WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 4 shows an increase of 12,177,258 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 50,774,101 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply including 14,441,990 bushels in rail transit was reported as 147,347,367 bushels compared with the revised figure of 135,170,109 bushels for the previous week and 198,121,468 bushels for the week ending September 6, 1935. The last two amounts do not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,019,005 bushels a net increase of 709,772 bushels over those of the previous week when 18,309,313 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth, 5,726,512; Erie 1,672,000; Buffalo 6,926,000; Chicago 112,000; New York 1,708,573 and Albany 2,874,000 bushels. The stocks at Duluth increased 288,457; Buffalo 381,000 and New York 63,315 bushels while a decrease is noted at Chicago of 23,000 bushels. Erie and Albany stocks remained unchanged from those of a week ago.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,962,653 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 15,106,148; Erie 27,000; New York 618,847; Albany 1,399,000; New Orleans 10,000; Duluth 601,658 and Galvaston 200,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending September 4, amounted to 127,328,282 bushels compared with 116,860,796 bushels a week ago and 180,158,815 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.


Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 45,500,000) Interior elevators, Western division 5,759,368; Pacific coast elevators 7,131,811; Churchill 2,230,620; Head of the Lakes 27,323,691 and Eastern elevators lake and seaboard ports 11,010,290 and 10,939,230 bushels respectively while 18,433,272 bushels were in transit on the lakes and by rail.

A net increase is shown in the wheat stocks in Canada of 448,407 bushels. The increases are as follows: Western Country Elevators 3,891,713; Interior Private and Mill Elevators 65,775; Fort William and Port Arthur 5,657,234 and Eastern Elevators 461,012 bushels. Decreases were noted in the Interior Public and Semi-Public Elevators of 145,861; Vancouver 309,929; Prince Rupert 1,738 and Churchill 169,799 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 3,991,282 bushels compared with 3,375,210 bushels for the previous week and 3,581,803 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 14,441,990 bushels of wheat in rail transit at September 4, 1936, included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 28 amounted to 15,613,883 bushels, an increase of 4,826,071 bushels over the previous week when 10,787,812 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 4,802,509 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending August 28 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 4,547,566 (858,672); Saskatchewan 9,215,023 (2,446,366); Alberta 1,851,294 (1,497,471) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the four weeks from August 1 to 28, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows; figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 9,176,926 (1,563,481); Saskatchewan 20,062,590 (4,264,038); Alberta 5,063,893 (4,354,332) bushels. For the four weeks ending August 28, 1936 and August 30, 1935, 34,303,409 and 10,181,851 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES


During the week ending September 4, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat emounted to 3,449,320 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,251,000 bushels. The total is 4,700,320 bushels as compared with 4,826,829 bushels for the previous week,a decrease of 126,509 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 2,940,513 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending September 5, 1936, amounted to 9,341,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,787,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,240,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America showed a decrease of 374,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while Argentine and Australian shipments showed increases of 187,000 and 163,000 bushels respectively.

During the first five weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 49.3 million bushels as compared with 40.1 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 26.7 million bushels this year as compared with 13 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to only 4 million bushels as compared with 13 million bushels for the same period last year.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first five weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36 and 1934-35.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 9.8 million bushels per week during the first five weeks of the present crop year as compared with 8.0 and 11.5 million bushels per week during the corresponding periods in 1935-36 and 1934-35. North American shipments have a veraged 5.3 million bushels per week compared with 2.6 and 4.4 million bushels during the first five weeks of 1935-36 and 1934-35. Argentine shipments averaged only 0.8 million bushels per week compared with 2.6 million bushels per week during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 4, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Sept. 4, 1936 show a net increase of 14,517,200 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:— wheat 147,347,367, cats 10,982,428, barley 12,240,705, flaxseed 295,500 and rye 3,010,738 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 12,177,258, cats 814,506, barley 1,934,597, and flaxseed 4,726 bushels while rye decreased 413,887 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 198,121,468, cats 6,372,273, barley 4,858,910, flaxseed 206,482 and rye 3,477,635 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Grain in store shows a net increase of 4,818,985 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 3,891,713, oats 437,128, barley 528,925 and flaxseed 50,515 bushels while rye decreased 59,296 bushels.



VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 267,370 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 309,929 and barley 5,540 bushels while oats and flaxseed increased 46,075 and 24 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR- Wheat stocks .show a decrease of 1,738 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR- Wheat stocks decreased 169,799 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR) - Grain in store shows an increase of 7,255,796 bushels, composed of wheat 5,657,234, oats 204,098, barley 1,303,591, flax-seed 4,098 and rye 86,775 bushels.
