WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 2, shows an increase of only 876,387 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 83,398,298 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply including 10,354,693 bushels in rail transit was reported as 162,710,340 bushels compared with the revised figure of 161,833,953 bushels for the previous week and 246,108,638 bushels for the week ending October 4, 1935. This last amount does not include rail in transit wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,009,952 bushels, a net increase of 2,494 bushels over the previous week, when 19,007,458 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 6,243,212; Erie 1,437,000; Buffalo 7,729,000; Chicago 82,000; New York 1,360,740 and Albany 2,158,000 bushels. The increases were as follows: Duluth 80,009; Buffalo 49,000 and New York 53,485 bushels, while decreases were noted at Erie of 167,000 bushels and Chicago 13,000 bushels. Stocks at Albany remained unchanged. For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 21,560,625 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 956,241; Buffalo 16,135,000; Erie 27,000; New York 298,384; Albany 4,077,000 and Galveston 67,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending October 2, amounted to 143,700,388 bushels compared with 142,826,495 bushels a week ago and 214,548,013 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Wheat stocks in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 47,500,000; Interior elevators, Western Division 6,706,730; Pacific Coast elevators 8,118,708; Churchill 610,450; Head of the Lakes 37,466,237 and Eastern elevators Lake and Seaboard ports 14,154,558 and 13,206,651 bushels respectively, while 15,937,053 bushels were in transit on lakes and by rail.

A net increase is shown in the wheat stocks in Canada of 1,697,285 bushels, when compared with the previous week. The increases were as follows: Eastern Elevators, Seaboard ports 1,796,361 bushels; Fort William and Port Arthur 1,050,302; Vancouver & New Westminster 922,820 and Interior Private and Mill Elevators 49,299 bushels, while decreases were noted at Country Elevators of 1,386,994 bushels, Interior Public & Semi-Public elevators 2,295 bushels, Churchill 595,728 bushels and Eastern Elevators, Lake ports 136,490 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes amounted to 5,582,360 bushels compared with 4,412,793 bushels for the previous week and 5,575,785 bushels for the same week in 1935. There were also 10,354,693 bushels of wheat in rail transit at October 2, 1936, included in the visible but no comparable figures for 1935 were secured.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 25 amounted to 9,168,632 bushels, a decrease of 6,374,154 bushels from the previous week when 15,542,786 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 18,048,483 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending September 25 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 571,733 (1,459,438); Saskatchewan 4,871,867 (11,609,883); Alberta 3,725,032 (4,979,162) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces for the eight weeks from August 1 to September 25, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 15,568,147 (7,981,888); Saskatchewan 56,962,981 (48,734,333); Alberta 21,347,559 (22,229,889) bushels. For the eight weeks ending September 25, 1936 and September 27, 1935, 93,878,687 and 78,946,110 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending October 2, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,039,240 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,552,000 bushels. The total is 5,591,240 bushels as compared with 5,094,252 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 496,988 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 1,230,389 bushels.

X For these weeks, the figures are unrevised, North American shipments being too low and "other" countries too high.

World shipments for the week ending October 3, 1936, amounted to 11,479,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,171,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,056,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Argentina showed increases of 934,000 and 357,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while Australian shipments showed a decrease of 804,000 bushels.

During the first nine weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 95 million bushels as compared with 80 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 48.1 million bushels this year as compared with only 27.2 million bushels in 1935-36. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to only 8 million bushels as compared with 23 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first nine weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1935-36 and 1934-35.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 10.5 million bushels per week during the first nine weeks of the present crop year as compared with 8.9 and 11.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding periods in 1935-36 and 1934-35. North American shipments have averaged 5.3 million bushels per week compared with 3.0 and 4.3 million bushels per week during the first nine weeks of 1935-36 and 1934-35. Argentine shipments averaged only .9 million bushels per week compared with 2.6 million bushels per week during the same period last year and 4.2 million bushels during the same weeks in 1934-35.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 2, 1936

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Oct. 2, 1936 show a net increase of 1,799,477 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 162,710,340, oats 15,868,645, barley 15,553,391, flaxseed 971,949 and rye 3,040,874 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 876,387, oats 612,643, barley 433,945, and flaxseed 84,962 bushels while rye decreased 208,460 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 246,108,638, oats 11,407,085, barley 8,718,577, flaxseed 396,489 and rye 3,912,601 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,273,966 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,386,994, barley 18,331 and rye 35,932 bushels while oats and flaxseed increased 150,448 and 16,843 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 1,903 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,285 and oats 709 bushels while barley increased 1,091 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 922,820, oats 18,686, and barley 6,576 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show a decrease of 595,728 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net increase of 841,064 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 1,050,302, oats 84,668 and flaxseed 77,624 bushels, while barley and rye decreased 231,938 and 139,592 bushels respectively.
