WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 11, 1937, decreased 3,995,473 bushels compared with the previous week and 105,266,544 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 51,318,826 bushels compared with 55,314,299 bushels for the previous week and 156,585,370 bushels for the week ending June 12, 1936.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 6,028,978 bushels, a decrease of 428,000 bushels from the previous week when 6,456,978 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 729,978; Buffalo 1,326,000; Chicago 27,000; New York 2,692,000 and Albany 1,120,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the stocks at the following ports: Duluth 32,000; Buffalo 322,000; Chicago 12,000; New York 116,000 and Albany 80,000 bushels, while the Canals show 134,000 bushels afloat.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 14,503,844 bushels, distributed as follows: Duluth 377,565; Erie 1,488,000; Chicago 74,000; New York 307,908; Albany 4,471,000; Buffalo 7,818,000 and Boston 41,371 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending June 11, 1937 amounted to 45,289,848 bushels compared with 48,857,321 bushels for the previous week and 142,081,526 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 8,360,000; Interior Terminals 4,950,809; Vancouver-New Westminster 4,120,235; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 9,406,849; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 6,688,562 and 6,305,095 bushels respectively.

The decreases were as follows: Western Country Elevators 223,000; Interior Private and Mill Elevators 261,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 998 bushels; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,275,049 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 915,688 bushels while an increase is noted at the Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports of 454,087 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,827,065 bushels compared with 4,574,171 bushels at a comparable date last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 2,105,670 bushels against 3,164,530 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 4, 1937, amounted to 1,395,125 bushels, an increase of 239,168 bushels from the previous week when 1,155,957 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 2,407,290 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending June 4, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 168,743 (180,952); Saskatchewan 779,544 (1,115,302); Alberta 446,838 (1,111,036) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-four weeks from August 1, to June 4, 1937, as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those of 1936: Manitoba 19,989,574 (17,086,384); Saskatchewan 88,080,229 (110,513,419); Alberta 51,539,152 (77,946,273) bushels. For the forty-four weeks ending June 4, 1937, and June 5, 1936, 159,608,955 and 205,546,076 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending June 11, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,318,792 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 444,000 bushels. The total is 3,762,792 bushels as compared with 2,784,683 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 978,109 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 2,153,280 bushels.

NOTE - The accumulated totals of imports of wheat into the United States for consumption and milling in bond are adjusted at the end of the month, due to the fact that the United States Department of Domestic and Foreign Commerce revises their weekly figures on a monthly basis.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 11, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 11, 1937 show a decrease of 4,722,800 bushels compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 51,318,826, oats 4,301,535, barley 5,768,454, flaxseed 535,294 and rye 496,291 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,995,473, oats 248,883, barley 333,395, flaxseed 9,520 and rye 135,529 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 156,585,370, oats 8,546,134, barley 6,799,789, flaxseed 347,999 and rye 3,991,767 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 311,000 bushels composed of wheat 223,000, oats 75,000, barley 4,000, flaxseed 3,000 and rye 6,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 7,292 bushels, composed of wheat 998, oats 1,759 and barley 4,535 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 538,892 bushels. Decreases were as follows:- wheat 489,246, oats 48,966, barley 610 and rye 70 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,510,808 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,275,049, oats 23,166, barley 135,286 and rye 79,735 bushels, while flaxseed increased 2,348 bushels.
