WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 25, 1937, decreased 2,642,214 bushels compared with the previous week and 102,843,334 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 45,651,991 bushels compared with **48,294,205 bushels** for the previous week and 148,495,325 bushels for the week ending June 26, 1936.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,538,018 bushels, a decrease of 406,276 bushels from the previous week when 5,944,294 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 698,018; Buffalo 1,210,000; Canal 44,000; Chicago 27,000; New York 2,554,000 and Albany 1,005,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the stocks at the following ports: Buffalo 309,000; Canal stocks 150,000 bushels while increases are noted in Duluth of 9,724; New York 8,000 and Albany 35,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 15,611,872 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 599,562; Buffalo ~~7,612,000~~; Erie 1,998,000; New York 793,939; Albany 4,767,000 and Boston 41,371 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending June 25, 1937 amounted to 40,113,973 bushels compared with 42,349,911 bushels for the previous week and 132,883,453 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 7,354,000; Interior Terminals 4,690,662; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,866,640; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 7,626,116; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 4,714,747 and 6,535,982 bushels respectively.

The decreases were as follows: Western Country Elevators 464,000; Interior Private and Mill Elevators 123,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 71,795; Head of the Lakes 752,091; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,119,747 bushels. Increases are shown at the Interior Public and Semi-Public Elevators of 122 and at Eastern Elevators, Seaboard Ports 345,216 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,917,757 bushels compared with 7,150,369 bushels at a comparable date last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 1,882,506 bushels against 2,069,347 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 18, 1937, amounted to 701,993 bushels, a decrease of 189,275 bushels from the previous week when 891,268 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,662,894 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending June 18, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 95,974 (86,094); Saskatchewan 382,558 (896,750); Alberta 223,461 (680,050) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-six weeks from August 1, 1936 to June 18, 1937, as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 20,176,475 (17,310,260); Saskatchewan 88,980,182 (113,132,078); Alberta 52,045,559 (79,317,136) bushels. For the forty-six weeks ending June 18, 1937 and June 19, 1936, 161,202,216 and 209,759,474 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending June 25, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,763,732 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 597,000 bushels. The total is 2,360,732 bushels as compared with 3,337,681 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 976,949 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 3,674,691 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending June 26, 1937 amounted to 7,503,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,706,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,888,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America showed a decrease of 1,358,000 bushels as compared with the previous week. Argentine and Australian shipments were also lower.

During the first forty-seven weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 560 million bushels compared with 449 million bushels for the same period last year. Argentine shipments amounted to 158 million bushels compared with only 66 million bushels for the same period last year.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first forty-seven weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36:

During the first forty-seven weeks of the present crop year world shipments averaged 12.0 million bushels per week as compared with 9.5 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1935-36.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 25, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 25, 1937 show a net decrease of 3,252,878 bushels compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 45,651,991, oats 4,033,040, barley 4,819,818, flaxseed 539,716, and rye 294,804 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,642,214, oats 236,212, barley 238,846 and rye 151,889 bushels while flaxseed increased 16,283 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 148,495,325, oats 8,473,245, barley 6,383,721, flaxseed 368,257 and rye 3,629,697 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 583,000 bushels compared with the previous week. Decreases were noted in wheat of 464,000, oats 110,000, barley 8,000 and rye 6,000 bushels while flaxseed increased 5,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 6,019 bushels. Barley decreased 6,141 bushels while wheat increased 122 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 77,127 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 71,795, oats 7,662 and rye 1,990 bushels while barley increased 4,320 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 827,234 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 752,091, oats 34,155, barley 32,712 and flaxseed 19,246 bushels while rye increased 10,970 bushels.
