WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 11 shows an increase of 6,301,728 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 52,363,196 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply including 11,862,011 bushels in rail transit was reported as 154,040,985 bushels compared with the revised figure of 147,739,257 bushels for the previous week and 206,904,181 bushels for the week ending September 13, 1935. The last two amounts do not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,370,740 bushels, a net increase of 351,663 bushels over those of the previous week when 19,019,085 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth, 6,097,766; Erie 1,604,000; Buffalo, 7,111,000; Chicago, 106,000; New York, 1,827,982 and Albany, 2,624,000 bushels. The stocks at Duluth increased 371,254; Buffalo, 185,000 and New York, 119,409 bushels, while decreases are noted at Albany of 250,000; Erie 68,000 and Chicago 6,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,310,777 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo, 14,541,159; Erie, 27,000; New York, 513,949; Albany, 1,399,000; New Orleans, 4,000; Duluth, 1,188,669 and Galveston, 132,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending September 11, amounted to 134,670,237 bushels compared with 128,720,166 bushels a week ago and 139,093,404 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 49,000,000; Interior elevators, Western division 5,722,915; Pacific coast elevators 7,001,056; Churchill 1,699,045; Head of the Lakes 32,091,058 and Eastern elevators lake and seaboard ports 11,907,254 and 10,576,813 bushels respectively while 16,671,291 bushels were in transit on the lakes and by rail.

A net increase is shown in the wheat stocks in Canada of 6,642,948 bushels. The increases are as follows: Western Country Elevators 3,192,550 and Fort William and Port Arthur 4,767,367 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard ports 362,412 bushels. Decreases were noted in the Interior Elevators of 120,887, Vancouver 130,755; Churchill 530,775, and Eastern Elevator Lake ports 596,964 bushels.

Wheat in Transit on the lakes amounted to 4,309,280 bushels compared with 3,991,282 bushels for the previous week and 3,360,908 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 11,862,011 bushels of wheat in rail transit at September 11, 1936, included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 4 amounted to 19,703,094 bushels, an increase of 4,179,211 bushels over the previous week when 15,613,883 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 14,171,639 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending September 4 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 3,256,126 (2,090,352); Saskatchewan 12,564,112 (8,602,159); Alberta 3,972,856 (3,391,128) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the five weeks from August 1 to September 4, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 12,433,052 (3,661,833); Saskatchewan 32,626,702 (12,946,197); Alberta 9,036,749 (7,745,460) bushels. For the five weeks ending September 4, 1936 and September 7, 1935 54,096,503 and 24,353,490 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending September 11, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,013,329 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,479,000 bushels. The total is 5,492,329 bushels as compared with 4,700,320 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 792,009 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 2,437,336 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 11, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 11, 1936 show an increase of 9,122,226 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 154,040,985; oats 12,815,715; barley 13,873,698; flaxseed 427,009 and rye 3,229,497 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 6,301,734; oats 1,291,631; barley 1,238,390; flaxseed 108,281 and rye 182,190 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 206,904,181; oats 7,511,205; barley 5,906,254; flaxseed 220,078 and rye 3,656,281 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show an increase of 4,336,059 bushels composed of wheat 3,192,550; oats 724,089; barley 303,084; flaxseed 107,525 and rye 8,811 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 28,591 bushels. Wheat decreased 36,453 bushels while oats and barley increased 7,385 and 477 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 90,072 bushels. Wheat decreased 130,755 bushels while increases were noted in oats of 36,288 and barley 4,395 bushels respectively.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show a decrease of 530,775 bushels.
