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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 5, 1937 decreased 3,262,969 bushels compared with the previous week and 79,775,874 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 30,022,312 bushels compared with 33,285,281 bushels for the previous week and 113,061,155 bushels for the week ending August 7, 1936. The latter figure does not include Rail In Transit.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,425,420 bushels, a decrease of 685,870 bushels from the previous week when 4,111,290 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 147,720; Buffalo 562,000; New York 1,799,000 and Albany 916,700 bushels. Decreases are shown in the stocks at the following ports: Duluth 326,570; Buffalo 98,000; Albany 300 and New York 261,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 18,412,316 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 4,050,875; Buffalo 7,766,000; Erie 1,888,000; New York 1,736,441; Albany 2,874,000 and Chicago 97,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending August 5, 1937 amounted to 26,596,892 bushels compared with 29,173,991 bushels for the previous week and 94,648,839 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 3,470,000; Interior Terminals 4,814,211; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,378,160; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 614,569; Head of the Lakes 5,877,766; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 3,882,868 and 2,657,196 bushels respectively.

Decreases from the previous week are shown at the following elevators: Country Elevators 180,000; Interior Private & Mill Elevators 300,000; Head of the Lakes 1,374,743; and Eastern Elevators Seaboard ports 660,445, while increases were noted at the Interior Public & Semi-Public of 12,667; Vancouver-New Westminster 46,157 and Eastern Elevators, Lake Ports 795,130 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 401,675 bushels for the week ending August 5, 1937. No figure is available at a comparable date last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 1,589,453 bushels against 4,017,184 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces, for the week ending July 30, 1937, amounted to 578,820 bushels, a decrease of 125,880 bushels from the previous week when 704,700 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 901,019 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending July 30, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 65,067 (98,064); Saskatchewan 324,324 (403,644); Alberta 189,429 (399,311) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifty-two weeks from August 1, 1936 to July 30, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 20,711,540 (17,393,289); Saskatchewan 91,122,588 (117,656,818); Alberta 53,728,474 (81,223,266) bushels. For the fifty-two weeks ending July 30, 1937 and July 31, 1936, 165,562,602 and 216,273,373 bushels were received from the farms.

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OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending August 5, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,476,892 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 202,000 bushels. The total is 1,678,892 bushels as compared with 1,985,898 bushels, a decrease of 307,006 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 3,412,800 bushels.

North American shipments showed a decrease of 270,000 bushels while Australian shipments showed an increase of 452,000 bushels as compared with the previous week.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 6, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 6, 1937 show a decrease of 3,756,004 bushels, compared with the previous week. Stocks of grain were as follows: wheat 30,022,312, oats 2,699,781, barley 2,874,178, flaxseed 430,733 and rye 353,964 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,262,969, oats 190,492, barley 410,579 and flaxseed 29,059 bushels, while rye increased 137,095 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 113,061,155, oats 8,217,392, barley 5,433,690, flaxseed 249,282, and rye 3,312,083 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:

Grain stocks show a net decrease of 185,000 bushels. Wheat and oats decreased 180,000 and 75,000 bushels respectively, while increases were noted in barley of 36,000 and flaxseed 2,000 and rye 32,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 16,088 bushels. Oats and barley decreased 26,755 and 2,000 bushels respectively while wheat increased 12,667 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 33,977 bushels. Wheat increased 46,157 bushels while decreases were noted in oats of 10,401, barley 1,159 and rye 620 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks decreased 2,233,962 bushels made up as follows: wheat 1,374,743, oats 175,900, barley 593,270, flaxseed 65,206 and rye 24,843 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MILL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 362,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 300,000, oats 42,000, barley 19,000 and rye 2,000 bushels, while flaxseed increased 1,000 bushels.

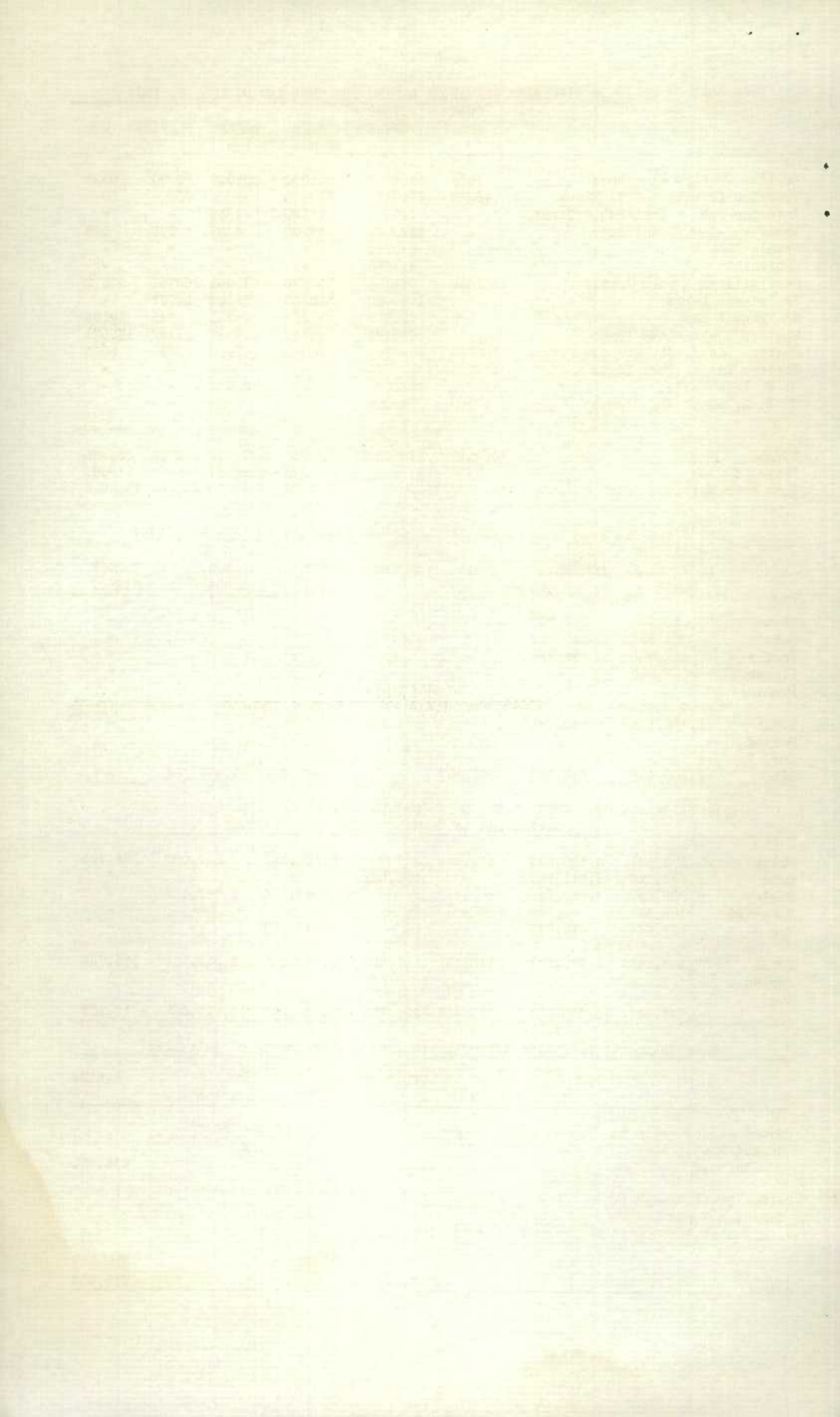
