272 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 16, 1937 amounted to 946,356 bushels, a decrease of 338,078 bushels from the previous week when 1,284,434 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 786,477 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending April 16, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 90,608 (71,790); Saskatchewan 472,146 (401,340); Alberta 383,602 (313,347) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-seven weeks from August 1, to April 16, 1937, as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 19,427,289 (16,242,611); Saskatchewan 84,277,939 (105,400,574); Alberta 49,291,817 (74,410,348) bushels. For the thirty-seven weeks ending April 16, 1937 and April 17, 1936, 152,997,045 and 196,053,633 bushels were received from the farms.

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OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending April 23, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,252,379 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 522,000 bushels. The total is 1,774,379 bushels as compared with 2,497,517 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 723,138 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 1,547,376 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending April 24, 1937, amounted to 13,411,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,527,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,168,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from Argentina and Australia showed increases of 464,000 bushels and 572,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while North American shipments showed a decrease of 688,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 461 million bushels as compared with 363 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 163 million bushels this year as compared with only 152 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to 143 million bushels as compared with only 57 million bushels for the same period last year.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first thirty-eight weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 12.1 million bushels per week during the first thirty-eight weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9.6 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1935-36. North American shipments have averaged 4.3 million bushels per week compared with 4.0 million bushels per week during the first thirty-eight weeks of 1935-36. Argentine shipments averaged 3.7 million bushels per week compared with 1.5 million bushels per week last year.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 23, 1937 show a decrease of 3,932,666 bushels compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 75,572,499, oats 8,378,981, barley 9,733,439, flaxseed 686,872 and rye 1,658,214 bushels. Decreases were as follows: wheat 2,130,402, oats 1,117,567, barley 554,024, flaxseed 3,531 and rye 127,142 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 204,757,983, oats 11,755,780, barley 9,522,600, flaxseed 437,841 and rye 4,865,592 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a decrease of 4,511,000 bushels, composed of wheat 3,665,000, oats 674,000, barley 109,000, flaxseed 18,000, and rye 45,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 112,053 bushels. Oats decreased 113,676 bushels while barley increased 1,623 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 518,805 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 468,407, oats 50,230 and barley 668 bushels while rye increased 500 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 2,447,034 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,132,831, oats 168,968, barley 162,294 and rye 5,003 bushels, while flaxseed increased 22,062 bushels.
