#### WHEAT SUOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 18, shows an increase of 6,033,172 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 61,800,590 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply including 12,835,107 bushels in rail transit was reported as 160,139,528, bushels compared with the revised figure of 154,106,356 bushels for the previous week and 221,940,118 bushels for the week ending September 20, 1935. The last two amounts do not include rail in transit wheat.

#### CAMADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,290,832 bushels, a net decrease of 79,916 bushels from those of the previous week when 19,370,748 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports. Duluth, 6,030,433; Brie 1,604,000; Buffalo 5,576,000; Chicago 105,000; New York 1,618,399 and Albany 2,357,000 bushels. The stocks at all the ports decreased except Buffalo which increased 465,000 bushels over the previous week. The decreases were as follows: Duluth 67,333; Chicago 1,000; New York 209,583 and Albany 267,000 bushels. Stocks at Eric remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,802,912 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 14,307,734; Erie 27,000; New York 664,059; Albany 3,630,000; New Orleans 1,000; Duluth 1,053,119 and Galveston 120,000 - bushels.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week anding September 18, amounted to 140,848,696 bushels compared with 1.34,735,608 bushels a weak ago and 202,137,206 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.


Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 50,000,000; Interior elevators, Western Division 5,834,746; Pacific Coast elevators 7,000,060; Churchill 1,464,780; Head of the Lakes 34,218,542 and Fastern elevators Lake and Seaboard ports 11,931,103 and 11,720,274 bushels respectively, while 18,679,191 bushels were in transit on lakes and by rail.

A net increase is shown in the wheat stocks in Canada of 4,104,218 bushels. The increases are as follows: Western country elevators 990,702; Interior elevators 54,758; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,127,484; Eastern elevators 1,167,335 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 5,844,084 bushels compared with 4,809,280 bushels for the previous week and 5,566,998 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 12,835,107 bushels of wheat in rail transit at September 18,1936, included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

#### PRIMARY MOVIMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 11 amounted to 15,070,766 bushels, a decrease of 4,722,328 bushels from the previous week when 19,793,094 oushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 17,740,865 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending September 11 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 744,905 (1.756,312); Saskatchewan 10,012,246 (12,056,920); Alberta 4,313,615 (3,927,633) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the threePrairie Provinces for the six weeks from August 1 to September 11, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 13,177,957 (5,418,145); Saskatchewan 42,638,948 (25,003,117); Alberta 13,350,361 (11,673,093) bushels. For the six weeks ending September 11, 1936 and September 13, 1935, 69,167,269 and 42,094,355 bushels were received from the farms.



### OVERSEAS EXFORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES


During the week ending September 18, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amcunted to 3,298,102 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,006,000 bushels. The total is 4,304,102 bushels as compared with 5,492,329 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,188,218 bushels els and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 621,173 bushels.

The following table shows the world shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first seven weeks of the present crop year. (Broomhall's figures).

World shipments for the week ending September 19, 1936, amounted to 12,327,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 11,992,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,072,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia showed increases of 24,000 and 873,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while Argentine shipments showed a decrease of 299,000 bushels.

During the first seven weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 73.4 million bushels as compared with 59.8 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 38.2 million bushels this year as compared with only 20 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to only 6 million bushels as compared with 19 million bushels for the same period last year.


#### Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first seven weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36 and 1934-35.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 10.5 million bushels per week during the first seven weeks of the present crop year as compared with 8.5 and 11.1 million bushels per week during the corresponding periods in 1935-36 and 1934-35. North American shipments have averaged 5.4 million bushels per week compared with 2.8 and 4.4 million bushels during the first seven weeks of 1935-36 and 1934-35. Argentine shipments averaged only 0.9 million bushels per week compared with 2.7 million bushels per week during the same period last year and 4.2 million bushels during the same weeks in 1934-35.

#### CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEFTEMBER 18, 1936

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Sept. 18, 1936 show a net increase of 8,010,880 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 160,139,528, cats 14,142,183, barley 14,210,702, flaxseed 608,912 and rye 3,156,198 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 6,033,172, cats 1,391,107, barley 443,902, and flaxseed 170,312 bushels, while rye decreased 27,613 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 221,940,118, cats 8,555,301, barley 6,746,485; flaxseed 251,201 and rye 3,758,884 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net increase of 1,633,460 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 990,702, oats 518,140, barley 77,418 and flaxseed 87,509 bushels, while rye decreased 40,309 bushels.


INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show a net increase of 23,388 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 11,831 and oats 11,599 bushels while barley decreased 42 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 9,964 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 4,506, barley 6,153 and rye 301 bushels while wheat decreased 996 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR .- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR .- Wheat in store shows a decrease of 235,065 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR.) - Grain stocks show a net increase of 2,326,483 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 2,127,484, oats 144,663, and barley 102,900 bushels while flaxseed and rye decreased 2,439 and 46,125 bushels.
