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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 30, 1937 decreased 1,910,852 bushels compared with the previous week and 87,485,638 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 33,285,281 bushels compared with 35,196,133 bushels for the previous week and 120,770,919 bushels for the week ending July 31, 1936.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,111,290 bushels, a decrease of 642,555 bushels from the previous week when 4,753,845 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 474,290; Buffalo 660,000; New York 2,060,000 and Albany 917,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the stocks at the following ports: Duluth 36,555; Buffalo 146,000; Albany 72,000; New York 361,000 and Canal Afloat 27,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,277,230 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 3,903,175; Buffalo 8,174,000; Erie 1,888,000; New York 922,055; Albany 4,290,000 and Chicago 100,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending July 30, 1937 amounted to 29,173,991 bushels compared with 30,442,288 bushels for the previous week and 101,493,689 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 3,650,000; Interior Terminals 4,101,544; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,332,003; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 7,252,509; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 3,087,738 and 3,317,641 bushels respectively.

The decreases were as follows: Interior Private and Mill Public and Semi-Public Elevators 169,151; Vancouver-New Westminster 98,261; Head of the Lakes 180,502; Eastern Elevators, Lake Ports 554,999 and Seaboard Ports 334,506 bushels, while Western Country Elevators increased 55,000 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,364,211 bushels compared with 2,456,566 bushels at a comparable date last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 1,542,782 bushels against 2,842,251 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces, for the week ending July 23, 1937, amounted to 704,700 bushels, a decrease of 160,040 bushels from the previous week when 864,740 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 483,167 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending July 23, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 62,356 (26,096); Saskatchewan 367,594 (277,609); Alberta 274,750 (179,462) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifty-one weeks from August 1, 1936 to July 23, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 20,646,473 (17,295,225); Saskatchewan 90,798,264 (117,253,174); Alberta 53,539,045 (80,823,955) bushels. For the fifty-one weeks ending July 23, 1937 and July 24, 1936, 164,983,782 and 215,372,354 bushels were received from the farms.



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OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending July 30, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,701,898 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 284,000 bushels. The total is 1,985,898 bushels as compared with 2,260,485 bushels, a decrease of 274,587 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 4,205,277 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending July 31, 1937 amounted to 6,545,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 6,142,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,904,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America show a decrease of 653,000 bushels as compared with the previous week, while Argentine and Australian shipments show increases of 697,000 and 191,000 bushels respectively.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 30, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 30, 1937 show a decrease of 2,566,381 bushels compared with the previous week. Stocks of grain were as follows:- wheat 33,285,281, oats 2,890,351, barley 3,284,802, flaxseed 459,792 and rye 216,869 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,910,852, oats 200,301, barley 377,468, flaxseed 5,704 and rye 72,056 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 120,770,919, oats 8,701,697, barley 5,989,857, flaxseed 304,203 and rye 3,261,957 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 79,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in oats of 67,000, barley 41,000, flaxseed 9,000 and rye 17,000 bushels while wheat increased 55,000 bushels.

