WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 21, 1937, decreased 3,461,416 bushels compared with the previous week and 113,871,855 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 60,688,822 bushels compared with 64,150,238 bushels for the previous week and 174,560,677 bushels for the week ending May 22, 1936.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 7,861,513 bushels, a decrease of 577,539 bushels from the previous week when 8,439,052 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 909,513; Erie 100,000; Erie Canal 313,000; Buffalo 1,983,000; Chicago 47,000; New York 3,394,000 and Albany 1,115,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the stocks at the following ports: Duluth 168,539; Buffalo 196,000; Chicago 4,000 and New York 502,000 bushels. An increase is noted in the stocks at Erie Canal of 293,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 13,138,330 bushels, distributed as follows: Duluth 332,677; Erie 86,000; Chicago 74,000; New York 273,282; Albany 3,967,000; Buffalo 8,364,000 and Boston 41,371 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending May 21, 1937, amounted to 52,827,309 bushels compared with 55,711,186 bushels for the previous week and 161,422,347 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 8,993,000; Interior Terminals 4,599,217; Vancouver-New Westminster 5,059,951; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 13,822,136; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 8,792,369 and 4,768,620 bushels respectively.

The decreases were as follows: Country Elevators 532,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 530,701; Fort William and Port Arthur 30,517 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,228,540 bushels. Increases are shown in Interior and Mill Elevators of 318,000 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 362,277 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,411,271 bushels compared with 7,868,395 bushels at a comparable date last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 2,855,182 bushels against 4,707,801 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 14, 1937, amounted to 896,999 bushels, an increase of 139,111 bushels from the previous week when 757,888 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 702,176 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending May 14, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 61,347 (68,364); Saskatchewan 548,323 (345,299); Alberta 287,329 (288,513) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-one weeks from August 1, to May 14, 1937, as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 19,645,016 (16,677,707); Saskatchewan 86,081,025 (107,542,809); Alberta 50,438,827 (75,714,305) bushels. For the forty-one weeks ending May 14, 1937 and May 15, 1936, 156,164,868 and 199,934,821 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending May 21, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,484,283 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 471,000 bushels. The total is 3,955,283 bushels as compared with 4,747,687 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 792,404 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 2,694,468 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending May 22, 1937 amounted to 12,890,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,614,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,024,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Argentina showed slight decreases, while Australian shipments were somewhat higher as compared with the previous week.

During the first forty-two weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 507 million bushels compared with 404 million bushels for the same period last year. North American shipments amounted to 178 million bushels this year compared with 176 million bushels in 1935-36. Argentine shipments amounted to 151 million bushels compared with only 62 million bushels for the same period last year.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first forty-two weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36.

During the first forty-two weeks of the present crop year world shipments averaged 12.1 million bushels per week as compared with 9.7 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1935-36. Argentine shipments averaged 3.6 million bushels per week compared with 1.5 million bushels per week last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 21, 1937.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 21, 1937, show a net decrease of 4,742,250 bushels compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were: wheat 60,688,822, oats 5,153,214, barley 7,098,451, flaxseed 542,109 and rye 1,103,465 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,461,416, oats 590,133, barley 354,861 and rye 351,508 bushels, while flaxseed increased 15,668 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 174,560,677, oats 9,624,241, barley 8,110,958, flaxseed 383,918 and rye 4,353,480 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 924,000 bushels compared with the previous week. Decreases were noted in wheat of 532,000, oats 282,000, barley 81,000, flaxseed 5,000 and rye 24,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC & SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 3,135 bushels, composed of oats 2,948 and barley 187 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 582,429 bushels. Decreases were as follows: wheat 530,701, oats 49,562, barley 660 and rye 1,506 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR.)- Grain stocks show a net increase of 279,429 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 134,268, barley 149,563 and flaxseed 46,922 bushels while wheat and rye decreased 30,517 and 20,807 bushels respectively.

