WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 23, 1937 decreased 2,781,516 bushels compared with the previous week and 89,480,865 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 35,196,133 bushels compared with 37,977,649 bushels for the previous week and 124,676,998 bushels for the week ending July 24, 1936.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,753,845 bushels, a decrease of 81,769 bushels from the previous week when 4,835,614 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 510,845; Buffalo 806,000; Canal 27,000; New York 2,421,000 and Albany 939,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the stocks at the following ports: Duluth 23,769; Buffalo 59,000 and Albany 16,000 bushels, while stocks at New York increased 17,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,898,544 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,376,072; Buffalo 8,179,000; Erie 1,888,000; New York 1,045,472; Albany 4,290,000 and Chicago 120,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending July 23, 1937 amounted to 30,442,288 bushels compared with 33,142,035 bushels for the previous week and 106,778,454 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 3,595,000; Interior Terminals 4,270,695; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,430,264; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 7,433,011; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 3,642,737 and 3,652,147 bushels respectively.

The decreases were as follows: Western Country Elevators 443,000; Interior Private and Mill Public & Semi-Public Elevators 91,845; Vancouver-New Westminster 91,421; Eastern Elevators, Seaboard Ports 1,311,730 bushels, while increases are noted at the Head of the Lakes and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports of 258,826 and 137,411 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,686,533 bushels compared with 4,879,597 bushels at a comparable date last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 1,206,338 bushels against 942,813 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces, for the week ending July 16, 1937, amounted to 864,740 bushels, a decrease of 114,251 bushels from the previous week when 978,991 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 849,032 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending July 16, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 137,023 (49,029); Saskatchewan 380,051 (465,235); Alberta 347,666 (334,768) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifty weeks from August 1, 1936 to July 16, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 20,584,117 (17,269,129); Saskatchewan 90,430,670 (116,975,565); Alberta 53,264,295 (80,644,493) bushels. For the fifty weeks ending July 16, 1937 and July 17, 1936 164,279,082 and 214,889,187 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending July 23, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,970,485 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 290,000 bushels. The total is 2,260,485 bushels as compared with 2,204,031 bushels, an increase of 56,454 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 2,094,126 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending July 24, 1937 amounted to 6,142,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,453,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,704,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia show increases of 870,000 and 37,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week, while Argentine shipments show a decrease of 474,000 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 23, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 23, 1937 show a net decrease of 3,087,691 bushels, compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 35,196,133, oats 3,090,652, barley 3,662,270, flaxseed 465,496 and rye 288,925 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,781,516, oats 171,958, barley 87,835 and flaxseed 50,454 bushels while rye increased 4,072 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows: wheat 124,676,998, oats 8,292,946, barley 5,914,060, flaxseed 311,690 and rye 3,645,697 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a decrease of 557,000 bushels, composed of wheat 443,000, oats 78,000, barley 15,000, flaxseed 6,000 and rye 15,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 6,395 bushels. Decreases were noted in oats of 5,996 and barley 3,554 bushels, while wheat increased 3,155 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 109,170 bushels, composed of wheat 91,421, oats 15,307, barley 2,139, flaxseed 123, and rye 180 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net increase of 387,823 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 258,826, oats 159,105, flaxseed 20,122 and rye 32,328 bushels, while barley decreased 82,558 bushels.