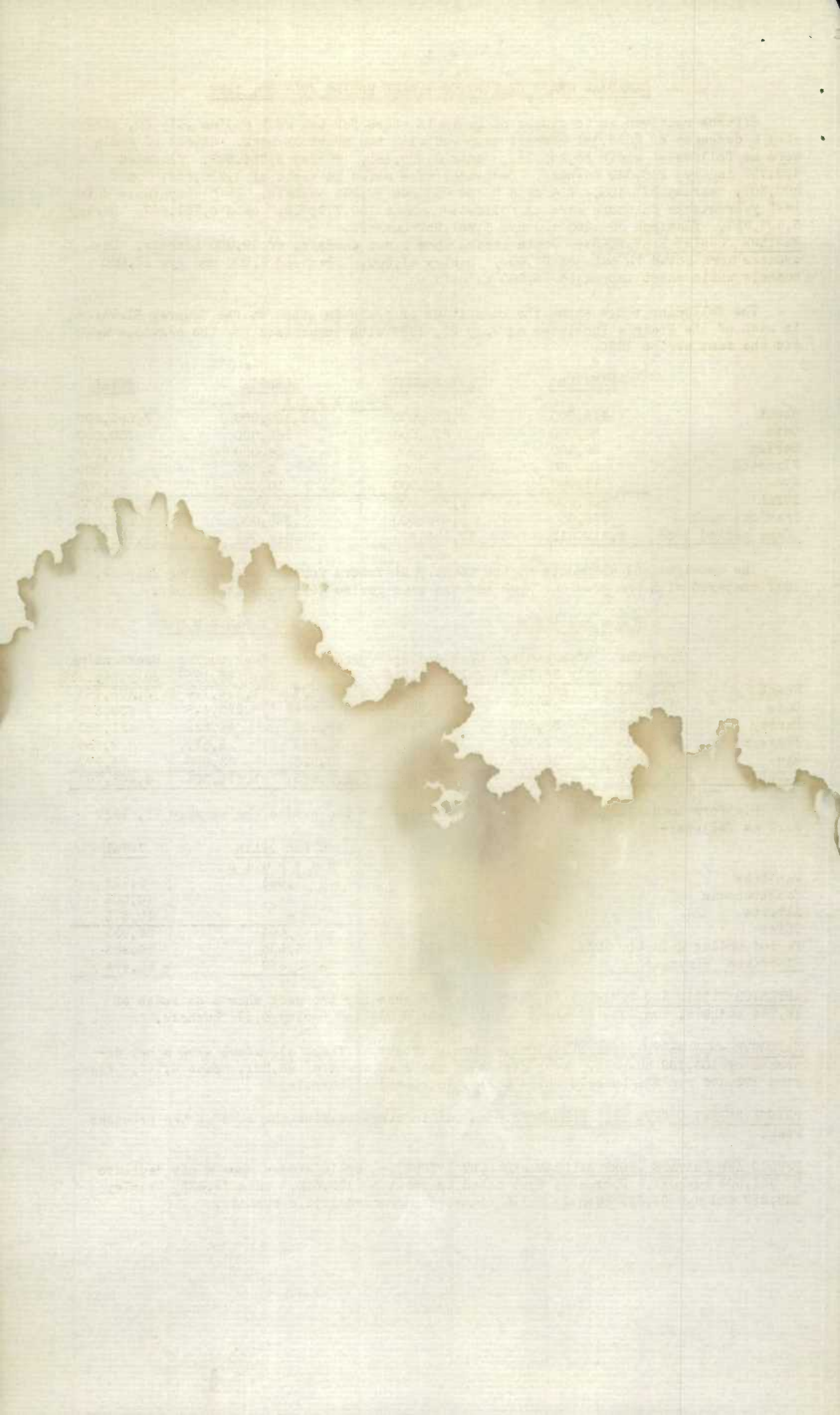

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 12,784 bushels, composed of wheat 2,151, oats 6,037 and barley 4,596 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 103,189 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 98,261, oats 4,249, flaxseed 102 and rye 634 bushels while barley increased 57 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains the same as the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 361,508 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 180,502, oats 25,322, barley 108,289 and rye 61,613 bushels while flaxseed increased 14,218 bushels.

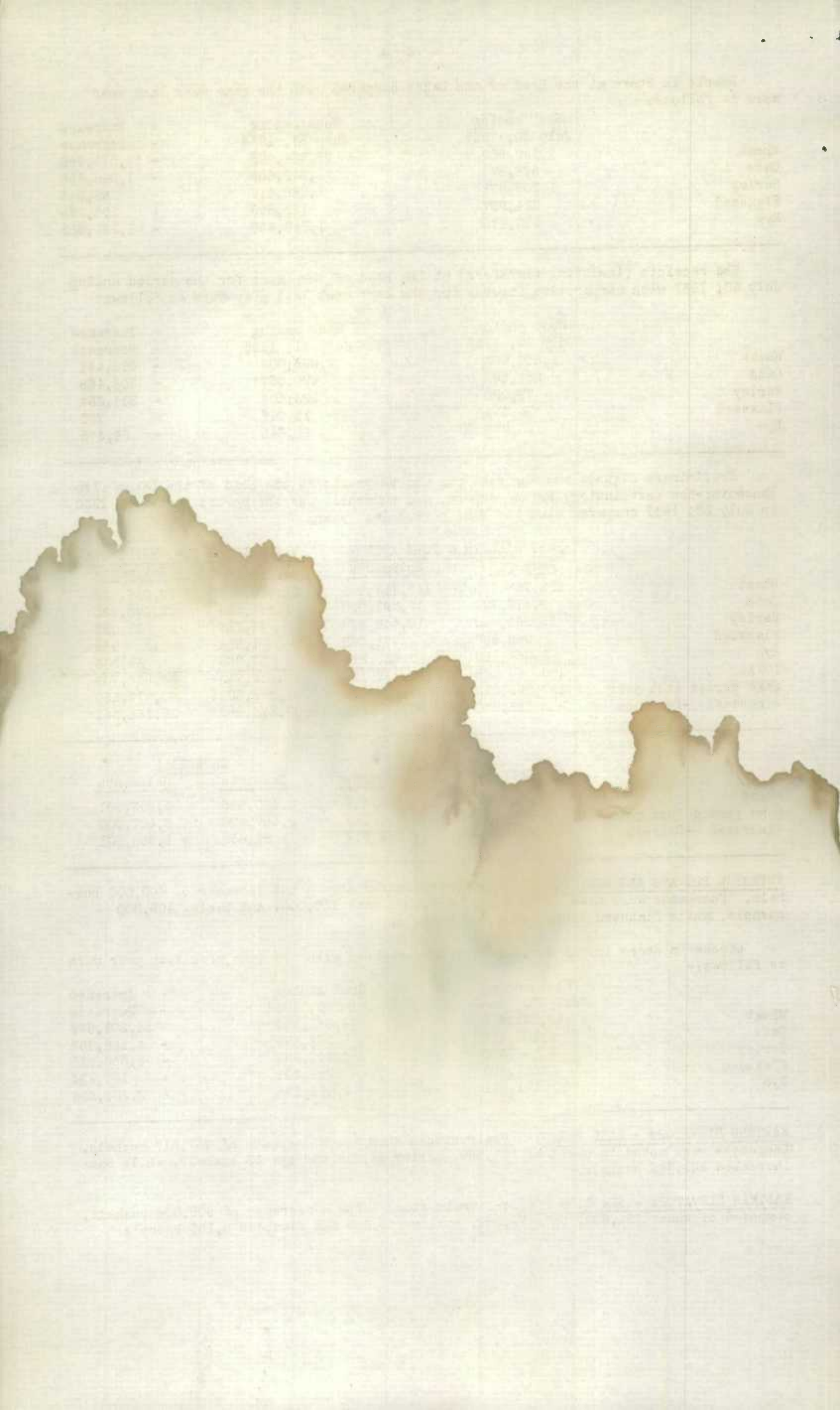
