WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 28 shows an increase of 11,766,231 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 59,462,397 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply including 13,038,983 bushels in rail transit was reported as 135,427,597 bushels compared with the revised figure of 123,661,366 bushels for the previous week and 194,889,994 bushels for the week ending August 30, 1935. The last two ~~weeks~~ do not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 18,309,313 bushels, a net decrease of 1,241,281 bushels from the previous week when 19,544,757 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 5,438,055; Erie 1,672,000; Buffalo 6,545,000; New York 1,645,258; Albany 2,874,000 and Chicago 135,000 bushels. The stocks at Buffalo decreased 903,000; New York 267,281 and Erie 71,000 bushels from those of the previous week, while Duluth and Chicago stocks were reduced 1,837 and 4,000 bushels respectively. Stocks at Albany remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 18,571,308 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 401,775; Buffalo 16,112,990; Erie 27,000; New York 408,543; Albany 1,399,000; New Orleans 18,000 and Galveston 204,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending August 28, amounted to 117,118,284 bushels compared with 104,116,609 bushels a week ago and 176,318,686 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 42,000,000; Interior elevators, Western division 5,705,229; Pacific coast elevators 7,443,478; Churchill 2,400,419; Head of the Lakes 5,705,229 and Eastern elevators lake and seaboard ports 10,622,158 and 10,866,350 bushels respectively while 16,414,193 bushels were in transit on the lakes and by rail.

Increases are shown in all ~~wheat~~ stocks in the Western division with the exception of the Interior Public and Semi-Public, Vancouver and Eastern seaboard elevators, amounting to 36,677; 207,888 and 583,739 bushels. The increases are as follows: Western Country elevators 5,635,154; Fort William and Port Arthur 4,883,608; Eastern elevators 741,387; Churchill 125,538 and Interior Private and Mill Elevators 98,601 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 3,375,210 bushels compared with 3,391,086 bushels for the previous week and 7,165,990 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 13,038,983 bushels of wheat in rail transit at August 28, 1936, included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 21 amounted to 10,787,812 bushels an increase of 4,599,604 bushels over the previous week when 6,188,208 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 2,313,638 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending August 21 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 2,562,927 (473,449); Saskatchewan 6,562,721 (672,561); Alberta 1,662,164 (1,167,628); bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the three weeks from August 1 to 21, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935, were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 4,629,360 (704,809); Saskatchewan 10,847,567 (1,817,672); Alberta 3,212,599 (2,856,861) bushels. For the two weeks ending August 21, 1936 and August 23, 1935, 18,689,526 and 5,379,342 bushels were received from the farms.





OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending August 28, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,304,829 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,522,000 bushels. The total is 4,826,829 bushels as compared with 4,527,396 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 299,433 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 1,879,807 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending August 29, 1936, amounted to 9,787,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,221,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,112,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America showed a decrease of 451,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while Argentine and Australian shipments showed decreases of 368,000 and 107,000 bushels respectively.

During the first four weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 39.8 million bushels as compared with 31.9 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 21.5 million bushels this year as compared with 11 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to only 3.1 million bushels as compared with 10.4 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first four weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36 and 1934-35.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 10.0 million bushels per week during the first four weeks of the crop year as compared with 8. and 11.8 million bushels per week during the corresponding periods in 1935-36 and 1934-35. North American shipments have averaged 5.4 million bushels per week compared with 2.7 and 4.8 million bushels during the first four weeks of 1935-36 and 1934-35. Argentine shipments averaged only 0.8 million bushels per week compared with 2.6 million bushels per week during the same period last year.







CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS- WEEK ENDING AUGUST 28, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Aug. 28, 1936 show a net increase of 14,647,295 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 135,427,597, oats 10,211,571, barley 10,558,276, flaxseed 287,923 and rye 3,467,346 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 11,766,231, oats 727,993 and barley 2,199,253 bushels while flaxseed and rye decreased 31,259 and 14,923 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 194,889,994, oats 5,750,335, barley 3,833,845, flaxseed 197,394 and rye 3,301,322 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net increase of 6,758,591 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 5,635,154, oats 444,888, barley 719,284 and flaxseed 17,226 bushels while rye decreased 57,961 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 52,836 bushels, composed of wheat 36,677, oats 13,659 and barley 2,500 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 186,454 bushels. Decreases were shown in wheat of 207,888 and barley 175 bushels while oats and flaxseed increased 21,555 and 54 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.-Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks increased 125,538 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net increase of 6,064,794 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 4,883,608, oats 160,255 and barley 1,141,523 bushels, while flaxseed and rye decreased 31,548 and 89,044 bushels respectively.