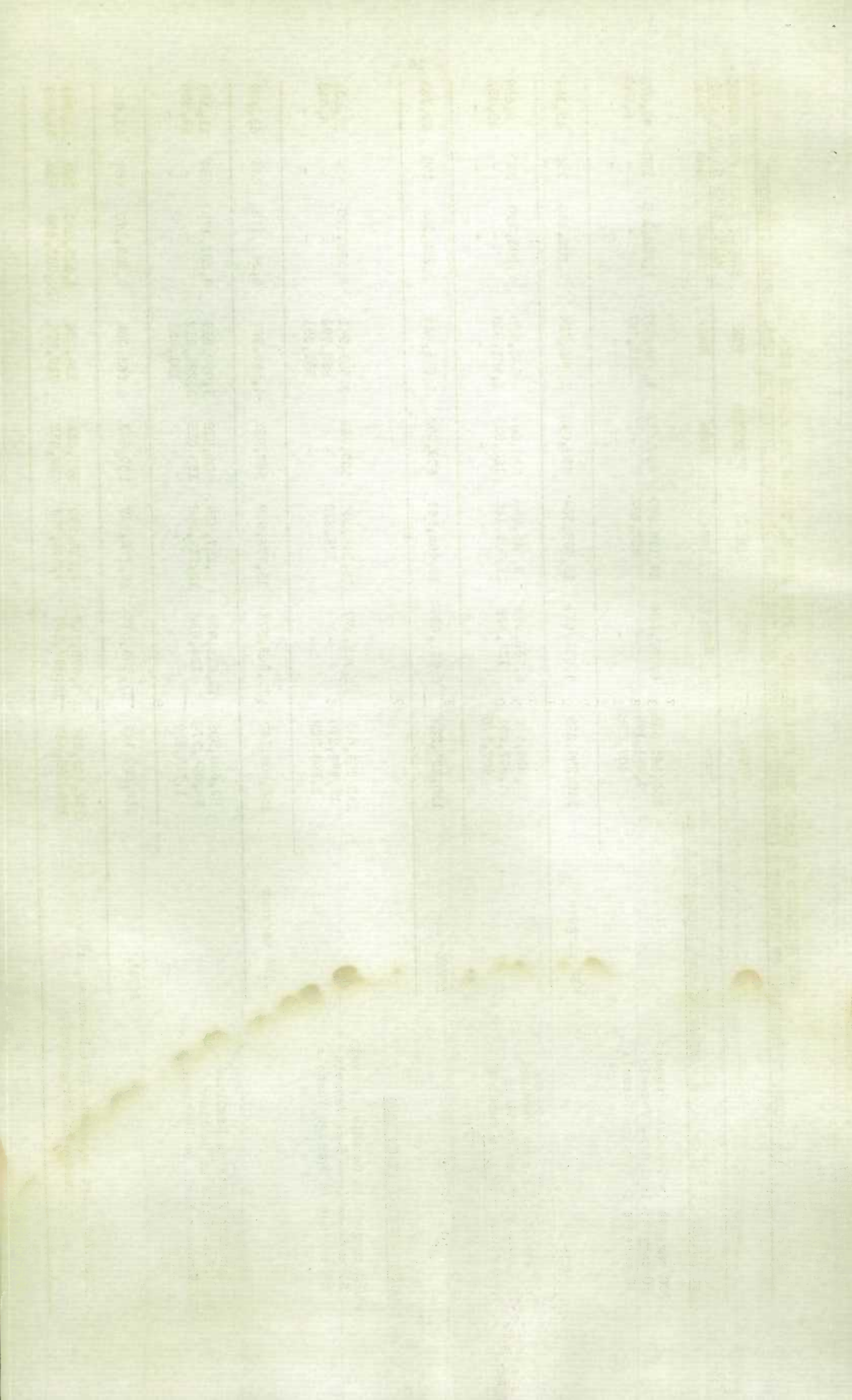
