WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 18, 1937, decreased 3,024,621 bushels compared with the previous week and 103,555,848 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 48,294,205 bushels compared with 51,318,826 bushols for the previous week and 151,850,053 bushels for the week ending June 19, 1936.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,944,294 bushels, a decrease of 84,684 bushels from the previous week when 6,028,978 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 688,294; Buffalo 1,519,000; Canal 194,000; Chicago 27,000; New York 2,546,000 and Albany 970,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the stocks at the following ports: Duluth 41,684; New York 146,000 and Albany 150,000 bushels, while increases are noted at Buffalo of 193,000 and the Canal stocks of 60,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 13,478,239 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 402,115; Buffalo 6,648,000; Erie 1,488,000; New York 404,753; Albany 4,494,000 and Boston 41,371 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending June 18, 1937 amounted to 42,349,911 bushels compared with 45,239,848 bushels for the previous week and 138,371,814 bushels for the corresponding date last year.


Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 7,818,000; Interior Terminals 4,813,540; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,938,435; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 8,378,207; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Scaboard Ports 5,834,494 and 6,190,766 bushels respectively.

The decreases were as follows: Western Country Elevators 542,000; Interior Public, Semi-Public and Mill Elevators 137,269; Vancouver-New Westminster 181,800; Fort William and Port Arthur 1,028,642; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 854,068 and 114,329 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,547,789 bushels compared with 5,823,491 bushels at a comparable date last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 2,303,117 bushels against 2,460,922 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 11, 1937, amounted to 891,268 bushels, a decrease of 503,857 bushels from the previous week when 1,395,125 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 2,550,504 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending June 11, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936. Manitoba 90,927 (137,782); Saskatchewan 517,395 (1,721,909); Alberta 282,946 (690,813) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-five weeks from August 1, to June 11, 1937, as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 20,080,501 (17,224,166); Saskatchewan 88,597,624 (112,235,328); Alberta 51,822,098 (78,637,086) bushels. For the forty-five weeks ending June 11, 1937 and June 12, 1936, 160,500,223 and 208,096,580 bushels were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending June 18, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,925,681 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 412,000 bushels. The total is 3,337,681 bushels as compared with 3,318,792 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 18,889 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 986,264 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending June 19, 1937 amounted to 10,706,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,820,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,308,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Argentina slightly increased while Australian shipments were lower as compared with the previous week.


During the first forty-six weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 552 million bushels compared with 441 million bushels for the same period last year. Argentine shipments amounted to 157 million bushels compared with only 65 million bushels for the same period last year.

During the first forty-six weeks of the present crop year world shipments averaged 12.0 million bushels per week as compared with 9.5 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1935-36. Argentine shipmonts averaged 3.4 million bushels per week compared with 1.4 million bushels per week last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - MEEN ENDING JUNE 18, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 18, 1937 show a decrease of 3,828,153 bushels compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 48,294,205, oats 4,269,252, barley 5,058,664, flanseed 523,433 and rye 446,693 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,024,621, oats 32,283, barley 709,790, flaxseed 11,861 and rye 49,598 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 151,850,053, oats 8,656,996, barley 6,355,111, flaxseed 339,076 and rye 3,849,784 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Grain stocks show a decrease of 703,000 bushels composed of wheat 542,000, oats 136,000, barley 19,000 and flaxseed 6,000 bushels.



INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. - Stocks for the week show a decrease of 17,753 bushels, composed of wheat 2,269 and barley 15,484 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 179,778 bushels. Decreases were shown in wheat of 181,800, barley 655 and rye 600 bushels while cats increased 3,277 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS .- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,878,404 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,028,642, oats 221,606, barley 479,174 and rye 158,873 bushels, while flaxseed increased 9,891 bushels.








Number of cars of grain unloaded at Vancouver, E. C. over the different railroads for the month of May, 1937 and the ten months ending May, 1937.
